Six in ten Canadians are somewhat worried or worried about a 2019 in recession

SUMMARY



Three in five somewhat worried or worried about a 2019 recession in Canada A comfortable majority of Canadians are somewhat worried or worried about Canada heading into a recession in 2019. Almost three quarters of respondents from the Prairies say they are somewhat worried or worried about a 2019 recession in Canada, while less than half of those in Quebec say the same.

- Nearly three in five Canadians are worried or somewhat worried about a potential recession in **2019** Asked whether they were worried that Canada could be heading into a recession in 2019, six in ten Canadians said somewhat worried (42%) or worried (17%), while 16 per cent said not worried and 21 per cent said somewhat not worried. Three per cent were unsure.
- **Concern is higher in the Prairies and lower in Quebec** Nearly three quarters of respondents from the Prairies said they were worried 28% or somewhat worried 46%. In Quebec, less than half of respondents said they were worried (10%) or somewhat worried (36%).

These observations are based on a Nanos RDD dual frame (land- and cell-lines) hybrid telephone and online random survey of 1,000 Canadians, 18 years of age or older, conducted between December 30^{th} , 2018 and January 5^{th} , 2019 as part of an omnibus survey. Participants were randomly recruited by telephone using live agents and administered a survey online. The margin of error for a random survey of 1,000 Canadians is ± 3.1 percentage points, 19 times out of 20.

Concern for potential recession in 2019





METHODOLOGY



Nanos conducted an RDD dual frame (land- and cell-lines) hybrid telephone and online random survey of 1,000 Canadians, 18 years of age or older, between December 30th, 2018 and January 5th, 2019 as part of an omnibus survey. Participants were randomly recruited by telephone using live agents and administered a survey online. The sample included both land- and cell-lines across Canada. The results were statistically checked and weighted by age and gender using the latest Census information and the sample is geographically stratified to be representative of Canada.

Individuals randomly called using random digit dialling with a maximum of five call backs.

The margin of error for a random survey of 1,000 Canadians is ±3.1 percentage points, 19 times out of 20.
