

Climate ambition steady: Urgency to act now trending up.

Key Findings

1

Climate Ambition

The number of Canadians likely to say now is the best time for Canada to be ambitious in addressing climate change remains consistent (49%) following a slight increase from June to November 2020.

2

Climate Urgency

Canadians increasingly say we need to act now, climate change can't wait (39%) as their reason for why now is the best time for Canada to be ambitious in addressing climate change (increasing from 31% in November and 21% in June).

3

Information Sources

Canadians place the highest level of trust in peer-reviewed science and researchers (7.7) and the lowest level of trust in social media (2.2) when it comes to information on the topic of climate change.

4

Gender Differences on Trust

Women place higher trust in environmental organizations (6.4) than men (5.2). The same is true for social media (women: 2.5; men: 1.9), but both score low on trust for information on climate change.

Key Findings – By party support

1

Climate Ambition

Canadians who usually vote NDP are most likely to say now is the best time for Canada to be ambitious in addressing climate change (7.8), followed by those who usually vote Liberal (7.1). Those who usually vote Conservative are least likely to say this (2.7).

2

Information Sources

Both Canadians who usually vote Liberal and NDP, as well as those who usually vote Conservative place the highest trust in peer-reviewed science and researchers (8.4; 8.8; and 6.2 respectively) for information on climate change.

3

Information Sources

Canadians who usually vote Conservative place the lowest trust in social media (1.6) followed by politicians (2.3) and environmental organizations (3.2) for information on climate change.

4

Information Sources

Canadians who usually vote Liberal place the lowest trust in social media (2.4) followed by industry (mean of 4.0) and politicians (4.3) for information on climate change.

Key Findings – By political ideology

1

Climate Ambition

Left leaning Canadians (8.1) are more than two times more likely to say now is a good time for Canada to be ambitious in addressing climate change compared to right leaning Canadians (3.5).

2

Information Sources

Left leaning Canadians place higher trust in traditional news media (6.3) compared to right leaning Canadians (3.9) for information on climate change.

Information Sources

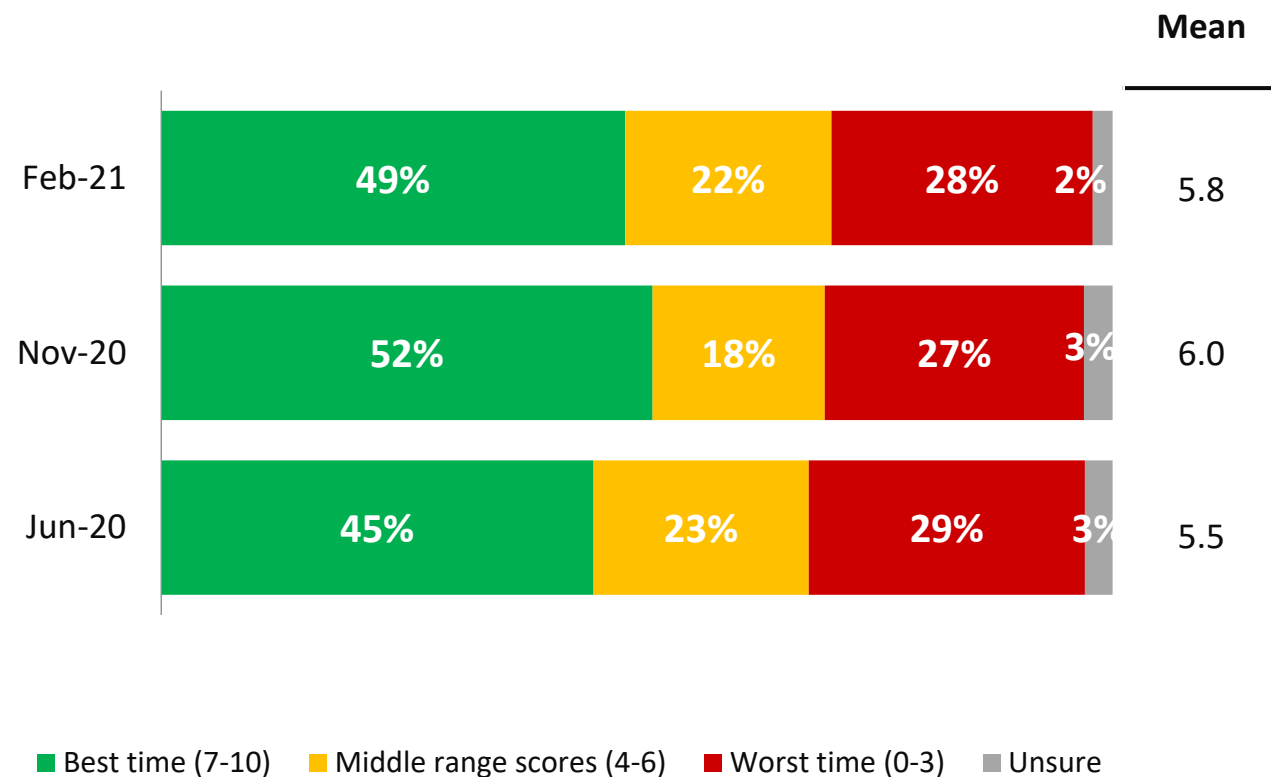
Left leaning Canadians place more trust in Government agencies (mean of 6.4) and politicians (4.3) for information on climate change compared to right leaning Canadians (3.8 and 2.6 respectively).

