Majority of Canadians like Trudeau's comments that Canada won't be pushed around

Summary

When asked about the relationship between Canada and the United states, a majority of Canadians say Trudeau's announcement that Canada would not be pushed around by the U.S. was a good idea and approve or somewhat approve Trudeau's handling of trade relations with Donald Trump.

- A majority of Canadians say that ongoing diplomatic outreach is an effective or somewhat effective way to change the U.S. position on tariffs and trade When asked if Canada's ongoing outreach to lawmakers and businesses in the United States is an effective strategy to change the U.S. position on tariffs and trade, more than half of Canadians say it is an effective (15%) or somewhat effective (41%) strategy, while 32 per cent say this is somewhat ineffective (18%) or ineffective (14%). Twelve per cent are unsure.
- A majority of Canadians say Trudeau's statement following the G7 summit was a good or somewhat good idea Three in four Canadians say that Trudeau's statement following the G7 summit that Canada would not be pushed around by the U.S. was a good (53%) or somewhat good (23%) idea. Twenty-two per cent think this announcement was a bad (13%) or a somewhat bad (nine per cent) idea. Three per cent are unsure.
- A majority of Canadians are confident or somewhat confident that Canada can protect its economic interests if NAFTA is renegotiated Just over six in ten Canadians say they are confident (19%) or somewhat confident (42%) that Canada can protect its economic interests if the North America Free Trade Agreement is renegotiated. Over one in three are somewhat not confident (22%) or not confident (14%) that Canada can do so. Three per cent are unsure.
- Just over seven in ten Canadians approve or somewhat approve of Justin Trudeau's handling of trade relations with Donald Trump When asked about Justin Trudeau's handling of trade relations with Donald Trump, 71 per cent of Canadians say they approve (39%) or somewhat approve (32%) of it. One in four Canadians somewhat disapprove (nine per cent) or disapprove (17%) of it. Four per cent are unsure.


These observations are based on a RDD dual frame (land- and cell-lines) hybrid telephone and online random survey of 1,000 Canadians, 18 years of age or older, between June 26th and 28th, 2018 as part of an omnibus survey. Participants were randomly recruited by telephone using live agents and administered a survey online. The margin of error for a random survey of 1,000 Canadians is ±3.1 percentage points, 19 times out of 20.

The research was commissioned by The Globe and Mail and CTV News and was conducted by Nanos Research.









Methodology

Nanos conducted an RDD dual frame (land- and cell-lines) hybrid telephone and online random survey of 1,000 Canadians, 18 years of age or older, between June 26th and 28th, 2018 as part of an omnibus survey. Participants were randomly recruited by telephone using live agents and administered a survey online. The results were statistically checked and weighted by age and gender using the latest Census information and the sample is geographically stratified to be representative of Canada.

Individuals were randomly called using random digit dialling with a maximum of five call backs.

The margin of error for a random survey of 1,000 Canadians is ±3.1 percentage points, 19 times out of 20.

The research was commissioned by The Globe and Mail and CTV News and was conducted by Nanos Research.
