

# Feelings of satisfaction towards the federal government in Ottawa are on the rise with COVID-19 outbreak

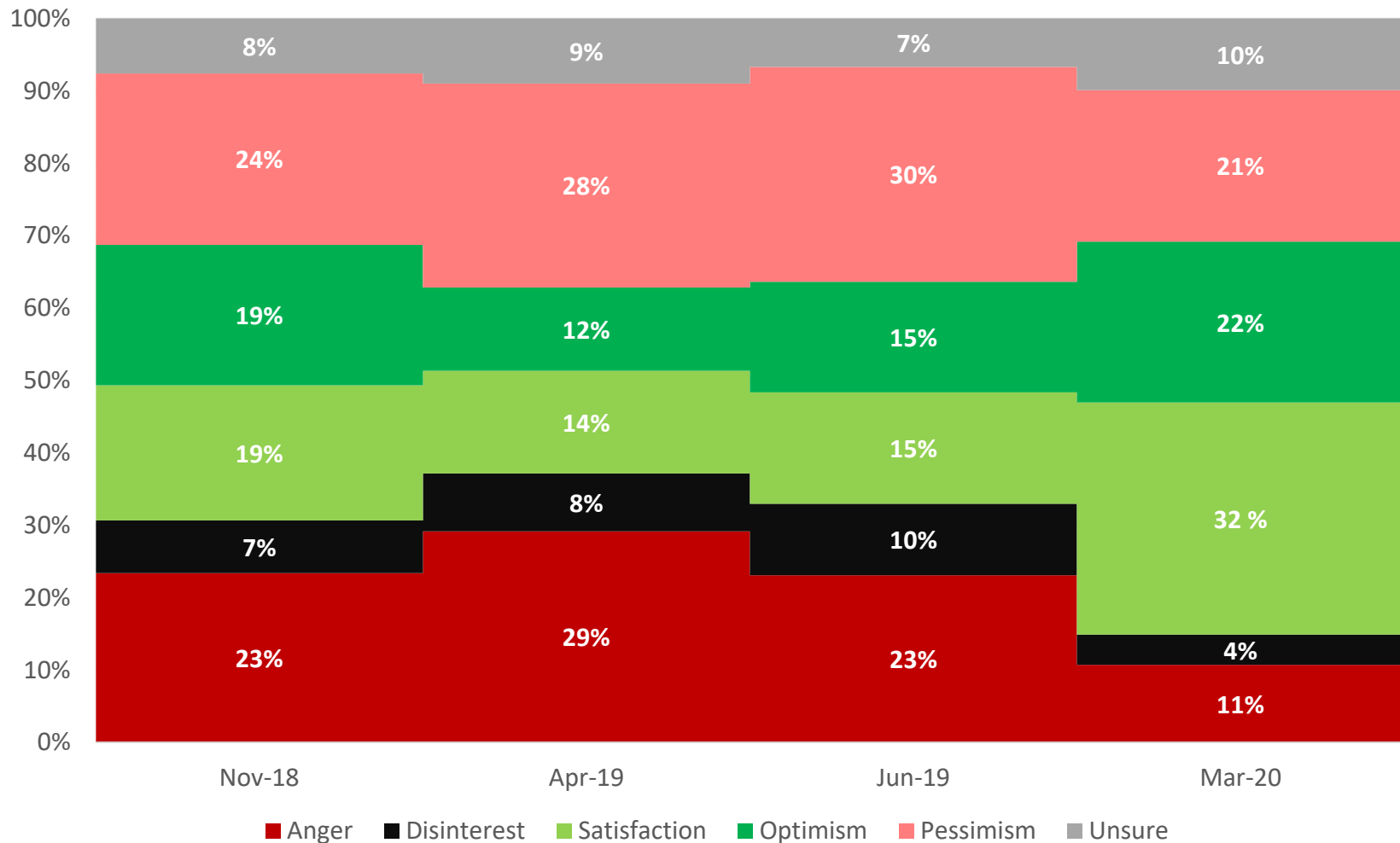
According to a new Nanos study, Canadians most frequently report feeling satisfaction when describing their views of the federal government in Ottawa, followed by optimism and pessimism. Feelings of satisfaction have more than doubled since 2019.

