Girls in Canada: Gender Equality Today

Plan International Canada asks Canadian girls how they feel about the current state of gender equality and the impact of movements like #MeToo.

Methodology

Nanos conducted an online survey of 1,002 Canadian girls, between 14 and 24 years of age, between August 30th and September 14th, 2018. Participants were randomly administered a survey online. The results were statistically checked and weighted by age and gender using the latest Census information and the sample is geographically stratified to be representative of Canada.

No margin of error applies to this research.

The research was commissioned by Plan International Canada and was conducted by Nanos Research.

More than seven in ten Canadian girls feel they face gender-based discrimination Two in three Canadian girls report having a friend who has been sexually harassed and a little under two in ten say they feel completely safe in public spaces. Seven in ten say they have experienced gender discrimination, although more than one in two Canadian girls report feeling equal to their male counterparts and having the same opportunities to lead because of their gender. However of note, approximately one in three say they feel less equal and have less opportunities to lead. A majority of Canadian girls at least occasionally feel pressure to change how they act, watch their weight or keep their opinions to themselves in a group. Over six in ten Canadian girls identify or somewhat identify with the feminist movement, while one in four somewhat do not or do not identify. A majority say they are hopeful or somewhat hopeful about the future of gender equality in Canada and globally, although girls are divided over whether they trust political leaders to advance issues of gender equality.

Girls between 18 and 24 years old tend to report lower levels of perceived gender equality, higher levels of perceived discrimination and identify more with the feminist movement compared to girls under 18 years of age who tend to report higher levels of perceived gender equality, lower levels of perceived discrimination and identify less with the feminist movement.

Three in four Canadian girls report experiencing gender-based discrimination; two in three have a female friend who has been sexually harassed

A majority of Canadian girls report they feel discriminated against because of their gender. Two in three Canadian girls report having a female friend who experienced sexual harassment, with one in three who say they have not. Only 16 per cent report feeling completely safe in public spaces.

• Canadian girls are split on whether they feel discriminated against – Just over a third of Canadian girls report feeling discriminated against because of their gender occasionally (35%) or rarely (35%) respectively, while 22 per cent say never and six per cent say regularly. Three per cent are unsure.







72 per cent of Canadian girls between 18 to 24 years old have a female friend who has experienced sexual harassment

- Canadian girls are more likely to report experiencing gender discrimination at school Asked, where in their life, if at all, they have experienced discrimination because of their gender, 27 per cent of Canadian girls say at school, followed by 18 per cent at work, 14 per cent with family or friends, respectively, and eight per cent at home. Eighteen per cent say they have not experienced gender based discrimination.
- Two thirds of Canadian girls report having a female friend who has experienced sexual harassment Sixty-seven per cent of Canadians girls report having a female friend who experienced sexual harassment, while 34 per cent say they do not have one. More than seven in ten (72%) Canadian girls age 18 to 24 report having a friend who has experienced sexual harassment.
- Nearly seven in ten Canadian girls report feeling safe or somewhat safe in public spaces A majority of Canadian girls report feeling safe (16%) or somewhat safe (53%) in public spaces, while 24 per cent say somewhat not safe and five per cent not at all safe. Three per cent are unsure. Two in three Canadian girls 18 to 24 years old report they feel safe (12%) or somewhat safe (53%) in public spaces, while 27 per cent feel somewhat not safe and five per cent feel not at all safe.

Almost one in three Canadian girls report feeling less than equal to their male counterparts

Nearly six in ten Canadian girls feel equal to, and as respected, as their male counterparts, while one in three feel less than equal. More than half of Canadian girls say they feel as encouraged as others to take an interest in STEM, while two in ten feel less encouraged to do so. Less than half of girls feel their ideas are taken as seriously as others because of their gender and just over one in three feel their ideas are taken less seriously.

• Nearly one in three Canadian girls feel less than equal to their male counterparts – Asked whether they feel more than equal, equal or less than equal to their male counterparts, 58 per cent of Canadian girls say equal, 28 per cent say less than equal and six per cent say more than equal. Eight per cent are unsure. Fifty-four per cent of girls 18-24 years old say they feel equal, while 32 per cent feel less than equal.







