
A majority of Ottawa residents say the pandemic has had negative effects on their mental health; two thirds show support for a universal basic income program

These observations are based on a telephone survey of 801 Ottawa residents, 18 years or older, between September 10th and 20th, 2020. The margin of error for a random survey of 801 Ottawa residents is ±3.5 percentage points, 19 times out of 20.

Financial impact of Covid-19

While Ottawa residents are more likely to say the Covid-19 pandemic has had a negative impact rather than a positive impact on their personal finances, they are split on their concern of a potential negative impact of a second wave on their finances. Most Ottawa residents show some support for the creation of a universal basic income.

- Ottawa residents are nearly three times as likely to say the Covid-19 pandemic has had a negative impact than a positive impact on their personal finances Over one third of Ottawa residents report that the Covid-10 pandemic had a negative (18%) or somewhat negative (18%) impact on their personal finances, while over one in ten report a positive (six per cent) or somewhat positive (seven per cent) impact. Over one in two (52%) say it's had no impact.
- Those negatively impacted by the Covid-19 pandemic most frequently say it's because of lost income and/or employment Asked the reason for the impact of the Covid-19 pandemic on their personal finances, those who reported a negative impact were more likely to say it is because their income/work hours went down or they lost their job (51%), while those who say the pandemic has had a positive impact report that they are spending less (73%).
- Under two in ten Ottawa residents say the pandemic has increased or somewhat increased the risk of homelessness for those they care about Under two in ten Ottawa residents say the pandemic has increased (six per cent) or somewhat increased (11%) the risk of homelessness for those they care about, while eight in ten (81%) say the pandemic has not changed the risk of homelessness for those they care about, and under two in ten say it has increased (six per cent) or somewhat increased (11%) the risk of one per cent each say it has decreased or somewhat decreased it. One per cent are unsure.
- Under one in ten residents of Ottawa say the pandemic has increased or somewhat increased their personal risk of homelessness Under one in ten Ottawa residents report that the pandemic has increased (three per cent) or somewhat increased (three per cent) their risk of homelessness, while a strong majority of Ottawa residents (93%) say the pandemic has not changed their personal risk of homelessness, and one per cent say it has decreased it.

- Just over one in ten Ottawa residents report that themselves or someone in their household is receiving CERB – Six per cent of Ottawa residents report that they are receiving the Canada Emergency Response Benefit, and six per cent report that someone in their household is receiving the CERB. Just under nine in ten say no one in their household is receiving CERB.
- A majority of Ottawa residents who report that themselves or someone in their household receives CERB show concern that CERB benefits will stop in October — Out of those who report that themselves or someone in their household is receiving CERB, nearly three quarters say they are concerned (42%) or somewhat concerned (31%) that CERB benefits will stop in October, while one in four say they are not concerned (24%) or somewhat not concerned (one per cent). Two per cent are unsure.
- Ottawa residents are split on their level of concern about the possible negative impact of a second wave of Covid-19 on their finances Just over one in two Ottawa residents are concerned (20%) or somewhat concerned (30%) about the possible negative impact on your finances if there is a second wave of COVID-19, while just under one in two are not concerned (45%) or somewhat not concerned (four per cent). One per cent are unsure. Residents of Ottawa rural are more likely to report being concerned (27%) than residents of Ottawa South (17%). Older residents (52% of those 55 plus) are more likely to report not being concerned than younger residents (43% of those 18-34; 39% of those 35-54).
- Two thirds of Ottawa residents would support or somewhat support a universal basic income A majority of residents of Ottawa support (51%) or somewhat support (17%) the creation of a universal basic income based on the CERB or a similar program, while just over two in ten oppose (16%) or somewhat oppose (six per cent) this. Eleven per cent are unsure.
- Women and residents of Ottawa Central are more likely to support a universal basic income program Women (56%) are more likely than men (45%) to support a universal basic income program, and residents of Ottawa Central (59%) are more likely to support this than residents of Ottawa East (47%) and Ottawa West (48%).



Over six in ten residents say the pandemic has had a negative or somewhat negative impact on their mental health

• Those who support a universal basic income program most frequently say they do so because everyone has right to basic needs/income while those who oppose it are concerned about abuse and pushing people not to work — Asked the reason for their support or opposition to a universal basic income program, those who support it most frequently say everyone has right to basic needs (housing, food, water)/should have basic income (22%) and that it would help out a lot of people (22%), while those that oppose it most frequently say it might push people not to work/concerned about abuse (48%).

Mental health impact of Covid-19

A majority of residents of Ottawa say the Covid-19 pandemic has had some negative impact on their mental health with women and younger residents more frequently reporting so. Talking to someone they trust is most frequently mentioned as the method of dealing with mental health issues.

