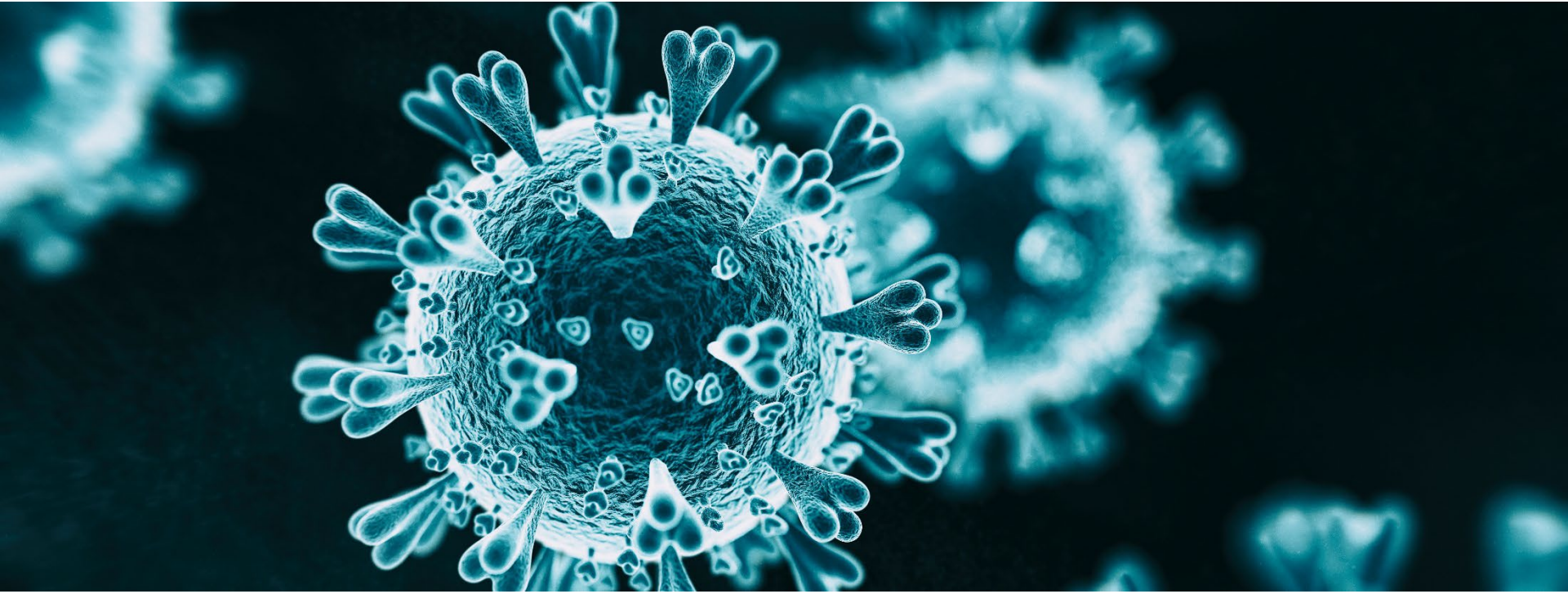


A majority of Canadians are pessimistic about the outlook of the Coronavirus situation, but approve of the Government of Canada's response

Key findings

Readers should note the following key findings related to Canadian's opinions of the Coronavirus situation.



A majority of Canadians think the Coronavirus situation will get worse

Sixty-seven per cent of Canadians say the coronavirus situation in their community will get worse, 17 per cent say it will get better and 10 per cent say it will stay the same. Those who more frequently check the news (76% of those who check the news constantly) are more likely to think the situation will get worse



Less than three in ten Canadians say that their neighbours are strictly following Coronavirus guidelines

Four in five Canadians think that their neighbours are strictly (29%) or somewhat strictly (51%) following the guidance of public health authorities to maintain social distance. Under one in five think their neighbours are not strictly (four per cent) or somewhat not strictly (12%) following this guidance.



