One in three British Columbia residents report they have delayed getting medical care for themselves or a loved one because they were afraid of being exposed to COVID; just under 7 in 10 have been anxious or somewhat anxious about being exposed to COVID-19 when visiting or considering visiting a clinic or hospital

About seven in ten British Columbia residents say they have been anxious or somewhat anxious about being exposed to COVID-19 when visiting or considering visiting a clinic or hospital One in three British Columbia residents report they have delayed getting medical care for themselves or a loved one because they were afraid of being exposed to COVID, and a majority say they have been anxious or somewhat anxious about being exposed to COVID-19 when visiting a clinic or hospital. Close to three in four residents agree or somewhat agree they are concerned a second wave of COVID could impact their ability to access medical care.

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Close to three in five residents who needed medical care for themselves or a loved one report they or their loved one accessed care through a phone or video call with their family doctor. More than three in five are comfortable or somewhat comfortable having a virtual consultation, and a majority of residents who make healthcare decisions for someone other than themselves think the use of virtual care would make it easier or somewhat easier to help their loved ones consult with a doctor.

Healthcare access and decision making

- Six in ten residents of British Columbia report they make healthcare decisions for someone other than themselves Just over four in ten British Columbia residents report they do not make healthcare decisions for anyone other than themselves (44%), while 39 per cent report making healthcare decisions for their spouse/partner, and 22 per cent report making decisions for their child(ren). Eight per cent report making healthcare decisions for their parent(s), while two per cent report making these decisions for another family member, and two per cent are unsure/ prefer not to say. Residents 35 to 54 years of age are significantly more likely to report making healthcare decisions for a child (38%) than those 18 to 34 (21%) or 55 plus (nine per cent), while those 55 plus are more likely to report making healthcare decisions for their partner/spouse (47%; 18-34:27%).
- A majority of British Columbia residents report they currently have a family doctor Eighty-six per cent of British Columbia residents report they currently have a family doctor, while 14 per cent report they do not. Residents of Suburban Vancouver/Shore/Vancouver Island (90%) and the City of Vancouver (88%) are more likely to report having a family doctor than residents of Interior (76%), and older residents (55 plus) are more likely to report having one (93%) than those 18 to 34 or 35 to 54 (80% each).

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Accessing medical care since March

- Just under seven in ten British Columbia residents say they have been anxious or somewhat anxious about being exposed to COVID-19 when visiting a clinic or hospital A majority of British Columbia residents say since March they have been anxious (21%) or somewhat anxious (49%) about being exposed to COVID-19 when visiting or considering visiting a clinic or hospital, while just under three in ten say they have been somewhat not anxious (13%) or not anxious (16%). Two per cent are unsure/prefer not to answer. Younger residents (18-34) are more likely to say they feel anxious (33%) than older residents (35-54: 22%; 55 plus: 11%).
- Close to six in ten British Columbia residents report they have needed to access non-emergency medical care for themselves or a loved one since March of this year – Just under six in ten British Columbia residents report they have needed to access non-emergency medical care for themselves (39%) or a loved one (18%), while 52 per cent report they have not needed to access non-emergency medical care. Women are more likely to report they needed to access medical care for themselves (45%) than men (33%).
- British Columbia residents who needed medical care for themselves more often report they needed medical care for a new, non-emergency and non-COVID related health concerns or prescription renewals Just over one in two British Columbia residents who report needing medical care for themselves since March each report the care they needed was for a new, non-emergency and non-COVID related health concern (e.g. ear infection, skin condition, cold or flu symptoms or allergies)(53%) or prescription renewals (53%). Twenty-six per cent report needing care for questions or concerns regarding a chronic condition (e.g. diabetes, asthma, heart disease), followed by mental health concerns (e.g. anxiety, depression)(17%), and COVID or COVID related concerns (nine per cent).
- Over three in five British Columbia residents who needed medical care for themselves report they accessed care through a phone or video call with their family doctor Just over three in five British Columbia residents who report needing medical care for themselves since March report they accessed medical care by way of a phone or video call with their family doctor (61%), followed by in-person at their doctor's office (39%), a virtual care service (i.e. a video chat with a local doctor other than your family doctor)(14%), at a hospital emergency room (13%), Telehealth (13%), Medical Services Plan (MSP) covered virtual care service (12%), and at a walk-in clinic (11%). Six per cent report they chose not to access medical care during the pandemic.