- A majority of Ottawa residents say the pandemic has had a negative or somewhat negative impact on their mental health Over six in ten Ottawa residents report that the Covid-19 pandemic has had a negative (17%) or somewhat negative (47%) impact on their mental health, while two per cent say it has had a positive impact and three per cent say it has had a somewhat positive impact. Just under one in three (31%) say it has had no impact on their mental health. One per cent are unsure.
- Women and younger residents are more likely to report a negative impact of the Covid-19 pandemic on their mental health Over seven in ten women report that the pandemic has had some negative impact on their mental health (19% negative, 52% somewhat negative), compared to over one in two men (15% negative, 41% somewhat negative). Over seven in ten Ottawa residents 18 to 34 years old report that the pandemic has had a negative (19%) or somewhat negative (53%) impact on their mental health, compared to just over six in ten residents 35-54 years old (18% negative, 44% somewhat negative) and under six in ten of those 55 plus (15% negative, 44% somewhat negative).



Close to two thirds of women report talking to someone they trust for mental health support during the pandemic

- Those who report a negative impact of the Covid-19 pandemic on their mental health most frequently say it's because of quarantine and isolation as well as mental health problems such as anxiety, stress and depression Ottawa residents who reported that the Covid-19 pandemic had a negative impact on their mental health most frequently say it's because of quarantine and feelings of isolation (28%) and mental health struggles (anxiety, stress, depression) (25%).
- Residents most frequently report talking to someone they trust for mental health support during the pandemic Asked if they have sought any support for mental health issues during the pandemic, over one in two (56%) say they talked to someone they trust, while under two in ten say they visited a website for information (17%) or visited a mental health professional/therapist/doctor (virtually or in person) (14%). Four in ten (41%) say they have not sought any of these support.
- Women and younger residents are more likely to report having talked to someone they trust for mental health support during the pandemic Nearly two in three women (65%) say they have talked to someone they trust for mental health support during the pandemic, compared to under one in two men (46%). Younger residents (63% of those 18-34; 62% of those 35-54) report talking to someone they trust for mental health support during the pandemic, compared to over four in ten (44%) residents over 55.
- Those who have not sought mental health support during the pandemic most frequently say it's because they did not need it/have no mental health issues Three quarters (74%) of Ottawa residents who did not seek out mental health support during the pandemic say it's because they did not need it or do not have mental health issues. Under one in ten each say it's not that serious/not at level where help is needed (seven per cent) and they deal with it by themselves (seven per cent).

Donation preferences


Close to one in five Ottawa residents report currently donating to the Ottawa Mission and one in two residents say that their donations to charitable organizations in Ottawa will remain the same in 2020 compared to 2019.

- Ottawa residents are most likely to rank the Ottawa Food Bank as the top organization that is having a positive impact in the community Asked to rank the top three organizations in Ottawa that are having a positive impact in the community when it comes to meeting the needs of vulnerable community members, Ottawa residents most frequently rank first the Ottawa Food Bank (29%), followed by the Children's Hospital of Eastern Ontario (13%), the Ottawa Hospital (12%) and the Ottawa Mission (eight per cent).
- Nearly one in five Ottawa residents report donating to the Ottawa Mission Asked which organizations they currently donate to, Ottawa residents most frequently mentioned the Ottawa Food Bank (40%), followed by CHEO (33%), the Salvation Army (21%), the Ottawa Heart Institute (19%), the Ottawa Mission (17%), and the Ottawa Hospital (16%). Nearly one in four (24%) say they do not currently donate to any charities.
- Ottawa residents most frequently report that their donations to charitable organizations in Ottawa will remain the same in 2020 as in 2019 Just over one in two Ottawa residents (53%) report that their donations to charitable organizations in Ottawa are the same in 2020 as they were in 2019, while just over one in four (26%) report they will be larger in 2020 than in 2019, and over two in ten (22%) report they will be lower.
- Women and residents of rural Ottawa are more likely to report that their donations to charitable organizations in Ottawa will be lower in 2020 than in 2019 Resident of rural Ottawa (34%) are more likely to report that their donations to charitable organizations in Ottawa will be lower in 2020 than in 2019 than residents of Ottawa overall (22%), and women (26%) are more likely than men (17%) to report that their donations to charitable organizations in Ottawa will be lower in 2020 than in 2019.





Change in risk of homelessness during the pandemic











Concern for finances due to Covid-19






QUESTION – Are you concerned, somewhat concerned, somewhat not concerned or not concerned about the following?



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Concern about negative impact on finances if there is a second wave of Covid-19

















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METHODOLOGY



Nanos conducted an RDD dual frame (land- and cell-lines) random telephone survey of 801 Ottawa residents, 18 years of age or older, between September 10th and 20th, 2020. Participants were randomly recruited by telephone using live agents and administered a survey. The results were statistically checked and weighted by age and gender using the latest Census information and the sample is geographically stratified to be representative of Ottawa. Individuals were randomly called using random digit dialling with a maximum of five call backs.

The margin of error for this survey is ± 3.5 percentage points, 19 times out of 20.
