

Ontarians have concerns about the concept of privatization

Provincial Survey Summary

submitted by Nanos to the Ontario Public Service Employees Union, November 2017
(Submission 2017-1089)



Summary

Ontarians say they are familiar with privatization, however many Ontarians have not heard of the *We Own It* campaign. A majority somewhat oppose or strongly oppose privatization of public services in the province. Most Ontarians somewhat agree or strongly agree that public services are more accountable and safer than private services, while they somewhat disagree or strongly disagree that privatized services are less expensive and that privatized public services serve the public better. Most also think that public services in small communities help the local economy. A significant majority of Ontarians also say they would give higher priority to the public's right to know the details of a privatization contract, over a company's right to protect commercially sensitive information.



Awareness of and support for privatization

- **The majority of Ontarians are familiar with privatization** – Asked how familiar they are with the term privatization, more than four in five Ontarians said very familiar (30%) or somewhat familiar (54%), while under a fifth said not very familiar (15%) or not at all familiar (one per cent). Over nine in ten Ontarians say they are very familiar (61%) or somewhat familiar (34%) with privatization, while five per cent said they are not very familiar, when provided a definition of the term.
- **More than half of Ontarians think that privatization in Ontario is used occasionally** – A majority of Ontarians think that privation is used occasionally (55%) in Ontario. Over a third (35%) say that it is used often and seven per cent think that it is widespread, while three percent said they were unsure.
- **Most frequently participants think of hydro when asked to name a service or asset that has been privatized in Ontario** – The top three mentions were Hydro One/Ontario Hydro (36%), hydro in general (26%) and Highway 407/ETR (13%).
- **Two thirds of Ontarians strongly oppose or somewhat oppose privatization** – Almost two thirds of Ontarians strongly oppose (34%) or somewhat oppose (31%) privatization of public services in Ontario, while under a third somewhat support (26%) or strongly support (five per cent) this. Four per cent are unsure.

Summary - continued



Opinions of privatization compared to public services

- **More than two thirds of Ontarians strongly agree or somewhat agree that privatized health care helps the wealthy but not the middle or working class** – Over two thirds of Ontarians strongly agree (41%) or somewhat agree (29%) that privatized health care services help the wealthy but not the middle or working class, while about a quarter somewhat disagree (16%) or strongly disagree (10%) with this statement. Three per cent are unsure.
- **Most Ontarians strongly agree or somewhat agree that public services are more accountable than privately-owned services** – Almost two thirds of Ontarians strongly agree (30%) or somewhat agree (34%) that public services are more accountable than privately-owned services, while a third somewhat disagree (19%) or strongly disagree (15%). Three per cent are unsure.
- **Over half of Ontarians strongly agree or somewhat agree that public services are safer than privately-owned services** – More than half of Ontarians strongly agree (22%) or somewhat agree (38%) that public services are safer than privately-owned services, while a third somewhat disagree (22%) or strongly disagree (11%). Nine per cent are unsure.
- **Nearly three quarters of Ontarians somewhat agree or strongly agree that communities in Ontario are fighting to keep public services public** – Nearly three quarters of Ontarians somewhat agree (51%) or strongly agree (21%) that communities in Ontario are fighting to keep public services public, while 11 per cent somewhat disagree and three per cent strongly disagree. Fourteen per cent are unsure.
- **Half of Ontarians somewhat disagree or strongly disagree that public services save money** – Half of Ontarians somewhat disagree (30%) or strongly disagree (20%) that public services save money over privately-owned services, while two fifths somewhat agree (26%) or strongly agree (13%). Eleven per cent are unsure.

Summary - continued



- **Just under half of Ontarians somewhat disagree or strongly disagree that public services are higher quality** – Just under half of Ontarians somewhat disagree (34%) or strongly disagree (15%) that public services are higher quality than privately-owned services, while 30 per cent somewhat agree and 12 per cent strongly agree. Nine per cent are unsure.
- **Over half of Ontarians somewhat disagree or strongly disagree that public services are not better at protecting vulnerable populations** – More than half of Ontarians somewhat disagree (30%) or strongly disagree (23%) that public services are no better at protecting vulnerable populations than privately-owned services, while 27 per cent somewhat agree and 12 per cent strongly agree. Eight per cent are unsure.
- **Nearly two thirds of Ontarians strongly disagree or somewhat disagree that privatized services are less expensive** – Almost two thirds of Ontarians strongly disagree (31%) or somewhat disagree (32%) that privatized services are less expensive, while 23 per cent somewhat agree and six per cent strongly agree. Eight per cent are unsure.
- **Under two thirds of Ontarians somewhat disagree or strongly disagree that privatized services serve the public better** – Under two thirds of Ontarians somewhat disagree (31%) or strongly disagree (30%) that privatized public services serve the public better, while under a third somewhat agree (25%) or strongly agree (6%). Eight per cent of Ontarians are unsure.
- **More than half of Ontarians are unsure whether communities in Ontario have successfully taken public services back from private companies** – Over half (53%) of Ontarians are unsure whether communities in Ontario have successfully taken public services back from private companies, while more than a third somewhat disagree (22%) or strongly disagree (13%). Ten per cent somewhat agree with this statement and one per cent strongly agree.

Summary - continued



Information about privatization and impressions of impact on economy

- **The vast majority of Ontarians are not aware of the *We Own It* campaign** – Seventy-nine per cent of Ontarians say that they have not heard of the *We Own It* campaign, which is a recent campaign to stop privatization in Ontario, while 14 per cent have heard of it. Seven per cent are unsure.
- **The majority of Ontarians think the public's right to know every detail in a privatization contract is higher priority** – Seventy-seven per cent of Ontarians think the public's right to know every detail in a privatization contract is higher priority compared to 13 per cent who think the higher priority should be given to a company's right to protect commercially sensitive information. Ten per cent are unsure.
- **A third of Ontarians think privatization is taking place in urban and rural communities equally** – A third (33%) of Ontarians think privatization is taking place in urban and rural Ontario communities equally, while 16 per cent think it is taking place mostly in urban Ontario communities, while seven per cent think it is taking place mostly in rural Ontario communities. Forty-five per cent are unsure.
- **Over two thirds of Ontarians think public services in small communities provide good stable jobs which bolster the local economy** – Over two thirds (69%) of Ontarians say it is more accurate that public services in small communities provide good stable jobs which bolster the local economy, while 14 per cent say that it is more accurate that public services in small communities are too expensive and should be cut to save taxpayers money. Seventeen per cent are unsure.

These observations are based on an RDD dual frame (land- and cell-lines) hybrid telephone and online random survey of 1,000 Ontarians, 18 years of age or older, between October 22nd and 27th, 2017. Participants were randomly recruited by telephone using live agents and administered a survey online. The margin of error for a random survey of 1,000 Ontarians is ± 3.1 percentage points, 19 times out of 20.

This study was commissioned by The Ontario Public Service Employees Union and the research was conducted by Nanos Research.













































The results were statistically checked and weighted by age and gender using the latest Census information and the sample is geographically stratified to be representative of Ontario.

Individuals were randomly called using random digit dialling with a maximum of five call backs.

The margin of error for a random survey of 1,000 Ontarians is ± 3.1 percentage points, 19 times out of 20.