Close to six in ten British Columbia residents report they have needed to access non-emergency medical care for themselves or a loved one since March of this year

One in three British Columbia residents report they have delayed getting medical care for themselves or a loved one because they were afraid of being exposed to COVID • British Columbia residents who needed to access medical care for a loved one more often report their loved one needed medical care for a new, non-emergency and non-COVID related health concerns – Close to three in five British Columbia residents who report needing medical care for a loved one since March each report the care their loved one needed was for a new, non-emergency and non-COVID related health concern (e.g. ear infection, skin condition, cold or flu symptoms or allergies)(58%), followed by prescription renewals (56%), questions or concerns regarding a chronic condition (e.g. diabetes, asthma, heart disease)(26%), followed by mental health concerns (e.g. anxiety, depression)(18%), and COVID or COVID related concerns (six per cent).

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- British Columbia residents who needed medical care for a loved one more often report their loved one accessed care through a phone or video call with their family doctor Just under three in five British Columbia residents who report needing medical care for a loved one since March report their loved one accessed medical care by way of a phone or video call with their family doctor (58%), followed by in-person at their doctor's office (43%), a hospital emergency room (24%), a Medical Services Plan (MSP) covered virtual care service offered by a third party (20%), Telehealth (14%), a virtual care service offered through employee health benefits (12%), and a walk-in clinic (five per cent).
- One in three British Columbia residents report they have delayed getting medical care for themselves or a loved one because they were afraid of being exposed to COVID Sixty-eight per cent of British Columbia residents report they have not delayed getting medical care for themselves or a loved one because they were afraid of being exposed to COVID-19 in a clinic or hospital, while 29 per cent report they delayed care for themselves, and five per cent report they delayed care for someone else. Two per cent are unsure/would prefer not to answer. Residents 18 to 34 are more likely report delaying getting medical care for themselves (38%) than residents 55 plus (19%).
- Two in three British Columbia residents who report delaying getting medical care due to COVID fears say they were concerned or somewhat concerned about their or their loved one's medical condition getting worse A majority of British Columbia residents who report they delayed getting medical for themselves or a loved one due to a fear of COVID exposure at a clinic or hospital say they were concerned (26%) or somewhat concerned (40%) about their or their loved one's condition getting worse because they delayed medical care or advice. Just over three in ten say they were somewhat not concerned (13%) or not concerned (18%), while three per cent are unsure/would prefer not to say.

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Virtual Care

- British Columbia residents more often say they would prefer to have medical appointments inperson even if given the option to consult with a doctor virtually – Asked how they would prefer to have medical appointments given the option to consult with a doctor virtually, either their family doctor of another healthcare provider, 42 per cent say they would prefer to have appointments inperson. Twenty-four per cent say they would prefer a video chat, followed by a phone call (18%), no preference (nine per cent), secure chat/text messaging (five per cent), and two per cent are unsure. Older residents (55 plus) are more likely to say they would prefer an in-person appointment (55%; 35-54: 37%; 18-34: 30%), while younger residents are more likely to say they prefer a video chat (18-34: 38%; 35-54: 26%; 55 plus: 13%).
- Two in three British Columbia residents who report making healthcare decisions for others say the use of virtual care would make it easier or somewhat easier in terms of helping their loved ones consult with a doctor A majority of British Columbia residents who report they make healthcare decisions for someone other than themselves say they think the use of virtual care would make it easier (23%) or somewhat easier (43%) when it comes to helping their loved ones consult with a doctor, while just over one in four think tis would make it somewhat more difficult (16%) or difficult (nine per cent). Four per cent say it makes no difference and four per cent say they don't know/would prefer not to say.
- British Columbia residents with a family doctor most often report their family doctor offers virtual consultations via a phone call Asked if their family doctor offers virtual consultations, just over one in two British Columbia residents with a family doctor report their doctor offers virtual consultations via a phone call (52%), followed by yes, via a video chat (17%), no, they do not offer virtual consultations (13%), and yes, via secure chat/text messaging (four per cent). Twenty-eight per cent say they don't know/would prefer not to answer.
- British Columbia residents without a family doctor most often report they do not use virtual care options British Columbia residents who report they do not have a family doctor (n=61) most often report they do not use virtual care (60%), followed by yes, through a Medical Services Plan (MSP) covered virtual care service offered by a third party (14%), yes, through Telehealth (eight per cent), and virtual care service offered through employee health benefits (four per cent). Fifteen per cent say they don't know/would prefer not to answer.

Just over six in ten British Columbia residents say they are comfortable or somewhat comfortable having a virtual consultation through a Medical Services Plan (MSP) covered service offered by a third party • Just over three in five British Columbia residents say they are comfortable or somewhat comfortable having a virtual consultation through a Medical Services Plan (MSP) covered service offered by a third party – A majority of British Columbia residents say they are comfortable (24%) or somewhat comfortable (39%) having a virtual consultation through a Medical Services Plan (MSP) covered service offered by a third party, while just under three in ten say they are somewhat not comfortable (18%) or not comfortable (10%). Eight per cent are unsure/would prefer not to answer.