4

Information Sources

Politically right leaning Canadians are more likely to trust industry (4.3) for information on climate change than the national average (mean of 3.8) or those who are politically left-leaning (3.1).

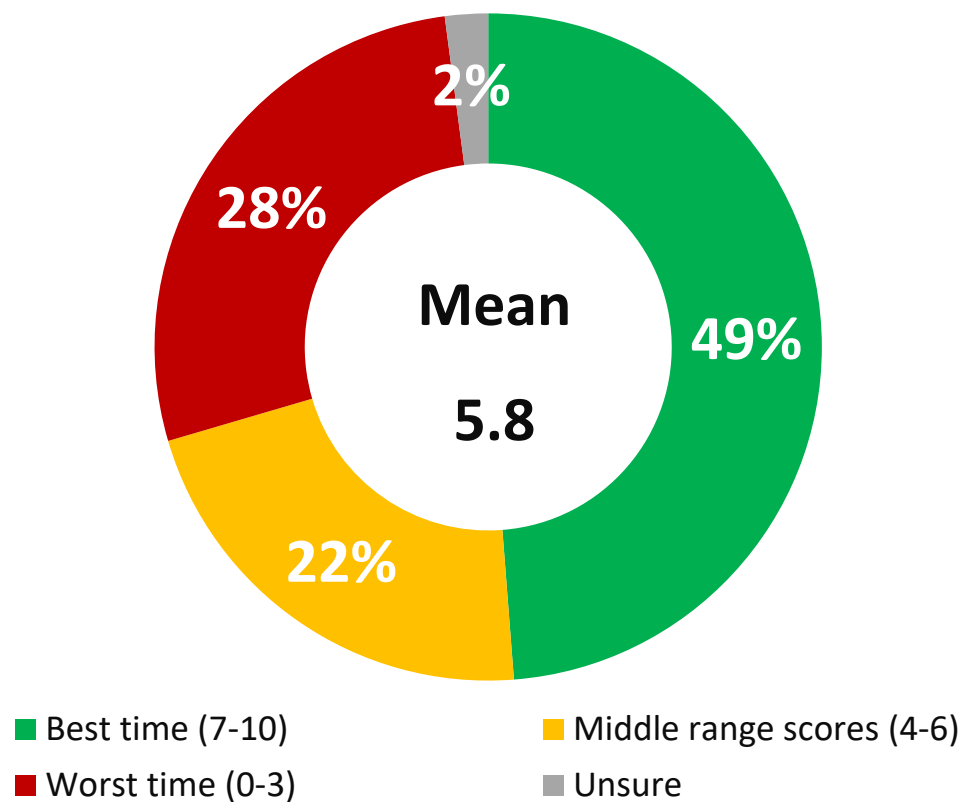
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The number of Canadians likely to say now is the best time for Canada to be ambitious in addressing climate change remains consistent after a slight increase from June to November 2020.

