

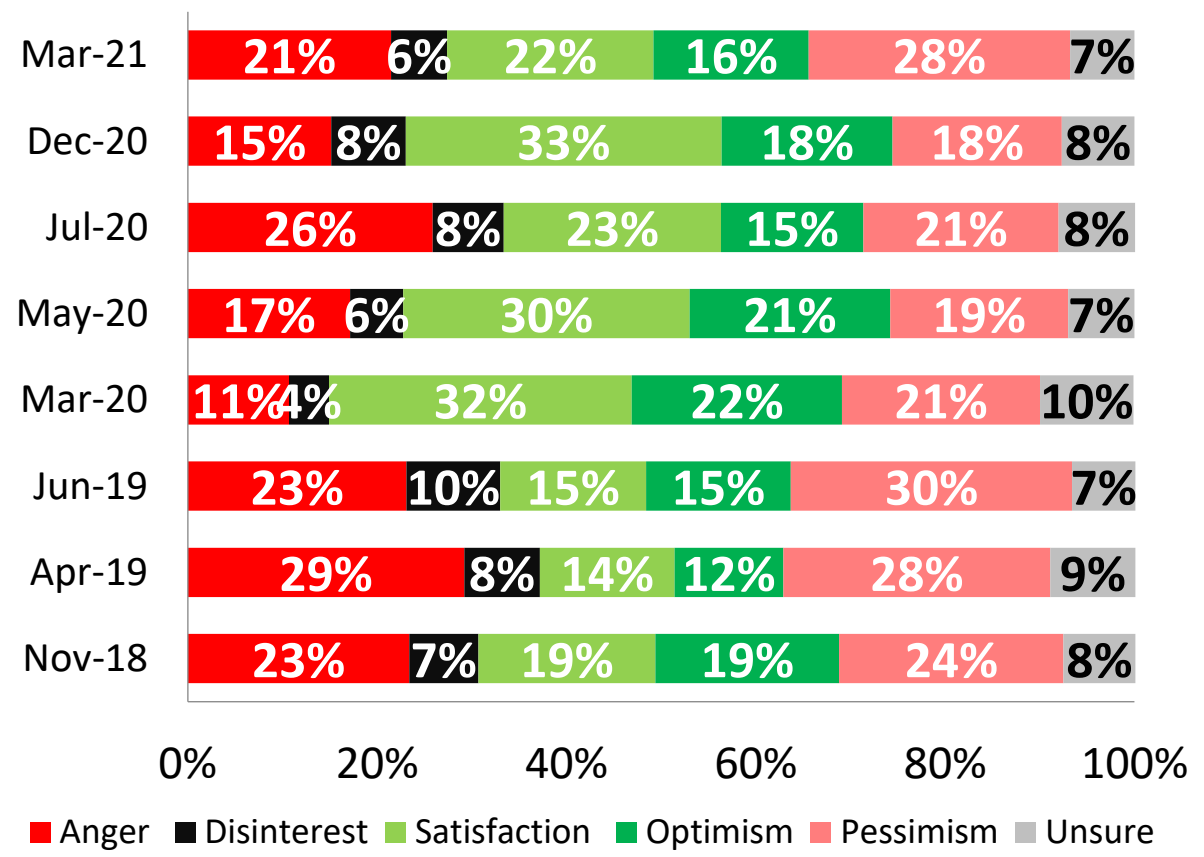

Which of the following feelings best describes your views of the federal government in Ottawa? [RANDOMIZE]



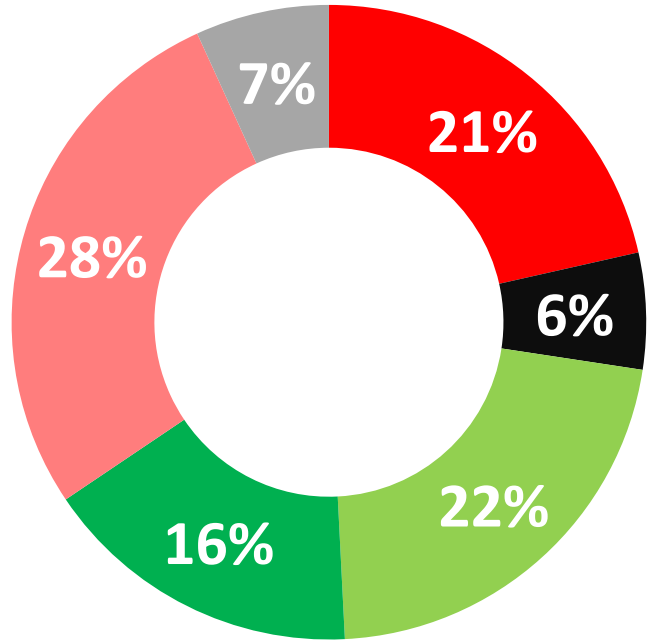

Nanos conducted an RDD dual frame (land- and cell-lines) hybrid telephone and online random survey of 1007 Canadians, 18 years of age or older, between March 27th and March 30th, 2021 as part of an omnibus survey. Participants were randomly recruited by telephone using live agents and administered a survey online. The results were statistically checked and weighted by age and gender using the latest Census information and the sample is geographically stratified to be representative of Canada.

Individuals were randomly called using random digit dialing with a maximum of five call backs.

The margin of error for a random survey of 1007 Canadians is ± 3.1 percentage points, 19 times out of 20.

The research was commissioned and conducted by Nanos Research.
