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Weekly Nanos Party Power Index

Harper hits new high on preferred PM measure (Released 05/21/2014)

The latest Nanos tracking suggests that Harper has hit a new high on the preferred Prime Minister front. Thirty one percent of Canadians said Harper was their preferred choice as PM. This compares to a low of 25 percent and an overall average of 28 percent for the period of the Nanos weekly tracking which started in August 2013.

While 31 percent of Canadian gave Harper the nod on the preferred PM front, 27 percent identified Trudeau as their preferred choice, followed by Mulcair at 19 percent and May at six percent. Trudeau is nearer his low (26 percent) compared to his high for the period since August (33 percent).

There are a greater proportion of Canadians that would consider voting Liberal (56 percent would consider voting for the Liberals), compared to the New Democrats (45 percent would consider voting NDP) and the Conservatives (44 percent would consider voting Conservative). These are all independent questions.

Readers should note that the fieldwork for the latest wave of weekly Nanos tracking coincided with a focus on Trudeau's pro-choice position on abortion in relation to nominated Liberal candidate. On the overall Nanos Party Power Index, the Liberals scored 56 points out of 100, compared to the Conservatives who scored 52 points, the NDP 49 points and the Green Party 33 points.

Readers should note that with 10 months of weekly tracking, Nanos is now calculating highs, lows and averages for the key Nanos tracking variables in the public domain. This will allow our subscribers and clients to better contextualize the data.

About the Index

Weekly Nanos Party Power Index

Since voters are not actually able to make a choice between elections, it is interesting to think about party strength and support more broadly. The Nanos Party Power Index fills this need by incorporating more information than just current vote preference.

The Nanos Party Power Index is a weekly composite measurement of federal party brands based on four questions about the federal parties and their leadership. The questions include:

- a ballot question that captures the 1st and 2nd vote preferences;
- a measure of whether the respondent would consider voting for the party;
- the 1st and 2nd preferences for Prime Minister of the current federal leaders; and,
- whether the respondent believes each current leader has the quality to be a good leader.

The views of 1,000 respondents are compiled into a diffusion brand index for each party that goes from 0 to 100, where 0 means that the party has no brand strength and 100 means it has maximum brand strength. A score above 50 is an indication of brand strength for the party and its leader at this time.

The important factors in this weekly tracking include the direction of the brand strength or weakness and also the brand strength of one federal party relative to another.


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Canada Weekly Index Tracking Scores (Four week rolling average ending May 16th, 2014, n=1,000)

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
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Atlantic Weekly Index Tracking Scores (Four week rolling average ending May 16th, 2014, n=100)

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
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Quebec Weekly Index Tracking Scores (Four week rolling average ending May 16th, 2014, n=248)

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
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Ontario Weekly Index Tracking Scores (Four week rolling average ending May 16th, 2014, n=300)


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Prairies Weekly Index Tracking Scores (Four week rolling average ending May 16th, 2014, n=200)

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
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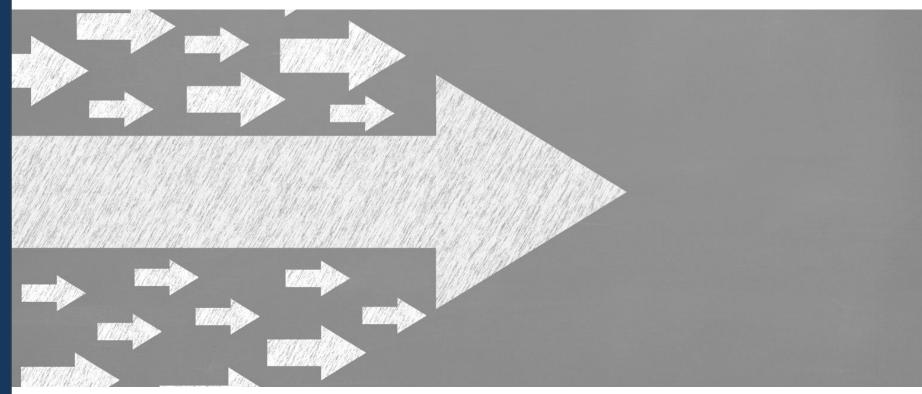


British Columbia Weekly Index Tracking Scores (Four week rolling average ending May 16th, 2014, n=152)

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
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18 to 29 Weekly Index Tracking Scores (Four week rolling average ending May 16th, 2014, n=205)