Nearly one in three Canadian girls age 18 to 24 years old feel they are treated less equally than their male counterparts

- Canadian girls frequently say gender equality means being treated equally/having equal
 opportunities and rights Asked what gender equality means to them, 60 per cent of
 Canadian girls say being treated equally/having equal opportunities and rights, followed by
 eight per cent who say no gender discrimination and five per cent saying equal pay. Nine per
 cent are unsure.
- Just over half of Canadian girls report they are as encouraged as others to take an interest in STEM Fifty-four per cent of Canadian girls report that because of their gender, they are as encouraged as others to take an interest in science, technology, engineering and math, while 20 per cent feel less encouraged and 16 per cent feel more encouraged. Ten per cent are unsure. Among girls 18 to 24, 46 per cent feel as encouraged to take in interest in STEM fields and 26 per cent feel less encouraged.
- More than half of Canadian girls feel as respected by others More than half (57%) of
 Canadian girls feel as respected by others because of their gender, while 28 per cent say less
 respected and seven per cent say more respected. Eight per cent are unsure. Among girls
 between 18 and 24 years old, 48 per cent feel as respected and 36 per cent feel less
 respected because of their gender.
- Half of Canadian girls feel they have the same opportunities to lead as others Fifty per
 cent of Canadian girls report having the same opportunities to lead as others because of
 their gender, while 34 per cent say they have less opportunities and seven per cent say they
 have more opportunities. Nine per cent are unsure. Forty-six per cent of girls 18 to 24 feel
 they have the same opportunities to lead as others, while 38 per cent feel they have less
 opportunities.
- Less than half of Canadian girls say their ideas are taken as seriously as others Forty-nine per cent of Canadian girls say their ideas are taken as seriously as others because of their gender, while just over a third (36%) say they are taken less seriously and six per cent say more seriously. Forty-two per cent of girls between 18 and 24 feel their ideas are taken less seriously because of their gender, while 41 per cent feel they are taken as seriously.







Most Canadian girls feel some pressure to change how they act to be more liked, to watch their weight, and to keep their opinions to themselves in a group conversation More than two in three Canadian girls say the #MeToo movement has made them hopeful or somewhat hopeful about the future of gender equality

More than six in ten Canadian girls identify or somewhat identify with the feminist movement, and have hope for the progress of gender equality in Canada and globally. However, despite their hopefulness for the progress of gender equality in Canada and globally, Canadian girls are divided over whether they trust today's political leaders to advance gender equality issues.

- Over two in three Canadian girls say #MeToo has made them hopeful or somewhat hopeful about gender equality More than two in three Canadian girls say the #MeToo movement has made them hopeful (28%) or somewhat hopeful (40%) about gender equality in the future, while six per cent say somewhat not hopeful and five per cent not hopeful. Twenty per cent are unsure.
- Canadian girls most frequently say #MeToo means support for victims of sexual
 harassment Asked what the #MeToo movement mean to them, 30 per cent of Canadian
 girls say support for victims of sexual harassment, raising awareness to end sexual
 harassment, ending stigmas, followed by 13 per cent who say gender equality, inclusion and
 rights and seven per cent who say it is important and it means a lot. Nineteen per cent say
 they are unsure.
- More than eight in ten Canadian girls say they are hopeful or somewhat hopeful about the progress of gender equality in Canada Over four in five Canadian girls say they are hopeful (38%) or somewhat hopeful (45%) about the progress of gender equality in Canada, while one in ten say they are somewhat not hopeful (eight per cent) or not hopeful (three per cent). Five per cent are unsure.







- Nearly seven in ten Canadian girls say they are hopeful or somewhat hopeful about the progress of gender equality globally More than two thirds of Canadian girls say they are hopeful (22%) or somewhat hopeful (45%) about the progress of gender equality globally, while a quarter say they are somewhat not hopeful (19%) or not hopeful (eight per cent). Five per cent are unsure.
- Most frequently, Canadian girls say feminism means gender equality A third (34%) of Canadian girls say that, to them, feminism means gender equality, followed by 15 per cent who say women's rights/equal respect and opportunities and nine per cent who say women wanting more than men/man bashing. Fifteen per cent are unsure.
- A majority of Canadian girls identify or somewhat identify with the feminist movement Six in ten Canadian girls identify (25%) or somewhat identify (36%) with the feminist movement, while 11 per cent say somewhat do not identify and 13 per cent do not identify. Fourteen per cent are unsure. Girls 18 to 24 years old reported the strongest intensity of identification with the feminist movement (31% identify; 37% somewhat identify).
- Canadian girls are split on whether they trust today's leader to advance gender equality Approximately four in five Canadian girls trust (eight per cent) or somewhat trust (33%) today's political leaders to advance gender equality issues, while four in ten somewhat do not trust (23%) or do not trust them (21%). Fifteen per cent are unsure.

Canadian girls feel empowered to make decisions about various aspects of their lives, but feel the least empowered to share their ideas in public

Generally Canadian girls feel empowered or somewhat empowered about numerous aspects of their lives, especially making decisions about their sexuality, their career and their romantic relationships, while around two in ten say they feel somewhat not or not empowered to make these decisions.