Most Canadians think the Government has had a good or very good response to the Coronavirus

Nearly two thirds of Canadians say the Government's response to Covid-19 has been very good (22%) or good (40%). Intensity of approval is highest in the Atlantic (48% very good) and lowest in Quebec (16% very good).



Nearly two in three Canadians say their neighbours are worried or somewhat worried about paying bills

Thirty-three per cent of Canadians think their neighbours are worried (40% of those with five or more people in their household) and 32 per cent are somewhat worried (38% of those with five or more people in their household) about paying bills, while nearly three in ten say their neighbours are somewhat not worried (14%) or not worried (13%).



Over six in ten Canadians say their neighbours are worried or somewhat worried about losing their job

Thirty-four per cent of Canadians say their neighbours are worried (45% of those who check the news constantly, 47 per cent of those with five or more people in their household) and 28 per cent say they are somewhat worried about losing their job, while 15 per cent say their neighbours are not worried and 12 per cent say somewhat not worried.

More than six in ten Canadians say their neighbours are worried or somewhat worried about losing their job due to the Coronavirus

Two thirds of Canadians report thinking that the Coronavirus situation will get worse in the next month. Over six in ten also say that their neighbours are worried about paying bills and losing their jobs. Those who check the news constantly and who have larger households (five or more people) are more likely to report such worries; however households of one person are less likely to be pessimistic about the Coronavirus situation. Only, three in ten Canadians say their neighbours are strictly following guidelines on social distancing. Nearly two thirds of Canadians approve of the Government of Canada's response to the Coronavirus situations, saying it is good or very good.

- **Two thirds of Canadians think the Coronavirus situation will get worse** – Asked about their expectations regarding the Coronavirus/Covid-19 situation in their community over the next month, 67 per cent of Canadians say it would get worse, 17 per cent say it will get better and 10 per cent say it will stay the same. Six per cent are unsure. Canadians in single person households are less pessimistic than those living in larger households (78% of those who have five or more people in their household say situation will get worse, 58% of those living alone say situation will get worse).
- **Canadians are more likely to say their neighbours are not worried rather than worried about running out of food** – Nearly six in ten Canadians say that their neighbours are not worried (31%) or somewhat not worried (24%) about running out of food, while a third say their neighbours are somewhat worried (24%) or worried (nine per cent). Eight per cent are unsure.
- **Nearly two in three Canadians say their neighbours are worried or somewhat worried about paying bills** – Almost two thirds of Canadians think their neighbours are worried (33%) or somewhat worried (32%) about paying bills, while nearly three in ten say their neighbours are somewhat not worried (14%) or not worried (13%). Eight per cent are unsure.
- **Over six in ten Canadians say their neighbours are worried or somewhat worried about losing their job** – More than six in ten Canadians say their neighbours are worried (34%) or somewhat worried (28%) about losing their job, while just under three in ten say their neighbours are not worried (15%) or somewhat not worried (12%). Eleven per cent are unsure.



Less than three in ten Canadians say that their neighbours are strictly following Coronavirus guidelines

- **Nearly four fifths of Canadians say their neighbours are worried or somewhat worried about a family member getting the Coronavirus** – Almost eight in ten Canadians say their neighbours are worried (42%) or somewhat worried (36%) about a family member getting the Coronavirus/Covid-19, while less than one in five say their neighbours are somewhat not worried (11%) or not worried (four per cent). Eight per cent are unsure. Quebecers report a lower intensity of worry (28% worried, 40% somewhat worried).
- **Four fifths of Canadians say their neighbours are strictly or somewhat strictly following public health guidance on social distancing** – Four in five Canadians think that their neighbours are strictly (29%) or somewhat strictly (51%) following the guidance of public health authorities to social distance from others including avoiding crowded places and non-essential gatherings, avoiding common greetings, such as handshakes, limiting contact with people at higher risk (e.g. older adults and those in poor health), and keeping a distance of at least 2 arms lengths (approximately 2 metres) from others, as much as possible. Four per cent think their neighbours are not strictly following this guidance and 12 percent say somewhat not strictly. Five per cent are unsure. Younger Canadians are less likely to say their neighbours are strictly following the guidance (17% of 18 to 34-year-olds, 31% of 35 to 54-year-olds and 37% of those aged 55 plus). Of note, to minimize social desirability effect, Nanos asked Canadians about their neighbours and the responses should be considered a likely proxy for personal behaviour.
- **Nearly two thirds of Canadians say the Government's response to Covid-19 has been very good or good** – More than six in ten Canadians say the response by the Government of Canada to Covid-19 has been very good (22%, 13% of those with five or more people in their household) or good (40%), while 21 per cent say average, 10 per cent say poor and seven per cent say very poor. Less than one per cent are unsure. Canadians in the Atlantic are more likely to say the response has been very good (48%), while those from Quebec are less likely (16%).

