More than two in three New Brunswickers say the minimum wage in New Brunswick should be significantly higher – healthcare is the top unprompted issue

Summary

67 per cent of New Brunswickers say the minimum wage in New Brunswick should be significantly higher Healthcare is the top unprompted issue that New Brunswickers want to hear politicians talk about during the provincial election, as well as jobs and reducing debt, the deficit and overspending. A majority of New Brunswickers say the minimum wage in New Brunswick of \$11.25 an hour should be significantly higher.

 New Brunswickers most often said healthcare is the unprompted top issue they want to hear politicians talk about during the provincial election – Asked what the top two important issues to them personally are that they want to hear the politicians talk about, unprompted New Brunswickers most often mentioned healthcare (23%) as their top issue, followed by jobs (12%), deficit/debt reduction/ stop overspending (10%), seniors/senior care and environment/ climate change (five per cent each).

 More than two in three New Brunswickers say the minimum wage in New Brunswick should be significantly higher – Just over two in three New Brunswickers (67%) say the \$11.25 minimum wage in New Brunswick should be significantly higher, while 24 per cent say it seems about right, and three per cent say there should be no minimum wage. Seven per cent are unsure.

Nanos conducted an online survey of 500 New Brunswick voters, 18 years of age or older, between August 24th to 30th, 2018. Respondents were randomly selected from a non-probability online panel. The results were weighted to the true population proportion to be representative of the New Brunswick population.