• Four fifths of Canadian girls report feeling empowered or somewhat empowered when making decisions about their sexuality – Eight in ten Canadian girls report feeling empowered (52%) or somewhat empowered (28%) when making decisions about their sexuality, while 10 per cent say somewhat not empowered and four per cent say not empowered. Six per cent are unsure.

Only 16 per cent of Canadian girls feel completely safe in public places







Over two in three Canadian girls say #MeToo has made them hopeful or somewhat hopeful about gender equality

- Four fifths of Canadian girls report feeling empowered or somewhat empowered when making decisions about their career Just over eight in ten Canadian girls report feeling empowered (44%) or somewhat empowered (37%) when making their own decisions about their career, while 11 per cent say somewhat not empowered and three per cent say not empowered. Four per cent are unsure.
- Nearly four fifths of Canadian girls report feeling empowered or somewhat empowered when making decisions about their finances Just under eight in ten Canadian girls report feeling empowered (38%) or somewhat empowered (39%) when making decisions about their financial independence, while 14 per cent say somewhat not empowered and four per cent say not empowered. Five per cent are unsure.
- Just over three quarters of Canadian girls report feeling empowered or somewhat empowered when making decisions about their romantic relationships Over three in four Canadian girls report feeling empowered (44%) or somewhat empowered (33%) when making decisions about their romantic relationships, while 13 per cent say somewhat not empowered and four per cent say not empowered. Seven per cent are unsure.
- Nearly two thirds of Canadian girls report feeling empowered or somewhat empowered when sharing opinions in public Just under two in three Canadian girls report feeling empowered (27%) or somewhat empowered (38%) when sharing their opinions or making their voice heard in public, while 23 per cent say somewhat not empowered and six per cent say not empowered. Six per cent are unsure.







One in three Canadian girls feel they have fewer opportunities to lead than others because of their gender, half say they have the same opportunities

Majority of Canadian girls report they feel some level of pressure to change how they act to be more liked, watch their weight, or keep their opinions to themselves

Most Canadian girls report feeling at least occasional pressure to watch their weight, change how they act to be more liked, and to keep their opinions to themselves in a group, and are most likely to say they face pressure to have a successful career.

- Over seven in ten Canadian girls report that they at least occasionally feel pressure to change how they act to be more liked Forty-five per cent of Canadian girls say they occasionally feel pressure to change how they act to be more liked, while 27 per cent say they regularly feel pressure and 24 per cent say they never feel pressure. Four per cent are unsure. More than seven in ten 18 to 24 year-olds say they feel such pressure (30% regularly, 43% occasionally).
- Over seven in ten Canadian girls report that they at least occasionally feel pressure to watch their weight to be more liked Thirty-nine per cent of Canadian girls say they occasionally feel pressure to change how they act to be more liked, while 32 per cent say they regularly feel pressure and 27 per cent say they never feel pressure. Three per cent are unsure. Nearly three in four girls between 18 and 24 years old report feeling regularly (37%) or occasionally (37%) feeling pressure to watch their weight.
- More than half of Canadian girls report that they at least occasionally feel pressure to
 get lots of likes on social media Thirty-six per cent of Canadian girls say they
 occasionally feel pressure to get lots of likes on social media, while 21 per cent say they
 regularly feel pressure and 39 per cent say they never feel pressure. Four per cent are
 unsure.







Over one in two Canadian girls feel they are as respected as others because of their gender, but nearly three in ten girls feel they are less respected than others

- Seven in ten Canadian girls report that they at least occasionally feel pressure to keep opinions to themselves in a group Fifty per cent of Canadian girls say they occasionally feel pressure to keep their opinions to themselves in a group conversation, while 20 per cent say they regularly feel pressure and 27 per cent say they never feel pressure. Three per cent are unsure. Almost three in four girls 18 to 24 years old report they regularly (24%) or occasionally (50%) feel pressure to keep their opinions to themselves in a group conversation.
- Canadian girls are most likely to feel pressure to have a successful career Almost two fifths (37%) of Canadian girls say they feel pressure to have a successful career, followed by 30 per cent who report pressure to do all, namely get married, have kids and have a successful career. Eight per cent report pressure to get married or have kids, respectively. Sixteen per cent said the question does not apply to them.

These observations are based an online survey of 1,002 Canadian girls, between 14 and 24 years of age, between August 30th and September 14th, 2018. Participants were randomly administered a survey online. The results were statistically checked and weighted by age and gender using the latest Census information and the sample is geographically stratified to be representative of Canada. No margin of error applies to this research.








Level of pressure to do certain things










Pressure to watch weight to be more liked
















Encouragement to take interest in STEM fields


















Empowerment to make decisions about romantic relationships



Empowerment to share opinions


















Hope for progress of gender equality in Canada












Identification with the feminist movement
