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
Weekly Nanos Party Power Index

BQ scrapes 10 month low on Nanos Party Power Index (Released 06/25/2014)

The weekly Nanos Party Power Index for Canada's federal parties has the Liberals scoring higher (57 points out of 100) compared to the Conservatives (51 points) and the NDP (48 points). The Liberals are near a 10 month high on the vote consideration measure (53 percent of Canadians would consider voting Liberal, compared to a 10 month high of 56 percent). Forty two percent of Canadians would consider voting NDP while 39 percent of Canadians would consider voting Conservatives. These are all independent questions.

Of note, with the election of Beaulieu as the leader of the Bloc Quebecois, that party is at its 10 month low in the BQ Party Power Index among Quebec voters (25 points).

On the preferred Prime Minister front Trudeau and Harper are at 30 percent respectively while 16 percent of Canadians would prefer Mulcair as Prime Minister.

About the Index

Weekly Nanos Party Power Index

Since voters are not actually able to make a choice between elections, it is interesting to think about party strength and support more broadly. The Nanos Party Power Index fills this need by incorporating more information than just current vote preference.

The Nanos Party Power Index is a weekly composite measurement of federal party brands based on four questions about the federal parties and their leadership. The questions include:

- a ballot question that captures the 1st and 2nd vote preferences;
- a measure of whether the respondent would consider voting for the party;
- the 1st and 2nd preferences for Prime Minister of the current federal leaders; and,
- whether the respondent believes each current leader has the quality to be a good leader.

The views of 1,000 respondents are compiled into a diffusion brand index for each party that goes from 0 to 100, where 0 means that the party has no brand strength and 100 means it has maximum brand strength. A score above 50 is an indication of brand strength for the party and its leader at this time.

The important factors in this weekly tracking include the direction of the brand strength or weakness and also the brand strength of one federal party relative to another.


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Canada Weekly Index Tracking Scores (Four week rolling average ending June 20th, 2014, n=1,000)

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
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Atlantic Weekly Index Tracking Scores (Four week rolling average ending June 20th, 2014, n=100)

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
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Quebec Weekly Index Tracking Scores (Four week rolling average ending June 20th, 2014, n=248)

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
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Ontario Weekly Index Tracking Scores (Four week rolling average ending June 20th, 2014, n=300)

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
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Prairies Weekly Index Tracking Scores (Four week rolling average ending June 20th, 2014, n=200)

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
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


British Columbia Weekly Index Tracking Scores (Four week rolling average ending June 20th, 2014, n=152)

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
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18 to 29 Weekly Index Tracking Scores (Four week rolling average ending June 20th, 2014, n=206)


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30 to 39 Weekly Index Tracking Scores (Four week rolling average ending June 20th, 2014, n=169)


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50 to 59 Weekly Index Tracking Scores (Four week rolling average ending June 20th, 2014, n=178)


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60 plus Weekly Index Tracking Scores (Four week rolling average ending June 20th, 2014, n=239)


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Male Weekly Index Tracking Scores (Four week rolling average ending June 20th, 2014, n=487)


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
Female Weekly Index Tracking Scores (Four week rolling average ending June 20th, 2014, n=513)









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

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



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Methodology

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Survey Methodology The Weekly Nanos Party Power Index Tracking is produced by the Nanos Research Corporation, headquartered in Canada, which operates in Canada and the United States. The data is based on random telephone interviews with 1,000 Canadians (land- and cell-lines), using a four week rolling average of 250 respondents each week, 18 years of age and over. The random sample of 1,000 respondents may be weighted by age and gender using the latest census information for Canada. The interviews are compiled into a four week rolling average of 1,000 interviews, where each week the oldest group of 250 interviews is dropped and a new group of 250 interviews is added. The views of 1,000 respondents are compiled into a diffusion brand index for each party that goes from 0 to 100, where 0 means that the party has no brand strength and 100 means it has maximum brand strength. A score above 50 is an indication of brand strength for the party and its leader at this time.

The current report is based on a four week rolling average of Canadian opinion ending June 20th, 2014.

A random telephone survey of 1,000 Canadians is accurate 3.1 percentage points, plus or minus, 19 times out of 20.
