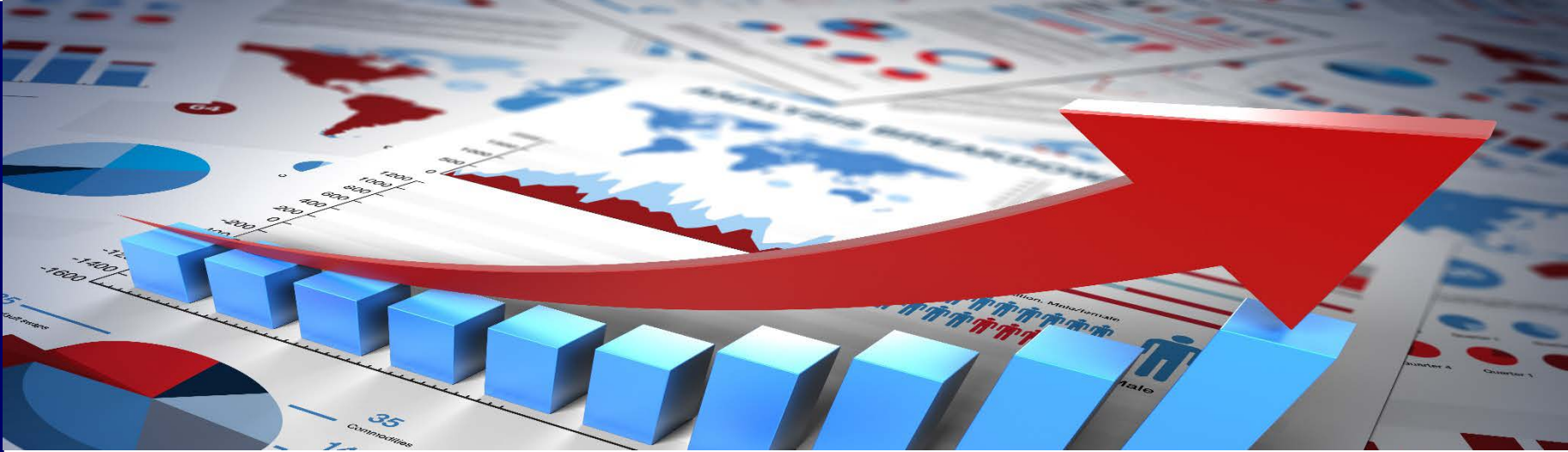




*Municipal Social Services
Ontario Perceptions on Nanos Research Survey*



Executive Summary

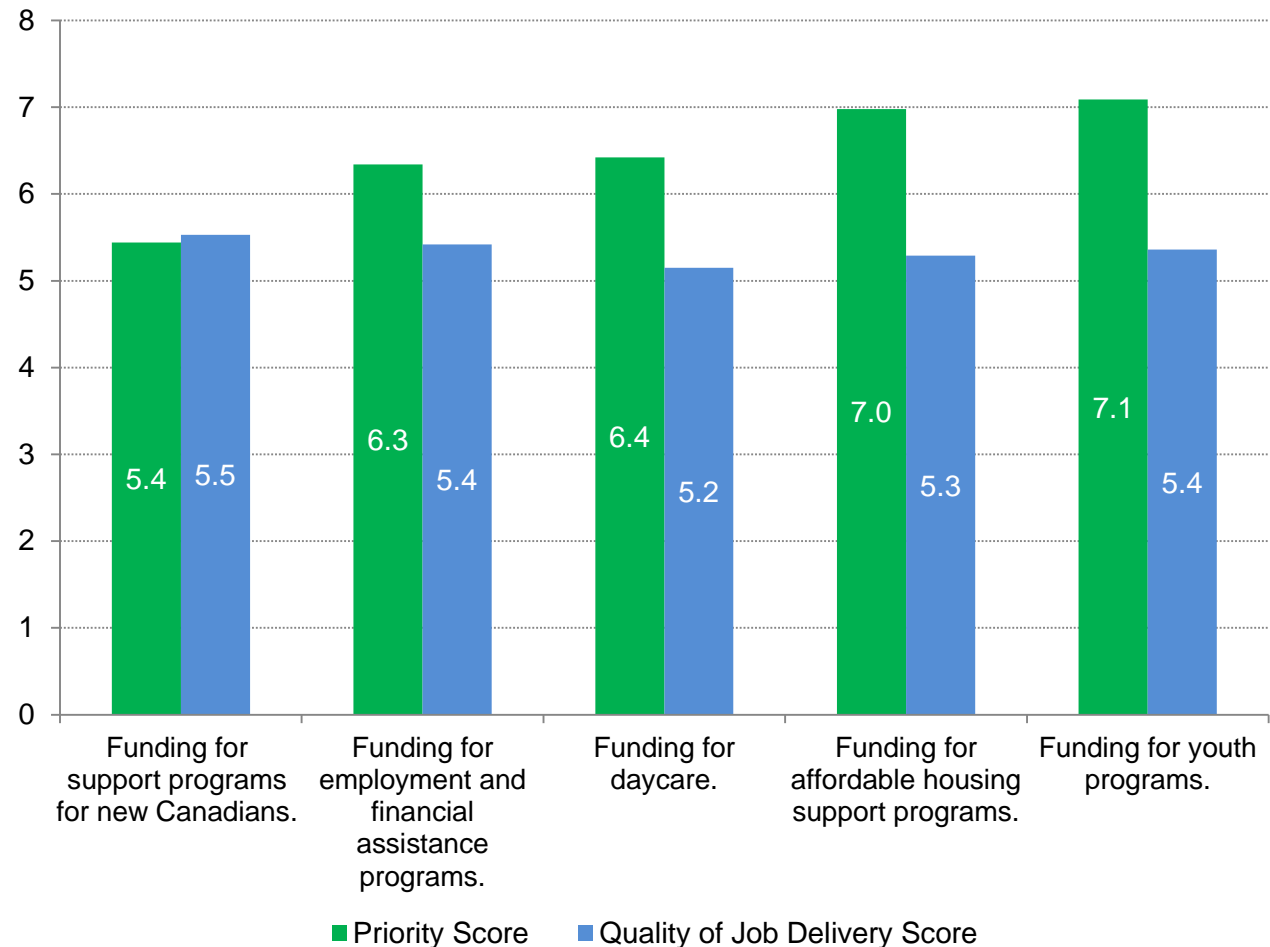
A new survey by Nanos Research examined the views Ontarians have of municipal social services. This included exploring perceptions on service delivery and funding priorities.

