# Key Findings – City of Ottawa



## **RATING THE CITY OF OTTAWA**

Ottawa residents give the highest ratings to Ottawa as a place to raise a family (mean score of 8.4 out of 10) and as a safe place to live (mean of 8.0) and give the lowest rating to Ottawa as a place where one can afford to buy a home (mean of 4.4).



## **PERFORMANCE OF MUNICIPAL LEADERS**

Ottawa residents are more likely to say municipal leaders have done a very good (16%) or good job (36%) at responding to the COVID-19 pandemic than at creating an environment for affordable housing (very good: two per cent; good: 16%).



## **PREMIER AND MAYOR’S HANDLING OF COVID-19 PANDEMIC**

Residents give a higher rating to Mayor Jim Watson’s performance responding to the COVID-19 pandemic (mean of 6.7) than Premier Doug Ford’s (mean of 5.8).



## **VALUE OF REAL ESTATE**

Ottawa residents are 11 times more likely to believe the value of real estate in their neighbourhood will increase (74%) rather than decrease (seven per cent), while 17 per cent believe it will remain the same.

## EASING RESTRICTIONS ON SECONDARY SUITES

A strong majority of Ottawa residents support (75%) or somewhat support (12%) the City of Ottawa easing restrictions to allow homeowners to build secondary suites or coach houses on their property for a senior family member to live in.

## CONCERN ABOUT HOUSING FOR SENIORS

A majority of Ottawa residents say they are concerned or somewhat concerned about the affordability (56% concerned; 24% somewhat concerned) and availability of adequate housing for seniors in Ottawa (45% concerned; 27% somewhat concerned). Ottawa residents rate the urgency of ensuring seniors have adequate housing options as a priority (mean of 7.7).

## APPEAL OF HOUSING OPTIONS FOR SENIORS

Ottawa residents rate remaining in their current home (mean of 8.1) as the most appealing housing option for seniors, followed closely by a secondary suite/coach house/in-law suite in a family member’s home (mean of 7.8). They gave the lowest score to a long-term care home (mean of 5.0).

## REQUIRING SENIOR-FRIENDLY HOME

One third of residents who are seniors and/or make decisions on behalf of a senior say they and/or a senior in their family will require a senior-friendly home in the next five years. Of those residents, just over half say they or their family member is prepared (33%) or somewhat prepared (18%) to move to a senior-friendly home.





















Older residents give the Premier a higher rating (mean of 6.4) than younger residents (18-34) (mean of 5.0)

































# METHODOLOGY


Nanos conducted an RDD dual frame (land- and cell-lines) random telephone survey of 700 residents in the City of Ottawa, 18 years of age or older, between April 6<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup>, 2021. Participants were randomly recruited by telephone using live agents and administered a survey. The sample is geographically stratified to be representative of the City of Ottawa.

Individuals were randomly called using random digit dialling with a maximum of five call backs.

The margin of error for a random survey of 700 residents of the City of Ottawa is  $\pm 3.7$  percentage points, 19 times out of 20.

The research was commissioned by the Ontario Real Estate Association and the Ottawa Real Estate Board and was conducted by Nanos Research.
