Consumer confidence continues to sputter marginally above neutral sentiment



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SUMMARY

After a noticeable positive climb in Canadian consumer confidence following a pandemic driven drop consumer sentiment continues to sputter marginally above 50 on the 100 point diffusion scale in the Bloomberg Nanos Canadian Confidence Index. Four week gains on real estate and job security were offset by declines in positive perceptions on the future strength of the Canadian economy.

The BNCCI, a composite of a weekly measure of financial health and economic expectations, registered at 53.12 compared with 52.81 four weeks ago. The twelve month high stands at 59.06.


Expectations Index, based on surveys for the outlook for the economy and real estate prices, was at 49.31 this week compared to 49.57 four weeks ago.

The average for the BNCCI since 2008 has been 56.07 with a low of 37.08 in April 2020 and a high of 62.92 in December 2009. The index has averaged 48.55 this year.

Bloomberg Nanos Canadian Confidence Index (Weekly Completed September 18, 2020)



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ONE YEAR TREND Bloomberg Nanos Canadian Pocketbook and Expectations Indices (Weekly Completed September 18, 2020)



METHODOLOGY





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METHODOLOGY



The BNCCI is produced by the Nanos Research Corporation, headquartered in Canada, which operates in Canada and the United States. The data is based on random interviews with 1,000 Canadian consumers (recruited by RDD land- and cell-line sample), using a four-week rolling average of 250 respondents each week, 18 years of age and over. The random sample of 1,000 respondents may be weighted using the latest census information for Canada. The interviews are compiled into a four-week rolling average of 1,000 interviews where each week, the oldest group of 250 interviews is dropped and a new group of 250 interviews is added. The views of 1,000 respondents are compiled into a diffusion index from 0 to 100. A score of 50 on the diffusion index indicates that positive and negative views are a wash while scores above 50 suggest net positive views, while those below 50 suggest net negative views in terms of the economic mood of Canadians.

A random survey of 1,000 respondents in Canada is accurate 3.1 percentage points, plus or minus, 19 times out of 20. This report is based on the four waves of tracking ending September 18, 2020. Readers should note that due to the Covid-19 outbreak and ESOMAR standards between April 3 and July 24, 2020 Nanos used its probability online panel. Data collection returned to telephone as of the week ending July 31, 2020.

The following questions are used for the index calculations:

- Thinking of your personal finances, are you better off, worse off, or has there been no change over the past year? (Overall Confidence Index and Pocketbook Sub-Index)
- Would you describe your job, at this time, as secure, somewhat secure, somewhat not secure, or not at all secure? (Overall Confidence Index and Pocketbook Sub-Index)
- In the next six months, do you think the Canadian economy will become stronger, weaker, or will there be no change? (Overall Confidence Index and Expectations Sub-Index)
- In the next six months, do you believe that the value of real estate in your neighbourhood will increase, stay the same or decrease? (Overall Confidence Index and Expectations Sub-Index)
