The State of the City of London



London residents give the highest score to London as a place to raise a family and the lowest score to London as a place to take public transit; a minority think municipal leaders in London are doing a good job at anything

SUMMARY



Residents give the highest mean score to London as a place to raise a family and give the lowest to London as a place to take public transit London residents rate London the highest in terms of being a place to raise a family, the quality of healthcare, and the overall quality of life, and rate it lowest as a place to take public transit. They generally feel municipal leaders do an average job of tacking issues, most often saying they do a very good or good job at helping attract jobs to London and a poor or very poor job at addressing homelessness. A majority of residents believe there will be no change in the personal finances or in the economy in London in the next six months, and are 10 times more likely to think the value of real estate in their neighbourhood will increase rather than decrease.

Rating the City of London

- London most often say that improved infrastructure/roadways would make the City of London a better place When asked if they had one piece of advice to make the City of London a better place, residents most often mention improved infrastructure/roadways (25%), followed by improved public transit (17%), solutions for homelessness/supporting low income persons (9%), improved local government (7%), improvements to downtown area (6%) and more green space/parks/recreational activities(4%) Five per cent say other. Sixteen per cent are unsure.
- Residents of London give the highest score to London as a place to raise a family; give the lowest score to London as a place to take public transit Asked to rate the City of London on scale of 1 to 10, where 1 is a very poor rating and 10 is a very good rating, residents gave London as a place to raise a family the highest mean score (8.0), followed by the overall quality of life in London and the quality of healthcare in London with a mean score of 7.8 each. London as a safe place to live and London as a place to have a business received 7.5 and 7.0 respectively as mean scores. London as a place to take public transit and London as a place where one can afford to buy a home received the lowest score (5.8 and 6.3 respectively).

Performance of municipal leaders on various issues

 London residents most often say municipal leaders do an average job at helping attract jobs to London – More than four in ten residents say municipal leaders do an average job (45%) at helping attract jobs to London, while just under one in three say they are doing a good (28%) or very good job (four per cent) at this, and under two in ten say they do a poor (12%) or very poor job (four per cent). Six per cent are unsure.

SUMMARY

A majority of London residents say the municipal leaders do a poor or very poor job at addressing the issue of homelessness

- London residents most often say municipal leaders do a poor or very poor job at creating an environment for affordable housing When asked how well the municipal leaders do in terms of providing support for creating an environment for affordable housing , nearly four in ten residents say they do a poor (33%) or very poor (six per cent) job at this, followed by average(37%), while over one in ten say good (17%) or very good job at this (one per cent). Five per cent are unsure.
- London residents are divided over the performance of municipal leaders at building a strong
 public transit system Nearly four in ten residents say municipal leaders do a poor (29%) or very
 poor (eight per cent) job at providing support for building a strong public transit system, while 36
 per cent say they are doing an average job, and over two in ten say good (19%) or very good job at
 this (four per cent). Four per cent are unsure.
- London residents most often say municipal leaders are doing an average job at improving traffic by investing in roads Four in ten residents say municipal leaders do an average job (40%) at investing in roads to improve traffic, while one in three say they are doing a poor (24%) or very poor (nine per cent) job at this, and just over one in four say they are doing a good (21%) or very good job (five per cent). One per cent are unsure.
- London residents most frequently say municipal leaders are doing an average job at working together as a group to find solutions Over four in ten residents say municipal leaders do an average job (44%) at working together as a group to find solutions, while one in four say they are doing a poor (20%) or very poor (five per cent) job at this, and just under one in four say they are doing a good (22%) or very good job (two per cent). Seven per cent are unsure.
- London residents most often say municipal leaders do a poor or very poor job at addressing the issue of homelessness Nearly half of residents say municipal leaders do a poor (39%) or very poor (10%) job at addressing the issue of homelessness, while 35 per cent say they are doing an average job, and just over one in ten say good (nine per cent) or very good job at this (two per cent). Six per cent are unsure.

Residents are 10 times more likely to think the value of real estate in their neighbourhood will increase rather than decrease

Economic stability

- The majority of London residents report there has been no change in their personal finances over the past year Asked to think of their personal finances, nearly two in three residents (64%) report there has been no change over the past year, while 21 per cent say they are better off and 14 per cent say their finances are worse off (23% of Ontarians and Canadians, respectively). One per cent are unsure.
- The majority of residents of London think there will be no change in the economy in London in the next six months Over seven in ten residents (71%) think the economy in London in will not change in the next six months while over one in ten (13%) think the economy will be stronger and 12 per cent think it will be weaker (30% of Ontarians and 27% of Canadians thinking of the national economy). Four per cent are unsure.
- More than seven in ten London residents say their job is secure or somewhat secure Just over seven in ten residents say they would describe their job as secure (51%) or somewhat secure (20%), while just over one in ten say its somewhat not secure (four per cent) or not at all secure (eight per cent). Seventeen per cent are unsure.
- London residents are 10 times more likely to think the value of real estate in their neighbourhood will increase rather than decrease Nearly six in ten residents (58%) believe that the value of real estate in their neighborhood will increase in the next six months (43% of Canadians say the same) while one in three (34%) believe it will stay the same and 6 per cent think the value of real estate will decrease in the next six months. Three per cent are unsure.

These observations are based on an RDD dual frame (land- and cell-lines) telephone random survey of 501 residents of the City of London, 18 years of age or older, conducted between , September 15^{th} to 23^{rd} , 2019. Participants were randomly recruited by telephone using live agents and administered a survey. The margin of error for this survey is ±4.4 percentage points, 19 times out of 20.

This study was commissioned by Ontario Real Estate Association and the research was conducted by Nanos Research.





Rating the quality of life in London













Rating London as a place to take public transit







Rating London as a place where one can afford a home























Strength of the economy







Job security






QUESTION – Would you describe your job, at this time, as secure, somewhat secure, somewhat not secure or not at all secure?




QUESTION – Would you describe your job, at this time, as secure, somewhat secure, somewhat not secure or not at all secure?



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Value of real estate






QUESTION – In the next six months, do you believe that the value of real estate in your neighborhood will increase, stay the same or decrease?

METHODOLOGY



Nanos conducted an RDD dual frame (land- and cell-lines) random telephone survey of 501 residents of the City of London, 18 years of age or older, between September 15th and 23rd, 2019. Participants were randomly recruited by telephone using live agents and administered a survey. The sample is geographically stratified to be representative of London.

Individuals were randomly called using random digit dialling with a maximum of five call backs.

The margin of error for this survey is ± 4.4 percentage points, 19 times out of 20.

The research was commissioned by the Ontario Real Estate Association (OREA) and the London and St. Thomas Association of Realtors (LSTAR) and was conducted by Nanos Research.

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