Ontarians were more likely to believe that programs for youth and affordable housing should be funding priorities compared to services for new Canadians. Scores related to perceptions of the quality of service delivery for all areas was marginally above a score of 5 on a 10 point scale, where 1 was a very poor job and 10 was a very good job.

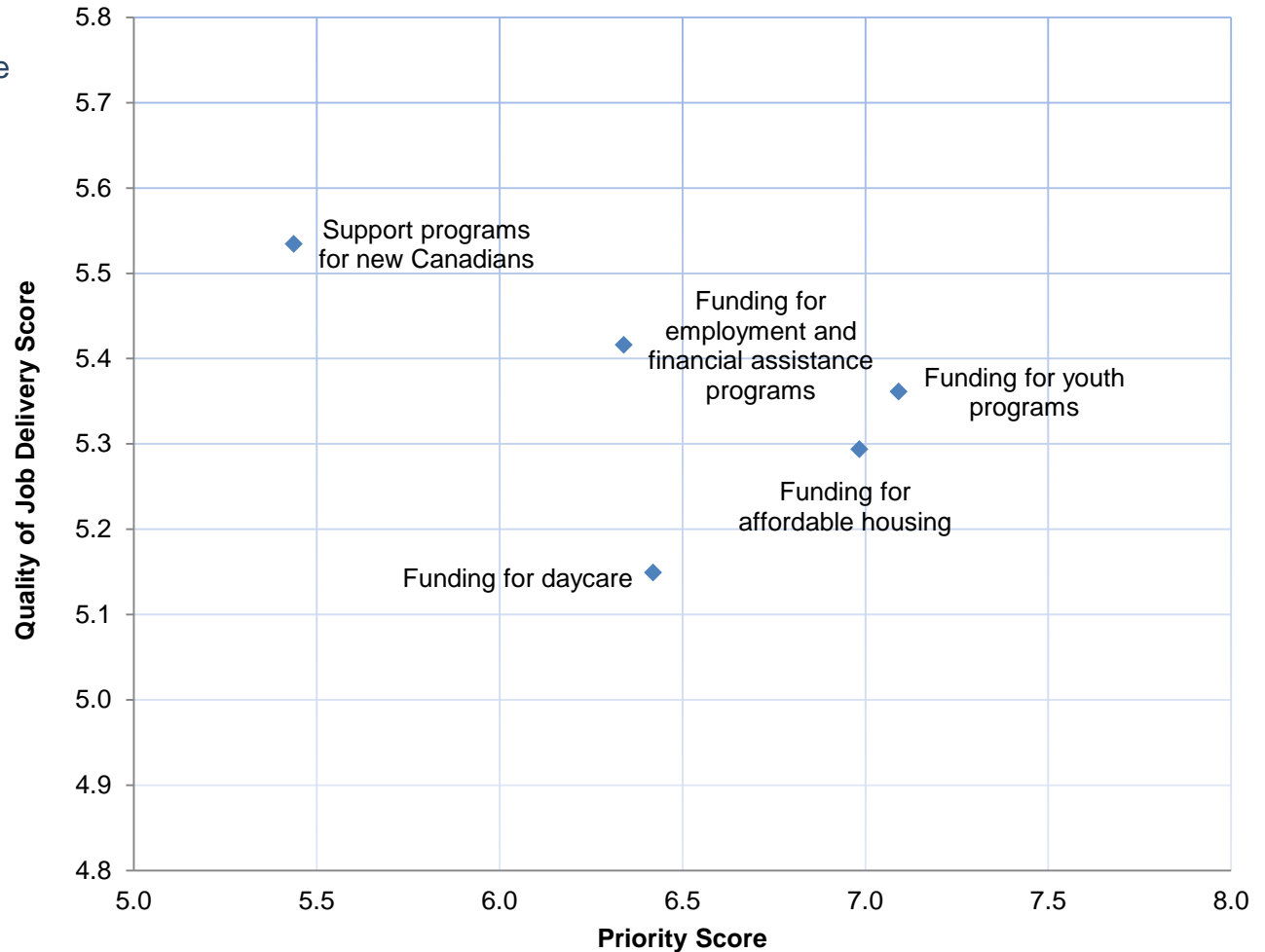

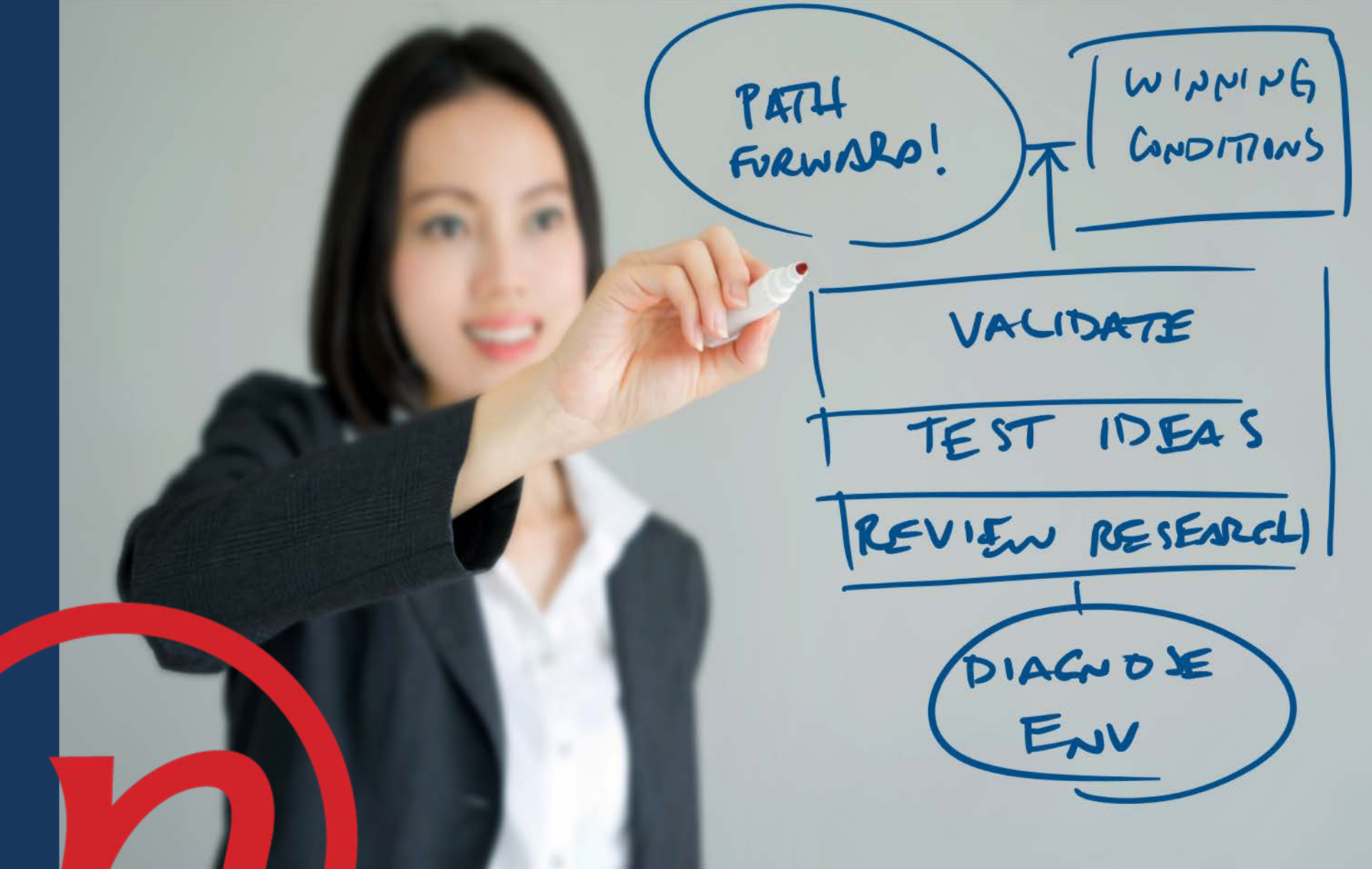
Funding Priority & Service Delivery Map

Methodology

Methodology

The Ontario Omnibus is conducted by the Nanos Research Corporation, which is headquartered in Canada and operates in Canada and the United States. The data is based on random telephone interviews with 500 Ontarians 18 years of age and over conducted between September 24th and 29th, 2013. The sample included both land- and cell-lines. The results were statistically checked and weighted using the latest Census data.

A random telephone survey of 500 Ontarians is accurate ± 4.4 percentage points, 19 times out of 20.
