More than two thirds of Canadians think an election should be avoided until the pandemic has substantially passed or a vaccine is available

SUMMARY





Most Canadians say both the government and opposition parties should work to avoid a general election until after the COVID-19 pandemic is over or a vaccine is developed



In a study conducted ahead of Prime Minister Trudeau's testimony before the House of Commons Ethics Committee, a majority of Canadians say they agree or somewhat agree that both government and opposition parties should work to avoid a general election until the COVID-19 pandemic has substantially subsided or a vaccine is available. Most Canadians also think that Canadian charities should be more forthcoming and publicly accountable. With regards to the \$900 million contract awarded to WE, Canadians are most likely to say they want parliament to fully investigate the matter. Canadians are more likely to prefer a competitive process to sole sourcing in the award of such a contract.

- Canadians are most likely to say they want Parliament to fully investigate the WE contract award Asked what is closest to their opinion on the course that should be taken in response to the \$900 million contract that was sole sourced without competition to the WE organization to run a program to support students through the COVID-19 pandemic and was eventually cancelled after it became public knowledge that family members of Prime Minister Justin Trudeau received speaking fees from WE and that Finance Minister Bill Morneau recently repaid the cost of a family trip to Africa with the WE organization, 40 per cent of Canadians say they want Parliament to fully investigate the matter, 28 per cent say they want Parliament to focus on other more important matters, 16 per cent say they would like the Prime Minister to temporarily step down during the investigation and 13 per cent say this is how politics works and they are not surprised. Four per cent are unsure.
- Canadians are more likely to say a competitions is the better approach to awarding a \$900 million contract during COVID-19 Asked what is the better approach, 42 per cent of Canadians say that it is better to have a competition for the \$900 million contract and for students to wait for the financial assistance, while 34 per cent of Canadians say it is better to sole source the contract. Twenty-four per cent are unsure.
- Over two thirds of Canadians agree or somewhat agree that both government and opposition parties should work to avoid a general election More than two in three Canadians agree (51%) or somewhat agree (20%) that both government and opposition parties should do all they can to make the Minority Parliament work to avoid a general election until the COVID-19 pandemic has substantially passed or a vaccine is available, while over a quarter disagree (18%) or somewhat disagree (10%). Two per cent are unsure.

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SUMMARY





More than nine in ten Canadians say charities should be more transparent and accountable

• A majority of Canadians say charities need to be more forthcoming and publicly accountable – More than nine in ten Canadians agree (80%) or somewhat agree (16%) that Canadian charities need to be more forthcoming and publicly accountable about their organizational structure, real estate holdings and cash flow, while two per cent somewhat disagree and one per cent disagree. One per cent are unsure.








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Agreement with statements











Nanos conducted an RDD dual frame (land- and cell-lines) hybrid telephone and online random survey of 1,094 Canadians, 18 years of age or older, between July 26th and 30th, 2020 as part of an omnibus survey. Participants were randomly recruited by telephone using live agents and administered a survey online. The sample included both land- and cell-lines across Canada. The results were statistically checked and weighted by age and gender using the latest Census information and the sample is geographically stratified to be representative of Canada.

Individuals randomly called using random digit dialling with a maximum of five call backs.

The margin of error for this survey is ± 3.0 percentage points, 19 times out of 20.

This study was commissioned by CTV News and the research was conducted by Nanos Research.

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