- **Twice as many Canadians' say they feel satisfaction towards the federal government compared to the previous waves in April and June 2019** – When asked which feelings best describes their views of the federal government in Ottawa, Canadians most frequently selected satisfaction (32% compared to 15% in June 2019, 14% in April 2019), followed by optimism (22%; 15% in June 2019 and 12% in April 2019), pessimism (21%; 30% in June 2019 and 28% in April 2019), and anger (11%; 23% in June 2019 and 29% in April 2019). Four per cent are disinterested and ten per cent are unsure.
- **Pessimism is higher in the Prairies and lower in the Atlantic** – Twenty-one per cent of Canadians in the Prairies say they feel satisfaction towards the federal government (27% pessimism, 21% optimism), while 43 per cent of Canadians in the Atlantic say they feel satisfaction (27% optimism, 15% pessimism).

The observations are based on a Nanos RDD dual frame (land- and cell-lines) hybrid telephone and online random survey of 1,013 Canadians, 18 years of age or older, conducted between March 24<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup>, 2020 as part of an omnibus survey. The margin of error for a random survey of 1,013 Canadians is  $\pm 3.1$  percentage points, 19 times out of 20.

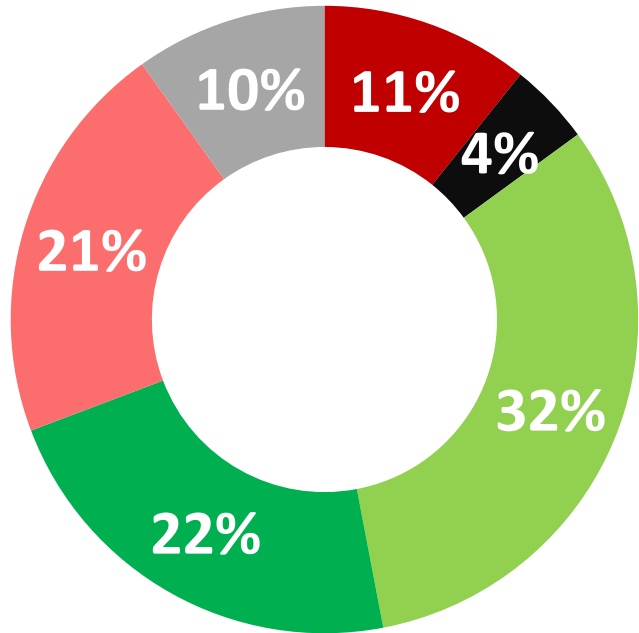

Nanos conducted an RDD dual frame (land- and cell-lines) hybrid telephone and online random survey of 1,013 Canadians, 18 years of age or older, between March 24<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup>, 2020 as part of an omnibus survey. Participants were randomly recruited by telephone using live agents and administered a survey online. The results were statistically checked and weighted by age and gender using the latest Census information and the sample is geographically stratified to be representative of Canada.

Individuals were randomly called using random digit dialling with a maximum of five call backs.

The margin of error for a random survey of 1,013 Canadians is  $\pm 3.1$  percentage points, 19 times out of 20.

The research was conducted by Nanos Research.

Weighting of Data	The results were weighted by age and gender using the latest Census information (2016) and the sample is geographically stratified to ensure a distribution across all regions of Canada. See tables for full weighting disclosure
Screening	Screening ensured potential respondents did not work in the market research industry, in the advertising industry, in the media or a political party prior to administering the survey to ensure the integrity of the data.
Excluded Demographics	Individuals younger than 18 years old; individuals without land or cell lines, and individuals without internet access could not participate.
Stratification	By age and gender using the latest Census information (2016) and the sample is geographically stratified to be representative of Canada. Smaller areas such as Atlantic Canada were marginally oversampled to allow for a minimum regional sample.
Estimated Response Rate	10 percent, consistent with industry norms.
Question Order	Question order in the preceding report reflects the order in which they appeared in the original questionnaire.
Question Content	This was module two of an omnibus survey. Previous modules included content related to the coronavirus.
Question Wording	The questions in the preceding report are written exactly as they were asked to individuals.