Women are more likely to say now is a good time (mean of 6.1) compared to men (mean of 5.5), and residents of British Columbia are more likely to say this (mean of 6.3) than residents of the Prairies (mean of 4.4).

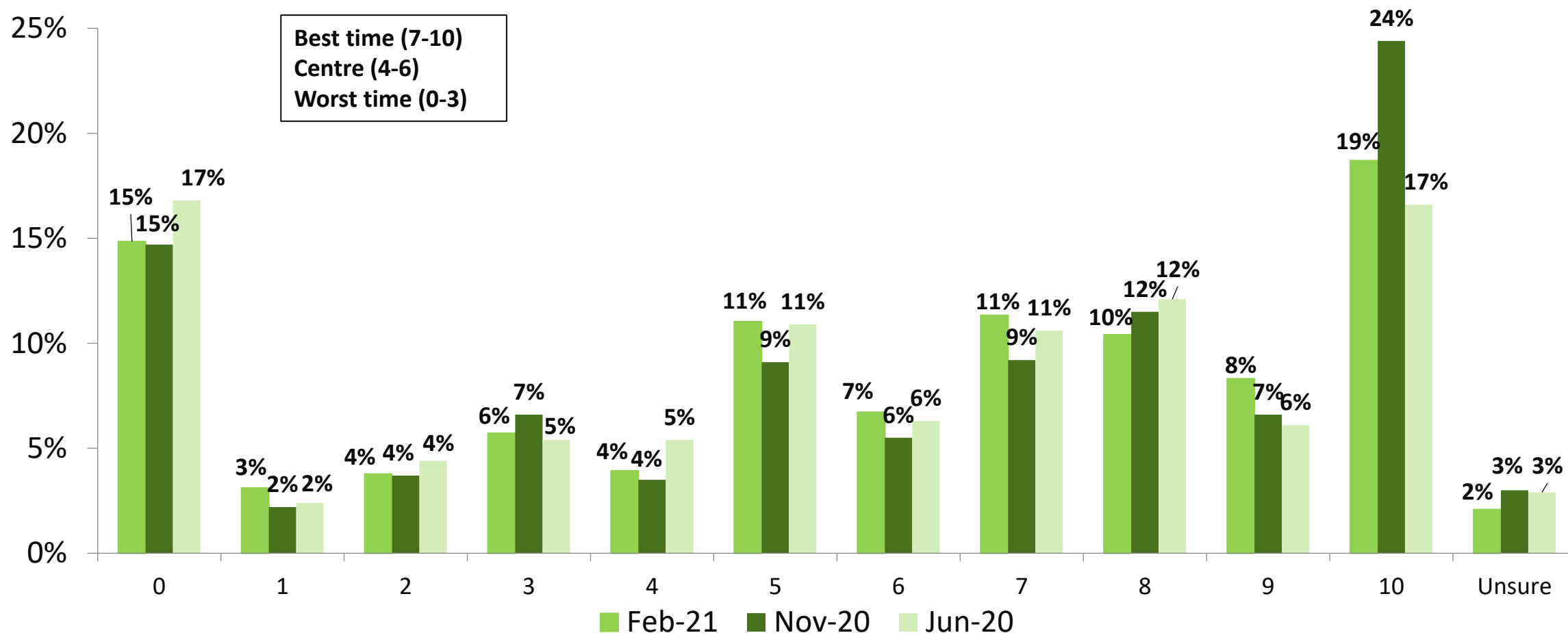

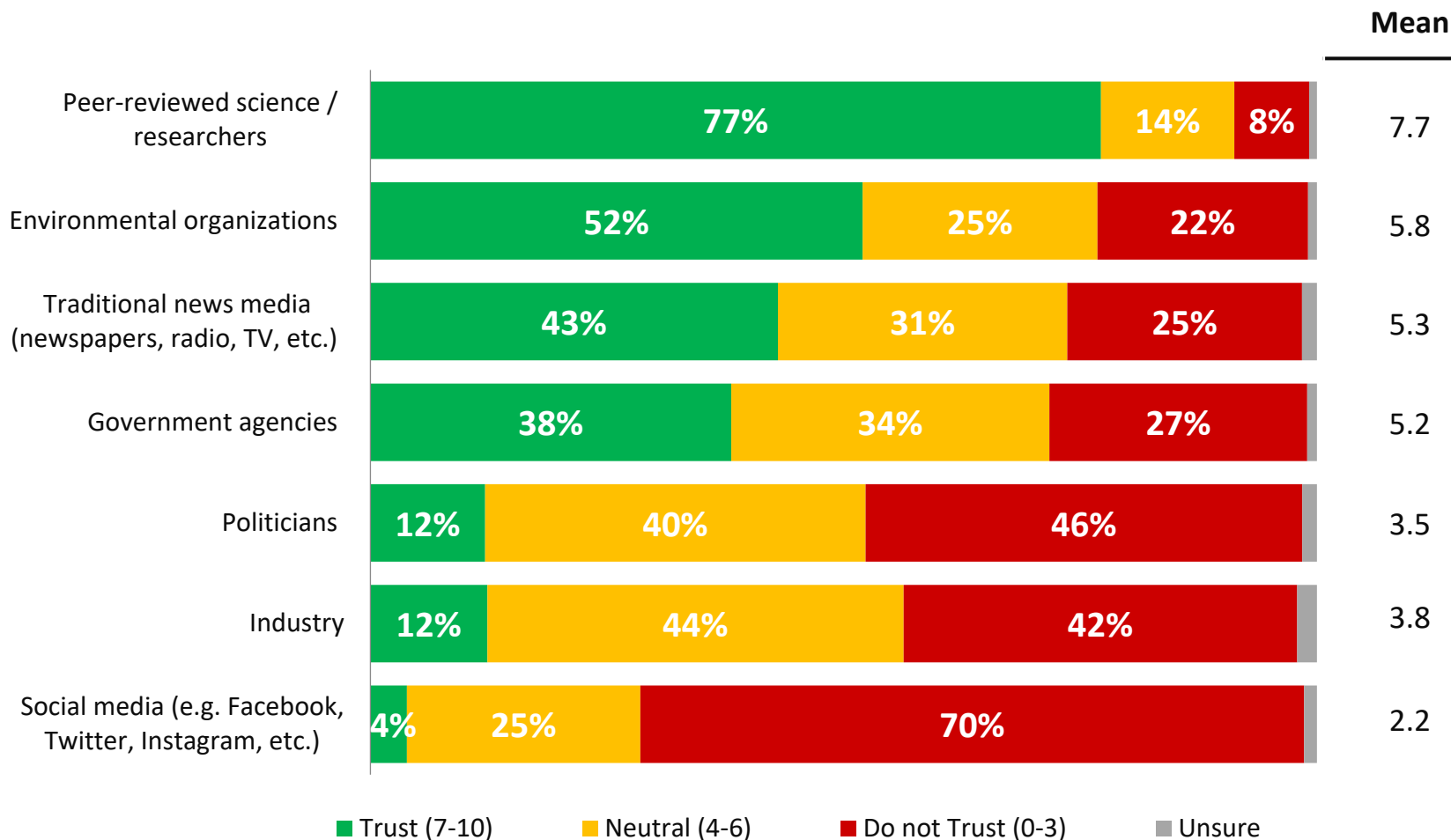

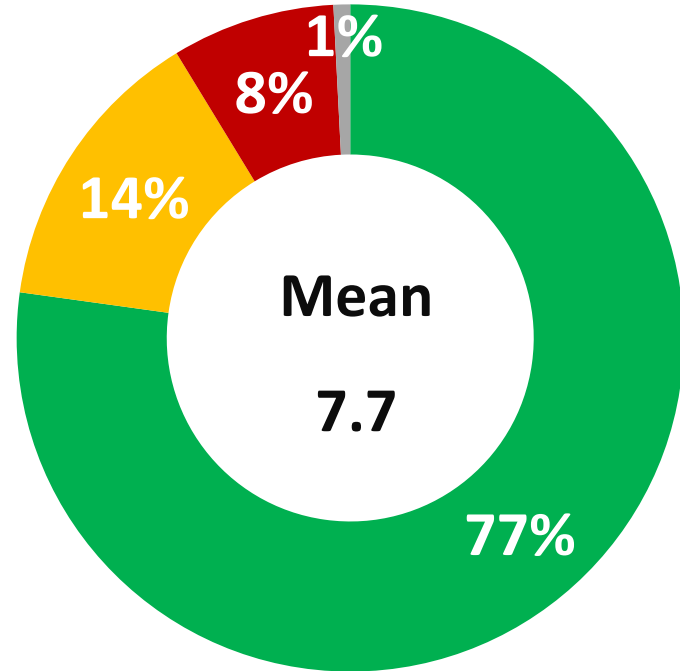

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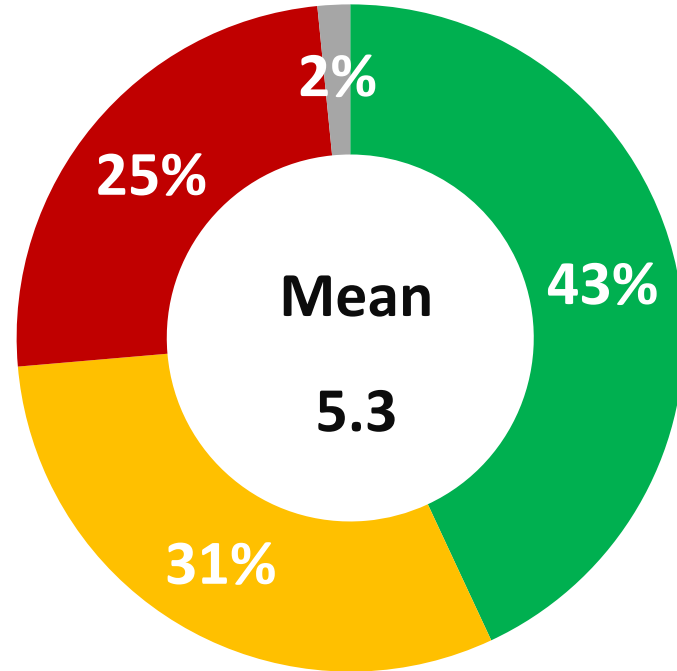

