


# Six in ten Canadians are somewhat worried or worried about a 2019 in recession

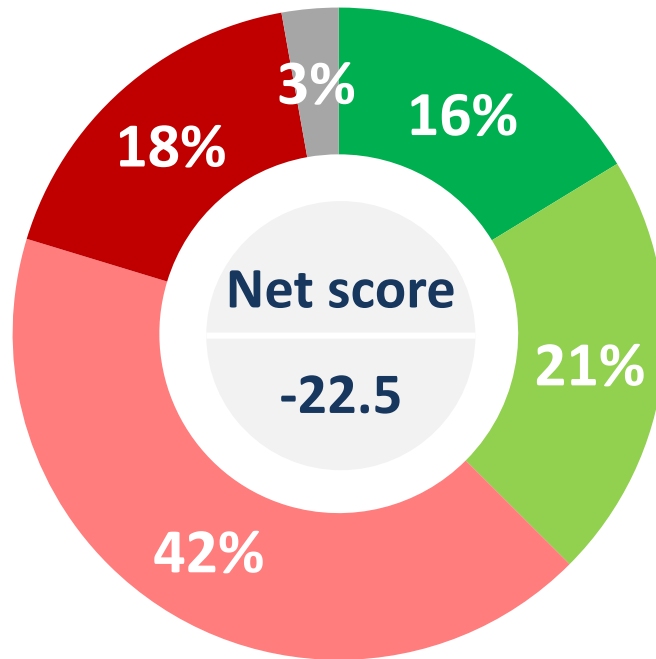
A comfortable majority of Canadians are somewhat worried or worried about Canada heading into a recession in 2019. Almost three quarters of respondents from the Prairies say they are somewhat worried or worried about a 2019 recession in Canada, while less than half of those in Quebec say the same.

- **Nearly three in five Canadians are worried or somewhat worried about a potential recession in 2019** – Asked whether they were worried that Canada could be heading into a recession in 2019, six in ten Canadians said somewhat worried (42%) or worried (17%), while 16 per cent said not worried and 21 per cent said somewhat not worried. Three per cent were unsure.
- **Concern is higher in the Prairies and lower in Quebec** – Nearly three quarters of respondents from the Prairies said they were worried 28% or somewhat worried 46%. In Quebec, less than half of respondents said they were worried (10%) or somewhat worried (36%).

These observations are based on a Nanos RDD dual frame (land- and cell-lines) hybrid telephone and online random survey of 1,000 Canadians, 18 years of age or older, conducted between December 30<sup>th</sup>, 2018 and January 5<sup>th</sup>, 2019 as part of an omnibus survey. Participants were randomly recruited by telephone using live agents and administered a survey online. The margin of error for a random survey of 1,000 Canadians is  $\pm 3.1$  percentage points, 19 times out of 20.

Nanos conducted an RDD dual frame (land- and cell-lines) hybrid telephone and online random survey of 1,000 Canadians, 18 years of age or older, between December 30<sup>th</sup>, 2018 and January 5<sup>th</sup>, 2019 as part of an omnibus survey. Participants were randomly recruited by telephone using live agents and administered a survey online. The sample included both land- and cell-lines across Canada. The results were statistically checked and weighted by age and gender using the latest Census information and the sample is geographically stratified to be representative of Canada.

Individuals randomly called using random digit dialling with a maximum of five call backs.

The margin of error for a random survey of 1,000 Canadians is  $\pm 3.1$  percentage points, 19 times out of 20.

Sampling Method Base	The sample included both land- and cell-lines RDD (Random Digit Dialed) across Canada.
Demographics (Captured)	Atlantic Canada, Quebec, Ontario, Prairies, British Columbia; Men and Women; 18 years and older. Six digit postal code was used to validate geography.
Demographics (Other)	Age, gender, education, income
Fieldwork/Validation	Live interviews with live supervision to validate work
Number of Calls	Maximum of five call backs.
Time of Calls	Individuals were called between 12-5:30 pm and 6:30-9:30pm local time for the respondent.
Field Dates	December 30 <sup>th</sup> , 2018 to January 5 <sup>th</sup> , 2019.
Language of Survey	The survey was conducted in both English and French.

Weighting of Data	The results were weighted by age and gender using the latest Census information (2016) and the sample is geographically stratified to ensure a distribution across all regions of Canada. See tables for full weighting disclosure
Screening	Screening ensured potential respondents did not work in the market research industry, in the advertising industry, in the media or a political party prior to administering the survey to ensure the integrity of the data.
Excluded Demographics	Individuals younger than 18 years old; individuals without land or cell line could not participate.
Stratification	By age and gender using the latest Census information (2016) and the sample is geographically stratified to be representative of Canada. Smaller areas such as Atlantic Canada were marginally oversampled to allow for a minimum regional sample.
Estimated Response Rate	Nine percent, consistent with industry norms.
Question Order	Question order in the preceding report reflects the order in which they appeared in the original questionnaire.
Question Content	This was module one of an omnibus survey. This is report one (1) of two (2). The other report contains questions about jobs.
Question Wording	The questions in the preceding report are written exactly as they were asked to individuals.
