## Three in five Canadians believe more or somewhat more aid will be required before things return to normal

## NEWS

Three in five Canadians believe more or somewhat more aid will be required before things return to normal. Canadians most frequently say they are unsure on when businesses in Canada should be allowed to reopen, while nearly three in ten think one to two months. More than nine in ten Canadians support or somewhat support keeping the Canada US border closed to non-essential travel.

- Canadians most frequently say they are unsure when businesses in Canada should be allowed to reopen - Asked how much longer it should be before all businesses in Canada should be allowed to reopen, 40 per cent of Canadians say they are unsure, followed by 15 per cent who say one month, and 14 per cent who say two months. Eight percent say business should be allowed to reopen in two weeks or three months, respectively, while seven per cent say in more than four months, five percent say businesses immediately and four percent say in four months.
- Three in five Canadians believe more or somewhat more aid will be required before things return to normal - A majority of Canadians believe that there will be a need for much more aid (19\%) or somewhat more aid (41\%) before things return to normal. One in four Canadians believe that about the right amount is available now (25\%), while one in ten Canadians believe they will need somewhat less aid (eight per cent) or much less aid (three peer cent) before things return to normal. Five per cent are unsure.
- Just over one in four Canadians first rank maintaining programs and tax levels and allowing debt to grow as the thing governments could do to manage their debt and deficit the most Asked how the government could best manage the debt incurred due to helping Canadians and Canadian businesses get through the Covid-19 outbreak, just over one in four Canadians most support maintaining programs and tax levels and allowing debt to grow (28\%), while $25 \%$ most support increasing taxes on businesses and $18 \%$ most support increasing HST. Seventeen per cent most support cutting programs and services to Canadians, while nine per cent most support increasing taxes on individuals. Four per cent are unsure.

- A majority of Canadians say they practice social distancing and most people are also doing so Seven in ten Canadians ( $70 \%$ ) say they are practicing social distancing and most people in their community are also doing so, while 25 percent say they are practicing social distancing, but others need to be reminded. Three per cent of Canadians say they are not strictly following the social distancing guidelines and see others not following them as well, while two per cent are not strictly following guidelines but think most people still are.
- Nine in 10 Canadians support or somewhat support keeping the Canada US border closed to non-essential travel until the number of new cases in the U.S. significantly drops even if that takes several months or longer - Ninety-two percent of Canadians say they support ( $78 \%$ ) or somewhat support (14\%) keeping the Canada US border closed to non-essential travel until the number of new cases in the U.S. significantly drops even if that takes several months or longer while five percent somewhat oppose and three per cent oppose this. One percent are unsure.

These observations are based on a hybrid survey of 1,049 Canadians, 18 years of age or older, between April $25^{\text {th }}$ and $27^{\text {th }}, 2020$ as part of an omnibus survey. The margin of error for this survey is $\pm 3.1$ percentage points, 19 times out of 20 .

Nanos conducted an RDD dual frame (land- and cell-lines) hybrid telephone and online random survey of 1,049 Canadians, 18 years of age or older, between April $25^{\text {th }}$ and $27^{\text {th }}, 2020$ as part of an omnibus survey. Participants were randomly recruited by telephone using live agents and administered a survey online. The sample included both land- and cell-lines across Canada. The results were statistically checked and weighted by age and gender using the latest Census information and the sample is geographically stratified to be representative of Canada.

Individuals randomly called using random digit dialling with a maximum of five call backs.

The margin of error for this survey is $\pm 3.1$ percentage points, 19 times out of 20 .

This study was commissioned by CTV News and the research was conducted by Nanos Research.

## Element Description

The results were weighted by age and gender using the latest Census information (2016) and the sample is geographically stratified to ensure a distribution across all regions of Canada See tables for full weighting disclosure

Screening ensured potential respondents did not work in the market research industry, in the advertising industry, in the media or a political party prior to administering the survey to ensure the integrity of the data.

Individuals younger than 18 years old; individuals without land or cell lines, and individuals without internet access could not participate.

By age and gender using the latest Census information (2016) and the sample is geographically stratified to be representative of Canada. Smaller areas such as Atlantic Canada were marginally oversampled to allow for a minimum regional sample.