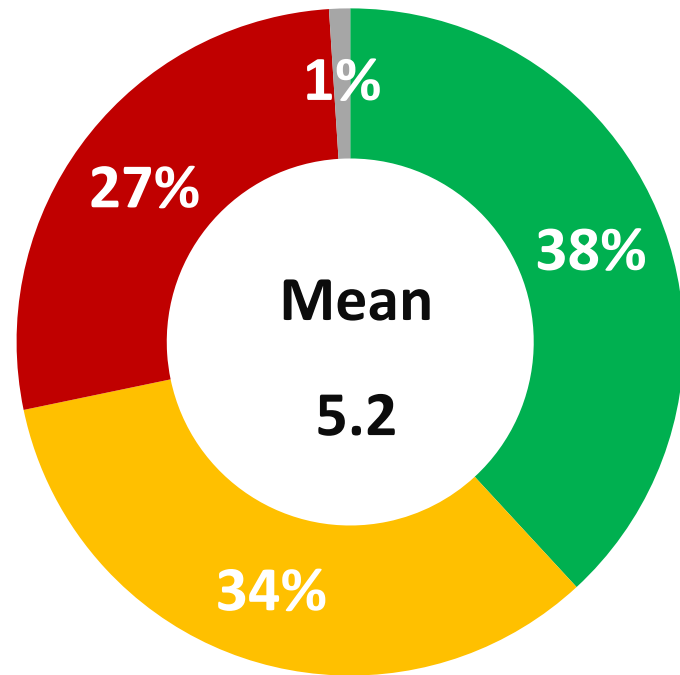

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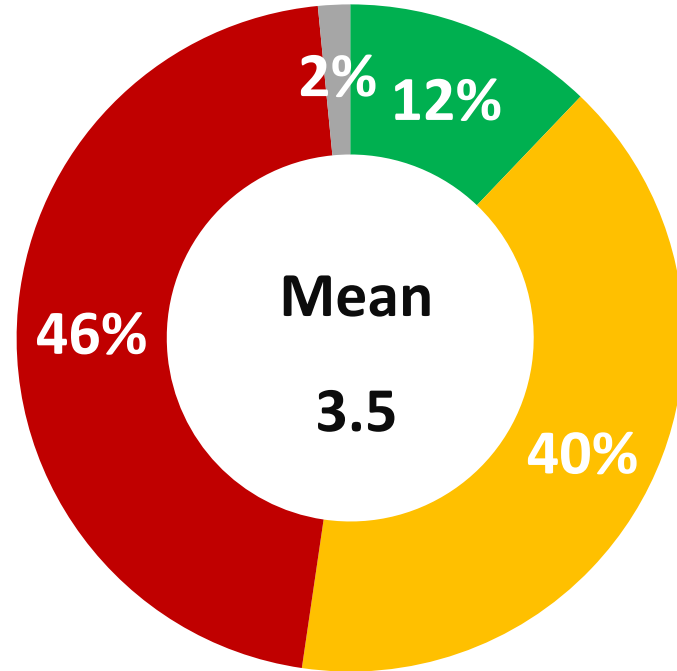

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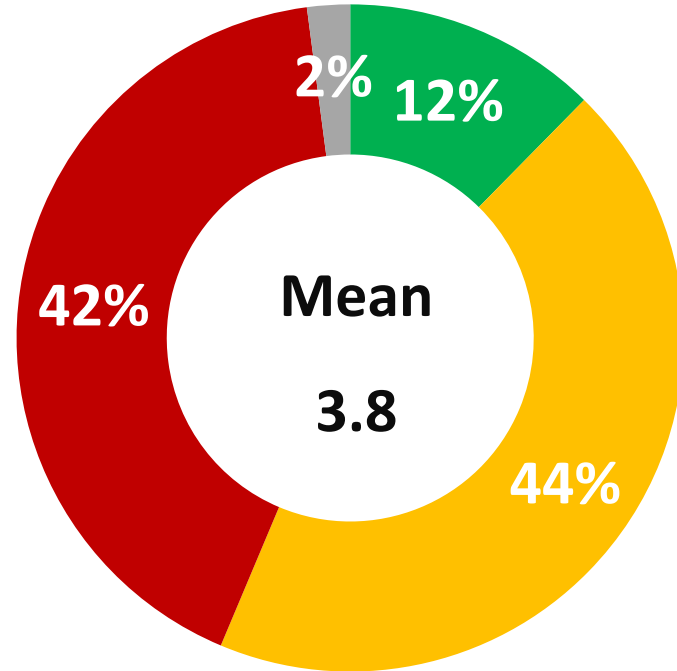

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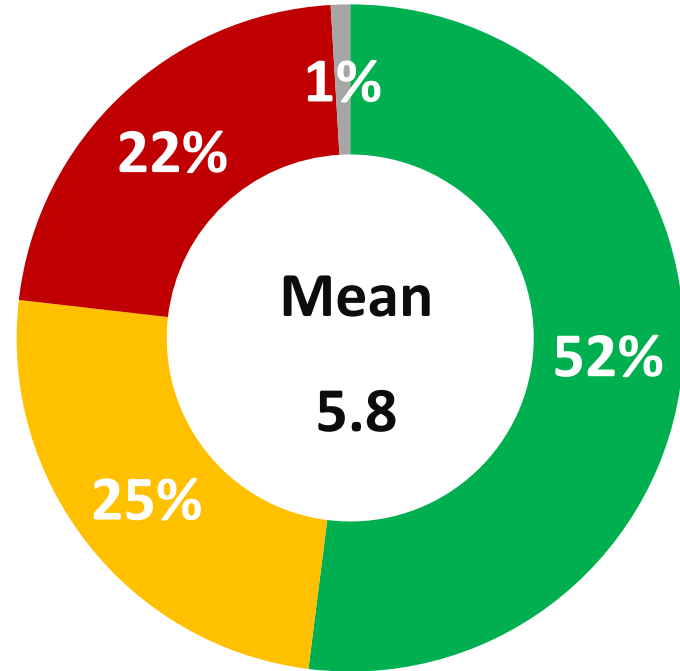