SUMMARY

Nearly six in ten Canadians say they check news about the Coronavirus several times a day

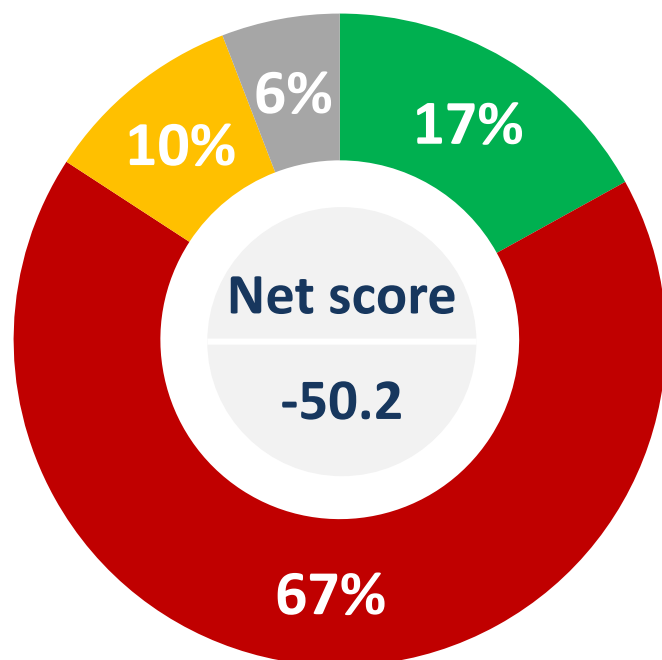
- **More than nine in ten Canadians report checking the new on developments on the virus at least once a day** – More than half of Canadians (57%) report checking the news several times a day, followed by 21 per cent who say once a day, 14 per cent who say constantly, five per cent who say hourly and two per cent say every couple of days. Less than one percent each say once a week or less than once a week.
- **Canadians most frequently report two people living in their household** – Nearly two in five Canadians (38%) say two people live in their household, followed by one in five each who say one person (19%) or three people (18%) live in their household, 16 per cent say four people, and eight per cent say five or more people live in their household.
- **A majority of Canadians report that it is not likely they or someone in their household have symptoms indicative of the Coronavirus** – Asked the likelihood that either they or someone in their household has the symptoms that suggest having the Coronavirus/Cov-19 which include fever, cough and shortness of breath, 70 per cent of Canadians say not likely, followed by 18 per cent who say somewhat not likely, six per cent who say somewhat likely and three per cent who say likely. Four per cent are unsure.

Readers should note that cross-tabulations by media consumption and household size are attached to this report.

These observations are based on an RDD dual frame (land- and cell-lines) hybrid telephone and online random survey of 1,013 Canadians, 18 years of age or older, conducted between March 24th and 27th, 2020 as part of an omnibus survey. The margin of error for this survey is ± 3.1 percentage points, 19 times out of 20.

