Ballot – The latest Nanos federal ballot tracking has the Conservatives at 34.9 per cent, followed by the Liberals at 32.0 per cent, the NDP at 16.5 percent, the BQ at 4.1 per cent, the Greens at 9.0 per cent and the People's Party of Canada (PPC) at 0.5 per cent.

Accessible Voters – Asked whether they would consider voting for each of the federal parties, 45.6 per cent would consider voting Conservative, while 43.0 per cent of Canadians say they would consider voting Liberal. Four in ten (39.5%) would consider voting NDP, 32.2 per cent would consider voting Green, 9.4 per cent would consider voting for the People's Party and 37.0 per cent would consider voting for the BQ.

Preferred Prime Minister – Nanos tracking has Trudeau as the preferred choice as PM at 31.8 per cent of Canadians followed by Scheer (26.7%), Singh (8.7%), May (8.4%) and Bernier (1.6%). Twenty two per cent of Canadians were unsure whom they preferred.

Qualities of a Good Political Leader – Few than half of Canadians (43.1%) believe Trudeau has the qualities of a good political leader while 39.0 per cent believe Scheer has the qualities of a good political leader. Three in ten (30.1%) say Jagmeet Singh has the qualities of a good political leader, while 36.6 per cent believe the same about May. One in six (18.6%) believe Bernier has the qualities of a good political leader (QC only).

Nanos Party Power Index – The Nanos Index which is a composite of a series of measures including ballot and leadership impressions has the Conservatives 51.6 points, followed by the Liberals with 49.5 points, the NDP 41.9 points, the Greens 37.7 points, the People's Party 27.0 points and the BQ 32.8 points (QC only).

Premier ministre préféré – Selon le suivi Nanos, Trudeau est le choix préféré comme Premier ministre de 31,8 pour cent des Canadiens, suivi de Scheer (26,7 %), Singh (8,7 %), May (8,4 %) et Bernier (1,6 %). Vingt-deux pour cent des Canadiens étaient incertains de leur préférence.

Qualités d'un bon leader politique – Moins de la moitié des Canadiens (43,1 %) pensent que Trudeau a les qualités d'un bon leader politique, alors que 39,0 pour cent pensent de même de Scheer. Trois Canadiens sur dix (30,1 %) disent que Jagmeet Singh a les qualités d'un bon leader politique, tandis que 36,6 pour cent pensent de même de May. 









Methodology



The Weekly Nanos Tracking is produced by the Nanos Research Corporation, headquartered in Canada, which operates in Canada and the United States. The data is based on a dual frame (land + cell-lines) random telephone interviews with 1,000 Canadians using a four week rolling average of 250 respondents each week, 18 years of age and over. The random sample of 1,000 respondents may be weighted by age and gender using the latest census information for Canada. The interviews are compiled into a four week rolling average of 1,000 interviews, where each week the oldest group of 250 interviews is dropped and a new group of 250 interviews is added.

A random telephone survey of 1,000 Canadians is accurate ± 3.1 percentage points, plus or minus, 19 times out of 20.

Since voters are not actually able to make a choice between elections, it is interesting to think about party strength and support more broadly. The Nanos Party Power Index fills this need by incorporating more information than just current vote preference.

The Nanos Party Power Index is a weekly composite measurement of federal party brands based on four questions about the federal parties and their leadership. The questions include:

- a ballot question that captures the 1st and 2nd vote preferences;
- a measure of whether the respondent would consider voting for the party;
- the 1st and 2nd preferences for Prime Minister of the current federal leaders; and,
- whether the respondent believes each current leader has the quality to be a good leader.

The views of 1,000 respondents are compiled into a diffusion brand index for each party that goes from 0 to 100, where 0 means that the party has no brand strength and 100 means it has maximum brand strength. A score above 50 is an indication of brand strength for the party and its leader at this time. The important factors in this weekly tracking include the direction of the brand strength or weakness and also the brand strength of one federal party relative to another.