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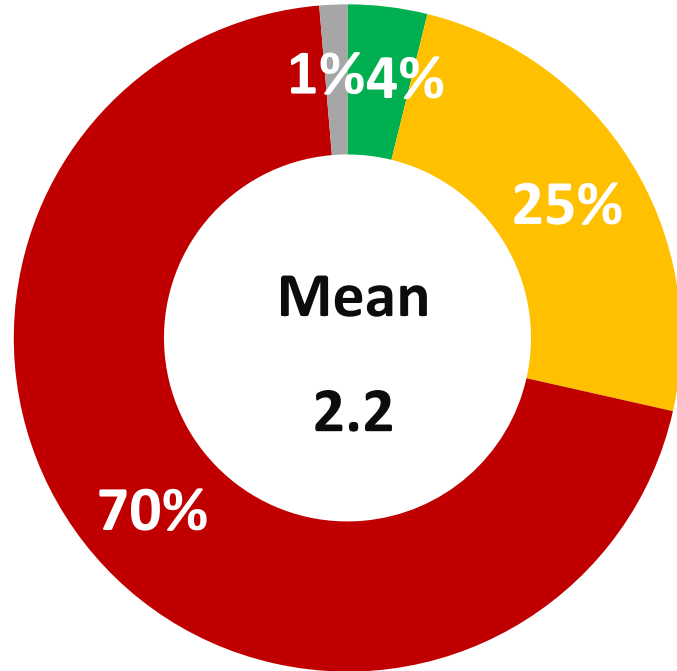