■ Better ■ Worse ■ Stay the same ■ Unsure

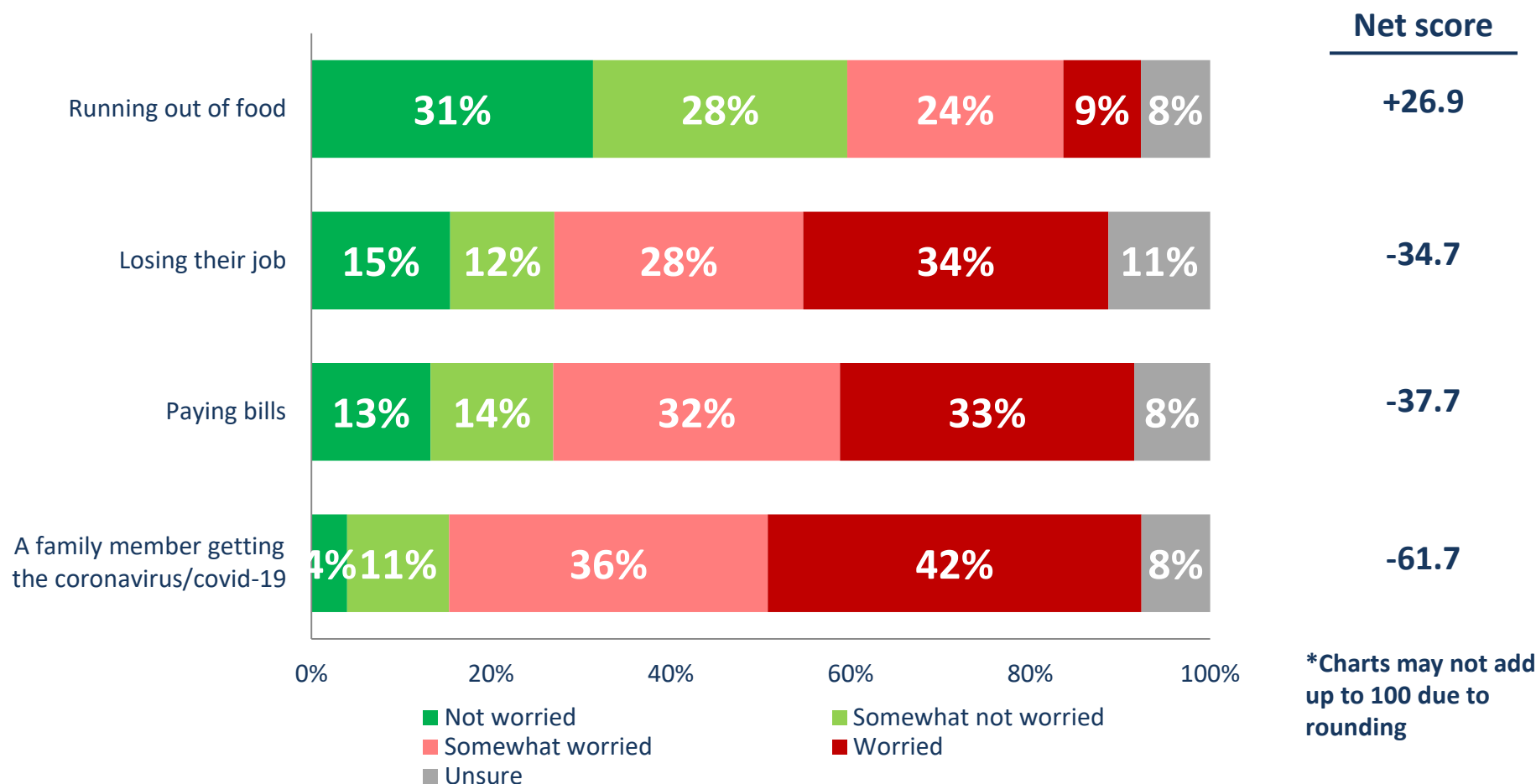

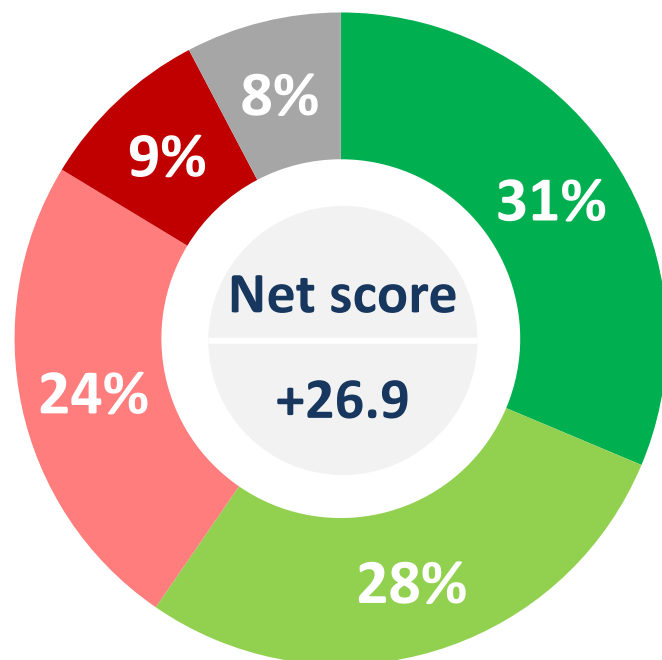
QUESTION – Do you expect in the next month the Coronavirus/Covid-19 situation in your community will get better, worse or stay the same as it is today?

