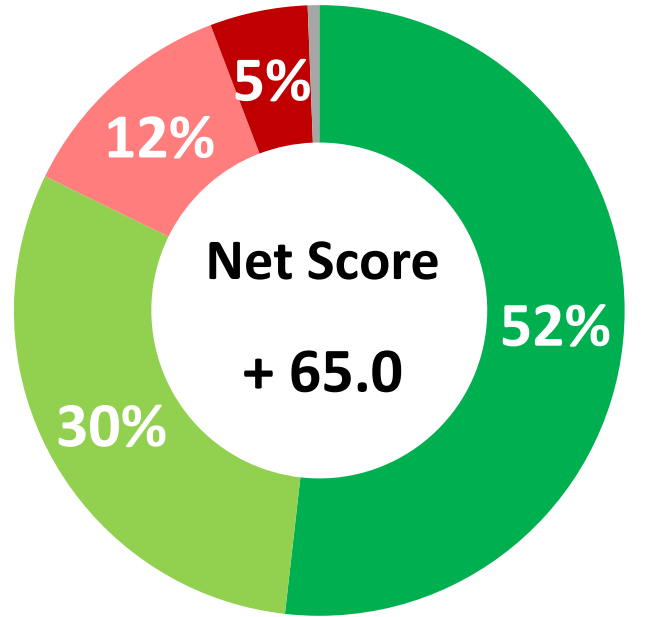




Four out of five Canadians care or somewhat care about the size of the deficit.

“ Four out of five Canadians say they care or somewhat care about the size of the Government of Canada's deficit. Residents of the Prairies are more likely to say they care (67%) than residents from Quebec (38%). Men are also more likely to say they care (58%) than women (46%). ”

Nanos conducted an RDD dual frame (land- and cell-lines) hybrid telephone and online random survey of 1,007 Canadians, 18 years of age or older, between March 27th and March 30th, 2021 as part of an omnibus survey. Participants were randomly recruited by telephone using live agents and administered a survey online. The sample included both land- and cell-lines across Canada. The results were statistically checked and weighted by age and gender using the latest Census information and the sample is geographically stratified to be representative of Canada. Individuals randomly called using random digit dialling with a maximum of five call backs.

The margin of error for this survey is ± 3.1 percentage points, 19 times out of 20.

This study was commissioned by Bloomberg News and the research was conducted by Nanos Research.