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- Just over six in ten British Columbia residents who say they are somewhat uncomfortable or uncomfortable having a virtual consultation with a doctor cite they would prefer to see a doctor in person Asked why they are somewhat not comfortable or not comfortable with the idea of having a virtual consultation with a doctor through an MSP, British Columbia residents most often say they would prefer to see a doctor in person (61%), followed by they are worried they wouldn't be able to diagnose them without being seen in person (51%), they don't want to see a doctor they don't already have a relationship with (48%), they have security concerns (e.g. data privacy)(25%), they don't trust it (22%), they are not comfortable enough with technology (17%), and I don't believe in private healthcare (10%). Residents who report they needed access to medical care for themselves are more likely to say they would prefer in-person (67%) than those who report they did not need medical care (55%).
- Close to six in ten British Columbia residents somewhat disagree or disagree that they feel nervous or unprepared for virtual care appointments A majority of British Columbia residents somewhat disagree (25%) or disagree (31%) that they feel nervous or unprepared for virtual care appointments, while close to four in ten somewhat agree (26%) or agree (10%) with this. Seven per cent are unsure/ would prefer not to answer.
- Two in three British Columbia residents agree or somewhat agree they are interested in learning tips on how to use virtual care services A majority of British Columbia residents agree (29%) or somewhat agree (37%) that they are interested in learning tips on how to use virtual care services, while just over one in four somewhat disagree (12%) or disagree (15%). Eight per cent are unsure/ would prefer not to answer.

Nearly three in four British Columbia residents agree or somewhat agree they are concerned a second wave of COVID could impact their ability to access medical care • Close to three in four British Columbia residents agree or somewhat agree they are concerned a second wave of COVID could impact their ability to access medical care – A strong majority of British Columbia residents agree (32%) or somewhat agree (42%) that they are concerned that a second wave of COVID-19 would impact their ability to access medical care, while just under one in four somewhat disagree (14%) or disagree (10%). Two per cent are unsure/would prefer not to answer. Residents 18 to 34 are more likely to agree with this (45%) than older residents (35-54: 32%; 55 plus: 23%).

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
- British Columbia residents are more likely to agree or somewhat agree that they are likely to use a Medical Services Plan virtual care service even once the pandemic is over Over one in two British Columbia residents agree (21%) or somewhat agree (31%) that they are likely to use a Medical Services Plan (MSP) covered virtual care service offered by a third party even once the COVID-19 pandemic is over, while close to four in ten somewhat disagree (16%) or disagree (21%). Twelve per cent are unsure/would prefer not to answer. Residents 18 to 34 are more likely to agree with this (30%) than older residents (35-54:23%; 55 plus: 12%).
- British Columbia residents more often say they want to learn more about the scheduling, access and services aspect of virtual care – Asked what aspects of virtual care they would like to learn more about, residents of British Columbia more often say scheduling/access and types of services available (20%), followed by nothing (19%), how it all works/all aspects (not specified)(10%), the logistics (internet connection, platform required, etc.)(10%), and how assessments/diagnostics will work (eight per cent).

Nanos conducted a representative online survey of 503 residents of British Columbia, between July 8th to 11th, 2020 drawn from a non-probability panel. The results were statistically checked and weighted by age and gender using the latest Census information and the sample is geographically stratified to be representative of British Columbia.

The research was commissioned by TelusHealth and was conducted by Nanos Research.





Anxiety about being exposed to COVID-19 when visiting a clinic or hospital **TELUS** Health **NANOS**





Needed access to non-emergency medical care





Way of accessing medical care for themselves or a loved one








Delaying accessing medical help for themselves or a loved one due to COVID-19 **TELUS** Health **NANOS**





Preferred mode virtual of communication with a healthcare provider







Impact of virtual care on ease of consulting with a doctor



Current family doctor offering virtual **TELUS**[®] Health **NANOS** consultations



Reason for discomfort having a virtual consultation by gender and age









Concern for second wave of COVID-19 and access to medical care






Likeliness of using MSP-covered virtual **TELUS**[®] Health **NANOS** care service once pandemic is over




Nanos conducted a representative online survey of 503 residents of British Columbia between July 8th and 11th, 2020, drawn from a non-probability panel. The results were statistically checked and weighted by age and gender using the latest Census information and the sample is geographically stratified into three regions, the city of Vancouver, Interior B.C., and Suburban Vancouver/Shore/ Vancouver Island, to be representative of British Columbia.

The research was commissioned by TelusHealth and was conducted by Nanos Research.