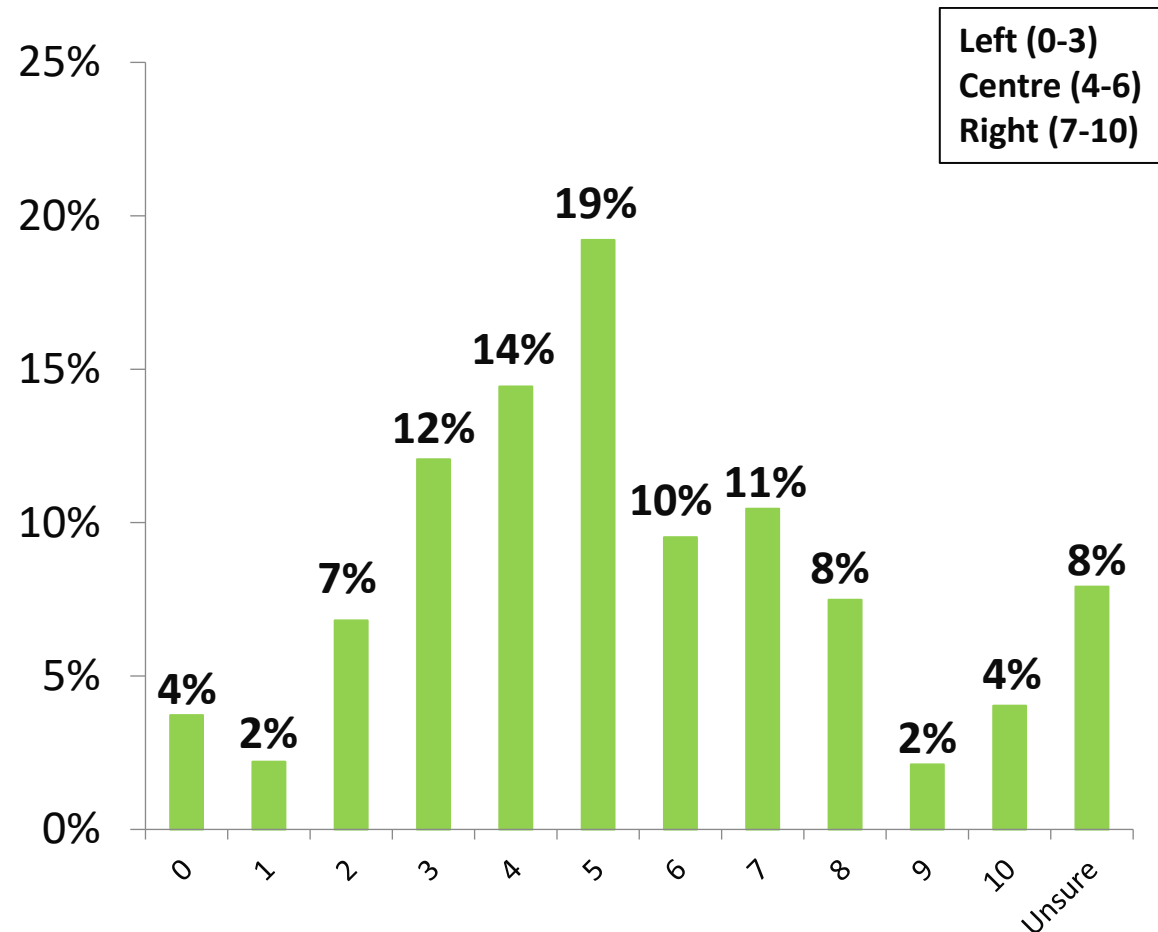

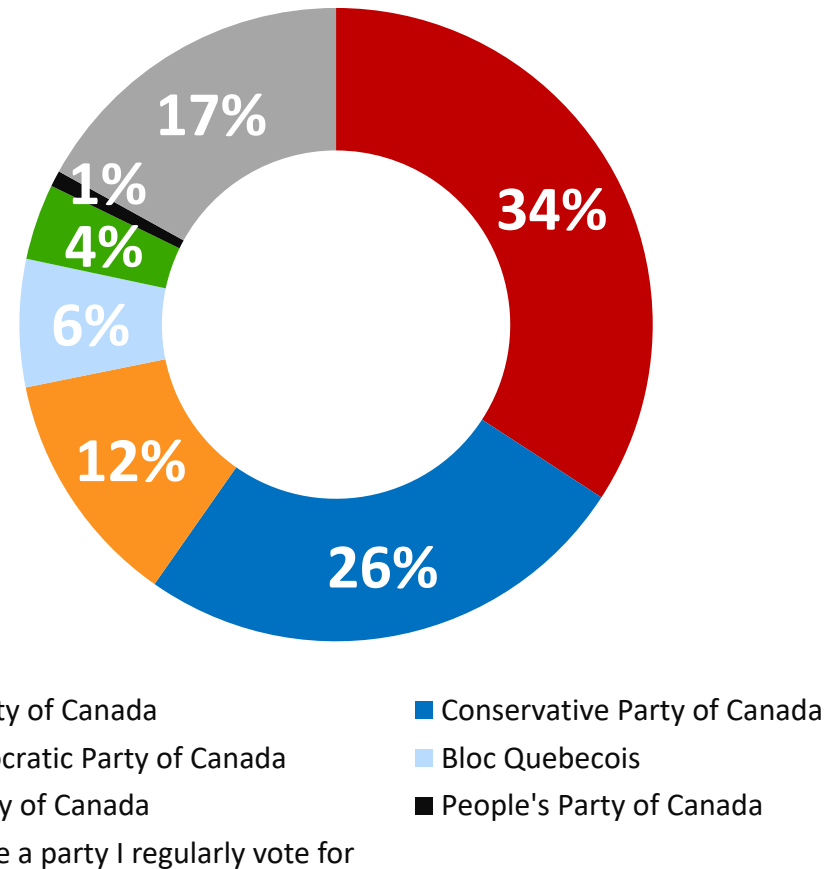

METHODOLOGY

Nanos conducted an RDD dual frame (land- and cell-lines) hybrid telephone and online random survey of 1,016 Canadians, 18 years of age or older, between February 28th and March 4th, 2021 as part of an omnibus survey. Participants were randomly recruited by telephone using live agents and administered a survey online. The results were statistically checked and weighted by age and gender using the latest Census information and the sample is geographically stratified to be representative of Canada.

Individuals were randomly called using random digit dialling with a maximum of five call backs.

The margin of error for a random survey of 1,016 Canadians is ± 3.1 percentage points, 19 times out of 20.

The research was commissioned by Positive Energy at the University of Ottawa and was conducted by Nanos Research.
