

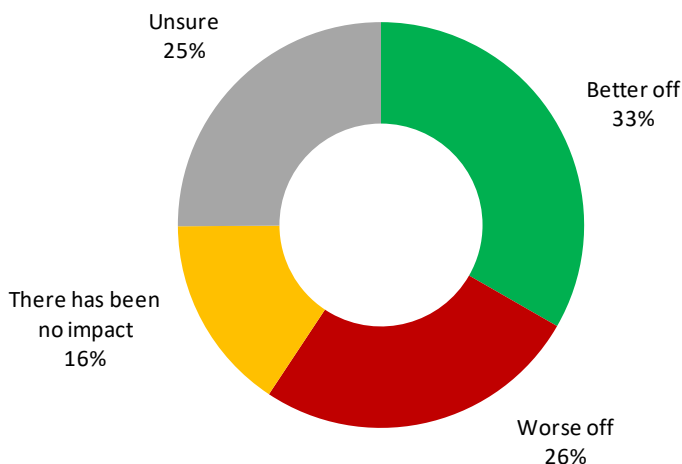
## One in three think economy is better off with Canada-US Free Trade Agreement

### METHODOLOGY

To follow is a review of the latest Nanos national representative online survey of 1,000 Canadians 18 years of age and older. It was completed between September 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup>, 2012 and reflects the views of the Canadian populace.