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30 to 39 Weekly Index Tracking Scores (Four week rolling average ending May 16th, 2014, n=169)


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40 to 49 Weekly Index Tracking Scores (Four week rolling average ending May 16th, 2014, n=208)


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50 to 59 Weekly Index Tracking Scores (Four week rolling average ending May 16th, 2014, n=178)


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60 plus Weekly Index Tracking Scores (Four week rolling average ending May 16th, 2014, n=239)


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Male Weekly Index Tracking Scores (Four week rolling average ending May 16th, 2014, n=496)


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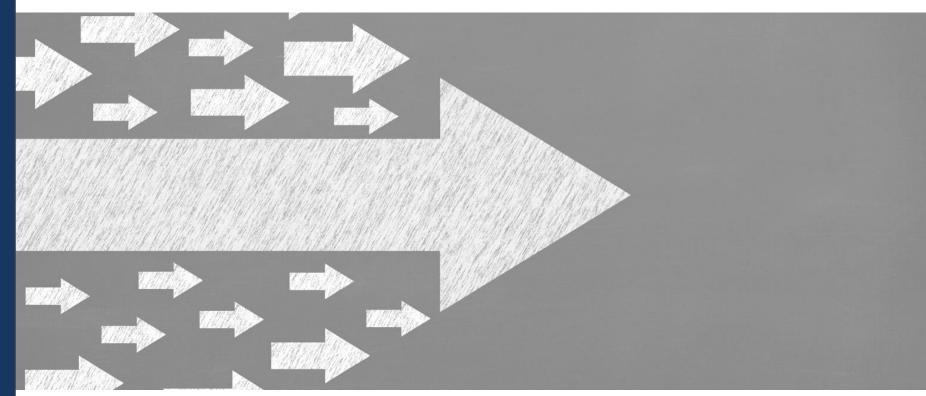


Female Weekly Index Tracking Scores (Four week rolling average ending May 16th, 2014, n=504)



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

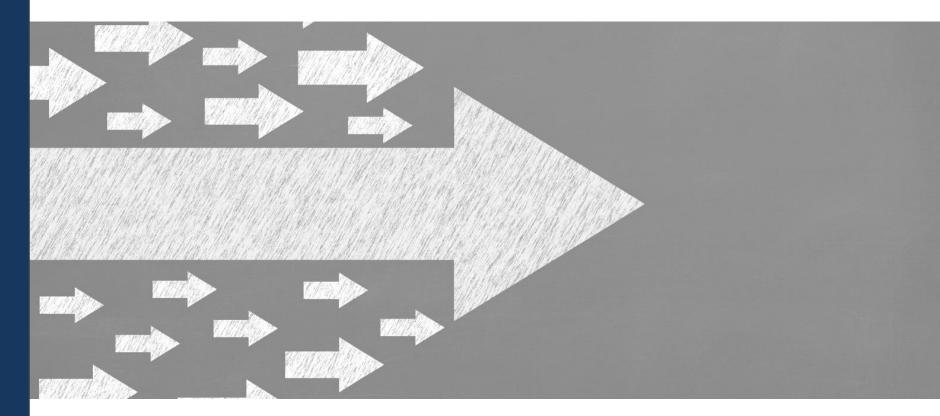


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National – Weekly Tracking – First Ranked Choice (Four week rolling average ending May 16th, 2014, n=1,000)





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



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

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Methodology

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Survey Methodology The Weekly Nanos Party Power Index Tracking is produced by the Nanos Research Corporation, headquartered in Canada, which operates in Canada and the United States. The data is based on random telephone interviews with 1,000 Canadians (land- and cell-lines), using a four week rolling average of 250 respondents each week, 18 years of age and over. The random sample of 1,000 respondents may be weighted by age and gender using the latest census information for Canada. The interviews are compiled into a four week rolling average of 1,000 interviews, where each week the oldest group of 250 interviews is dropped and a new group of 250 interviews is added. The views of 1,000 respondents are compiled into a diffusion brand index for each party that goes from 0 to 100, where 0 means that the party has no brand strength and 100 means it has maximum brand strength. A score above 50 is an indication of brand strength for the party and its leader at this time.

The current report is based on a four week rolling average of Canadian opinion ending May 16th, 2014.

A random telephone survey of 1,000 Canadians is accurate 3.1 percentage points, plus or minus, 19 times out of 20.