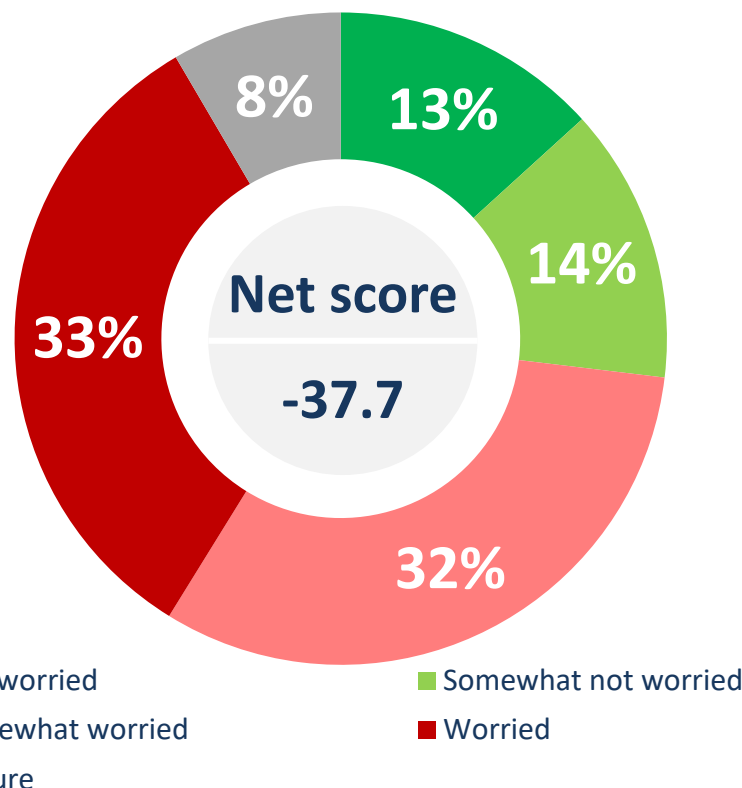

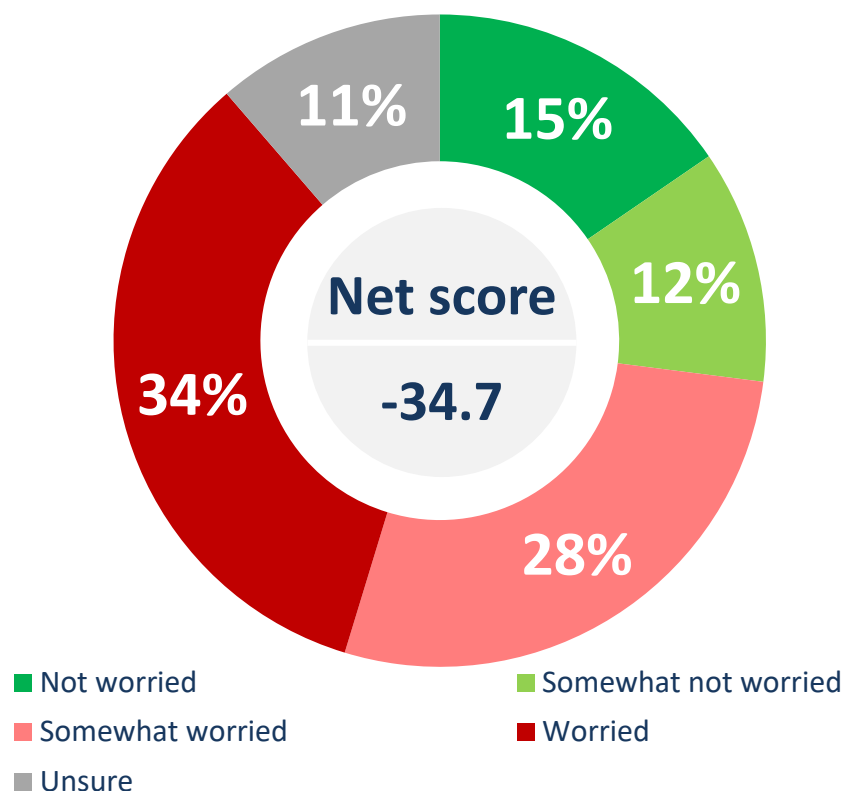

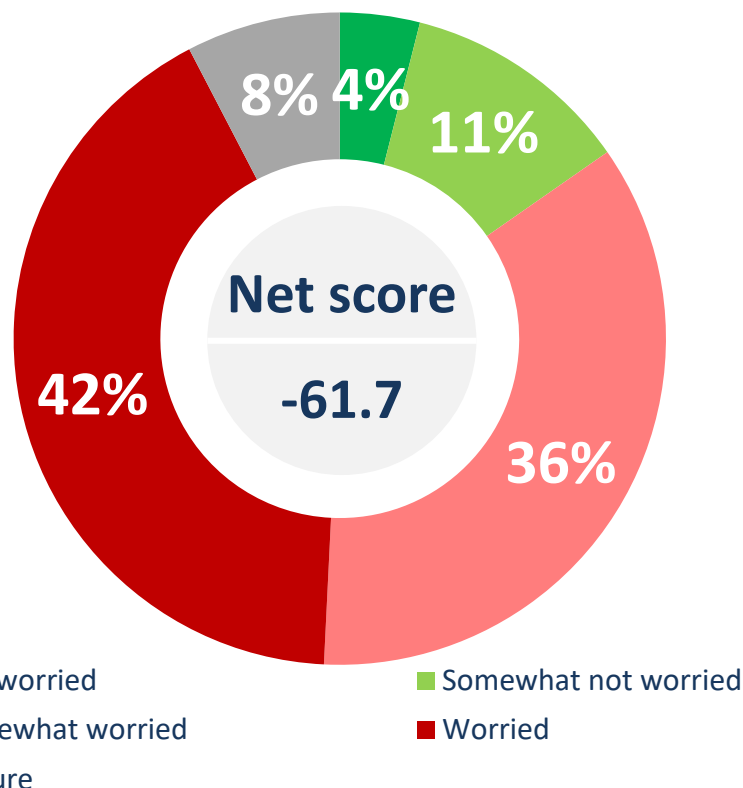

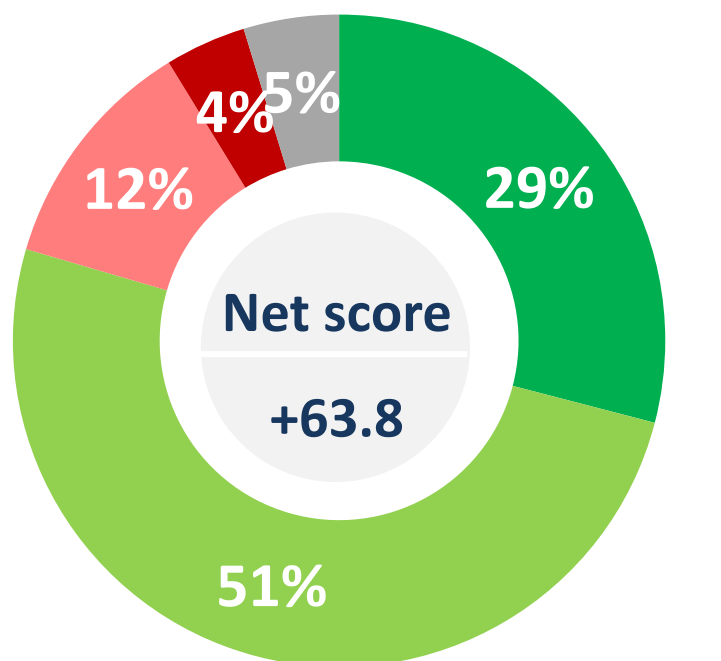

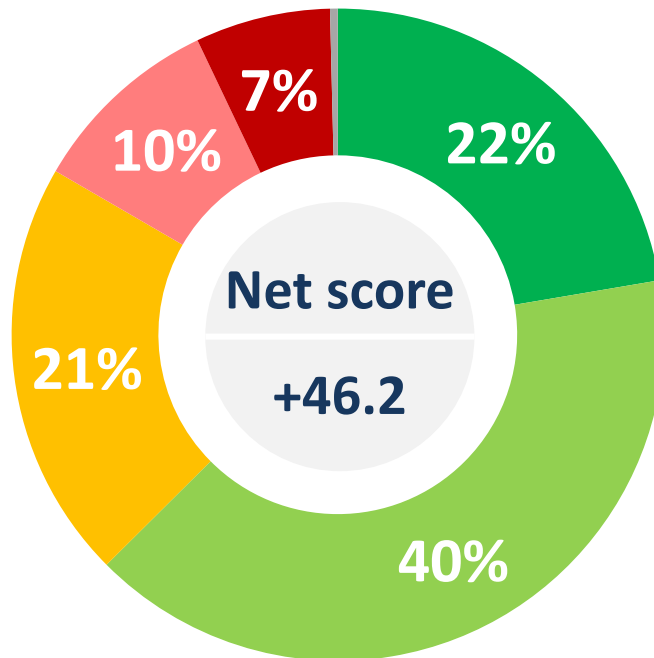

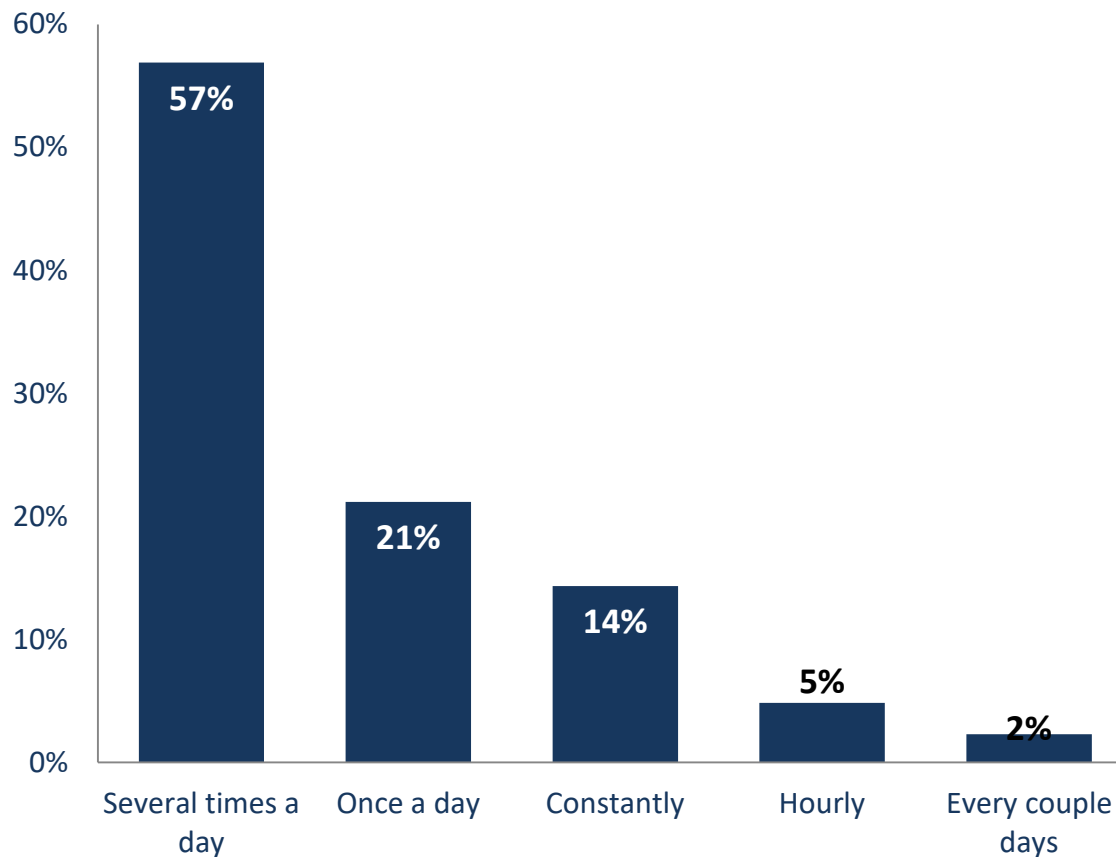

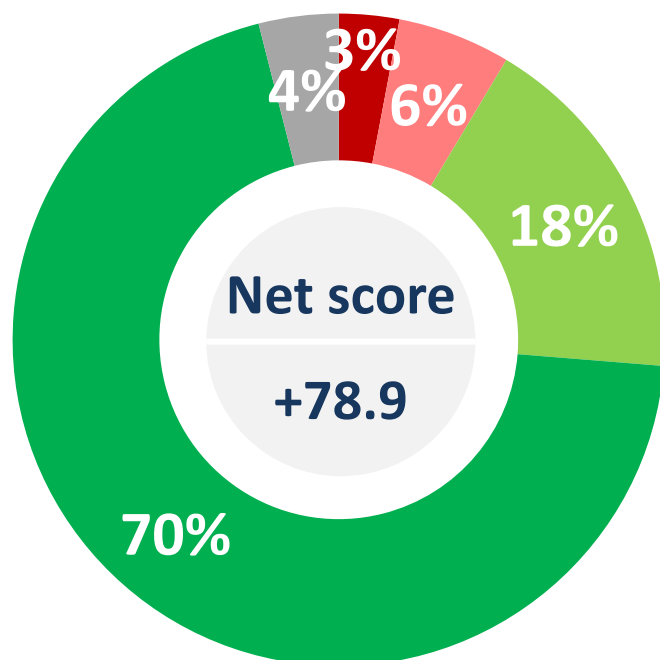

Nanos conducted an RDD dual frame (land- and cell-lines) hybrid telephone and online random survey of 1,013 Canadians, 18 years of age or older, between March 24th and 27th, 2020 as part of an omnibus survey. Participants were randomly recruited by telephone using live agents and administered a survey online. The sample included both land- and cell-lines across Canada. The results were statistically checked and weighted by age and gender using the latest Census information and the sample is geographically stratified to be representative of Canada.

Individuals randomly called using random digit dialling with a maximum of five call backs.

The margin of error for this survey is ± 3.1 percentage points, 19 times out of 20.

This study was commissioned by CTV News and Globe and Mail and the research was conducted by Nanos Research.
