New Brunswickers say the Green Party cooperating with the Liberals to govern would be more acceptable than other potential party coalitions

## Summary

Over half of New Brunswickers say it would be acceptable or somewhat acceptable for the Green Party to cooperate with the Liberals in order to govern In terms of potential coalitions between parties in order to govern, New Brunswickers had the highest intensity of acceptability to the Green Party cooperating with the Liberals and the Green Party cooperating with the Progressive Conservatives, and have a lower intensity for cooperation between the People's Alliance and the Liberals.

- Views on the Green Party cooperating with the Liberals to govern Over one in two New Brunswickers say it would be acceptable (30%) or somewhat acceptable (22%) for the Green Party to cooperate with the Liberals in order to govern, while more than one in four say this would be somewhat unacceptable (10%) or unacceptable (17%) to them. Twenty-one per cent are unsure.
- Views on the Green Party cooperating with the Progressive Conservatives to govern Nearly half of New Brunswickers say it would be acceptable (23%) or somewhat acceptable (25%) for the Green Party to cooperate with the Progressive Conservatives in order to govern, while nearly three in ten say this would be somewhat unacceptable (14%) or unacceptable (14%) to them. Twenty-four per cent are unsure.
- Views on the People's Alliance cooperating with the Liberals to govern More than four in ten New Brunswickers say it would be unacceptable (30%) or somewhat unacceptable (13%) for the People's Alliance to cooperate with the Liberals in order to govern, while more than one in three say this would be somewhat acceptable (16%) or acceptable (18%) to them. Twenty-two per cent are unsure.
- Views on the People's Alliance cooperating with the Progressive Conservatives to govern More
  than four in ten New Brunswickers say it would be acceptable (24%) or somewhat acceptable (17%)
  for the People's Alliance to cooperate with the Progressive Conservatives in order to govern, while
  one in three say this would be somewhat unacceptable (11%) or unacceptable (22%) to them.
  Twenty-six per cent are unsure.


Nanos conducted an online survey of 501 New Brunswick voters, 18 years of age or older, between October 5<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup>, 2018. Respondents were randomly selected from a non-probability online panel. The results were weighted to the true population proportion to be representative of the New Brunswick population.




The Green Party cooperating with the Liberals to govern


The Green Party cooperating with the Progressive Conservatives to govern


