#### Majority of Canadians agree that schools should play a role in educating youth about using cannabis; top concerns about the legalization of cannabis are people driving/working under the influence and negative effects on youth

### **Summary**

74 per cent of Canadians agree that they would feel comfortable speaking to their doctor about cannabis



A majority of Canadians say they are knowledgeable or somewhat knowledgeable about the health effects of cannabis and agree they would feel comfortable speaking to their doctor about it. The top concern for Canadians about the legalization of cannabis is people driving/working while impaired followed by negative effects on youth. A majority of Canadians also say they are confident or somewhat confident that they know its effects on driving but are somewhat not confident or not confident that police have the tools they need to detect cannabis/marijuana-impaired driving. Over four in five Canadians say schools should play a role in educating youth about using cannabis.

- Canadians most frequently mention people driving/working while impaired as their top concern about the legalization of cannabis/marijuana – When asked what concerns them the most about the legalization of cannabis/marijuana, one in five Canadians (20%) say people driving/working while impaired is what concerns them the most, followed by negative effects on youth (easier access, affecting their developing brain) (17%), exposure to second hand smoke/odour (nine per cent), having proper regulations/even regulations across the country (seven per cent) and the negative health effects of cannabis (six per cent). Nine per cent say they have no concerns with the legalization of cannabis/marijuana and three per cent are unsure.
- Majority of Canadians say they are knowledgeable or somewhat knowledgeable about the health effects of cannabis Over eight in ten Canadians say they are knowledgeable (27%) or somewhat knowledgeable (57%) about the health effects of cannabis/marijuana, while over one in ten say they are not knowledgeable (five per cent) or somewhat not knowledgeable (10%) about the health effects. One per cent are unsure.
- Close to nine in ten Canadians agree or somewhat agree schools should play a role in educating youth about using cannabis – A majority of Canadians agree (67%) or somewhat agree (22%) that schools should play a role in educating youth about using cannabis/marijuana, while one in ten disagree (six per cent) or somewhat disagree (four per cent) with this. One per cent are unsure.

#### **Summary**

62% of Canadians say they will not consume cannabis products once it is legal.

- Just over nine in ten Canadians agree or somewhat agree they would feel comfortable speaking with their doctor about cannabis Over nine in ten Canadians say they agree (74%) or somewhat agree (17%) that they would be comfortable speaking with their doctor or other health care providers about cannabis/marijuana, while less than one in ten disagree (four per cent) or somewhat disagree (three per cent) with this. Two per cent are unsure.
- A comfortable majority of Canadians say they are confident or somewhat confident that they know the effects of cannabis on driving Over eight in ten Canadians say that they are confident (52%) or somewhat confident (29%) that they know the effects of cannabis/marijuana consumption while driving, while close to two in ten say they are not confident (10%) or somewhat not confident (six per cent). Three per cent are unsure.
- Canadians most frequently say their workplace has a substance use policy When asked if their workplace has a substance use policy, over four in ten (42%) Canadians say their workplace has a substance use policy while just over two in ten (21%) say it does not. Close to four in ten (37%) are unsure.
- Close to six in ten Canadians report they have tried cannabis/marijuana Asked if they have ever used cannabis/marijuana in any form, close to six in ten Canadians report they have tried it (47%), tried it but didn't inhale (two per cent), use it occasionally (seven per cent) or use it frequently (three per cent). Four in ten Canadians (40%) report they have never used it and two per cent say they have never used it but they are considering it when it's legal.

#### **Summary**

70% of Canadians are somewhat not confident or not confident that the police have the tools they need to detect cannabis/marijuanaimpaired driving.



- A majority of Canadians say they will not consume cannabis/marijuana products once it is legal – Asked what best describes their personal consumption of cannabis/ marijuana, if at all, once it is legalized, just over six in ten Canadians (62%) say they will not consume cannabis/marijuana products once it is legalized, while 15 per cent say they are more likely to eat or drink cannabis/marijuana-based products. Nine per cent say they are equally likely to smoke, eat, or drink cannabis/marijuana-based products, and five per cent are more likely to smoke cannabis/marijuana. Nine per cent are unsure.
- A majority of Canadians are somewhat not confident or not confident that police
  have the tools they need to detect cannabis/marijuana-impaired driving Seven in
  ten Canadians say they are not confident (41%) or somewhat not confident (29%)
  that police have the tools they need to detect cannabis/marijuana-impaired driving,
  while over one in four say they are confident (seven per cent) or somewhat confident
  (20%) about this. Four per cent are unsure.

These observations are based on a hybrid telephone and online random survey of 1,000 Canadians, 18 years of age or older, between September 29<sup>th</sup> and October 4<sup>th</sup>, 2018 as part of an omnibus survey. Participants were randomly recruited by telephone using live agents and administered a survey online.

This study was commissioned by the Canadian Centre on Substance Use and Addiction and the research was conducted by Nanos Research.




### Knowledge on health effects of cannabis




# Comfort level talking about cannabis and support for cannabis education in schools




# Opinions on schools educating youth about using cannabis




#### Level of comfort talking to doctors about cannabis



## Methodology

Nanos conducted an RDD dual frame (land- and cell-lines) hybrid telephone and online random survey of 1,000 Canadians, 18 years of age or older, between September 29<sup>th</sup> and October 4<sup>th</sup>, 2018 as part of an omnibus survey. Participants were randomly recruited by telephone using live agents and administered a survey online. The results were statistically checked and weighted by age and gender using the latest Census information and the sample is geographically stratified to be representative of Canada.

Individuals were randomly called using random digit dialling with a maximum of five call backs.

The margin of error for a random survey of 1,000 Canadians is  $\pm 3.1$  percentage points, 19 times out of 20.

The research was commissioned by the Canadian Centre on Substance Use and Addiction and was conducted by Nanos Research.
