Key Findings

END HOMELESSNESS

Nearly seven in ten Canadians say it is urgent to end homelessness in Canada and invest in affordable housing in Canada (mean of 7.3). NDP voters (mean of 8.8) and women (mean of 8.0) are more likely to say this is urgent compared to men (mean of 6.7) and Conservative supporters (mean of 5.8).

2

NEW AFFORDABLE HOUSING

Over eight in ten Canadians say they support (45%) or somewhat support (39%) investing in building new affordable housing. NDP supporters (71% support, 22% somewhat support) and Liberal Supporters (55% support, 37% somewhat support) report a higher intensity of support compared to Conservative supporters (47% support, 36% somewhat support).

HOUSING COSTS

Consistent with the previous wave, under two in ten Canadians report being worried (five percent) or somewhat worried (ten percent) about paying their housing costs next month. Bloc Quebecois voters (69% not worried, 23% somewhat not worried) were most likely to say they are not worried compared to Conservative voters (68% not worried, 9% somewhat not worried).

4

PARTY SUPPORT

Just under eight in ten Canadians say they would be more supportive or somewhat more supportive of a political party if they proposed concrete action to end homelessness and build safe, affordable, housing in Canada. NDP voters (60% more supportive, 30% somewhat more supportive) were most likely to say so compared to conservative voters (16% more supportive, 39% somewhat more supportive).

Homelessness and housing in Canada



15% of Canadians are **worried** or **somewhat worried** about paying their housing costs next month (compared to 16% in 2020).

- Canadians who rent are over **six times** more likely to be **worried** about paying their housing costs next month (13%) than Canadians who own their own home (2% worried).



70% of Canadians believe it is **URGENT** to work to **end homelessness** and **invest in affordable housing** in Canada (score of 7-10 out of 10)

- **91%** of Canadians who usually vote **NDP** and **77%** who usually vote **Liberal** believe it is **URGENT** to work to **end homelessness** and **invest in affordable housing**, while **47%** of Canadians who usually vote **Conservative** believe the same.

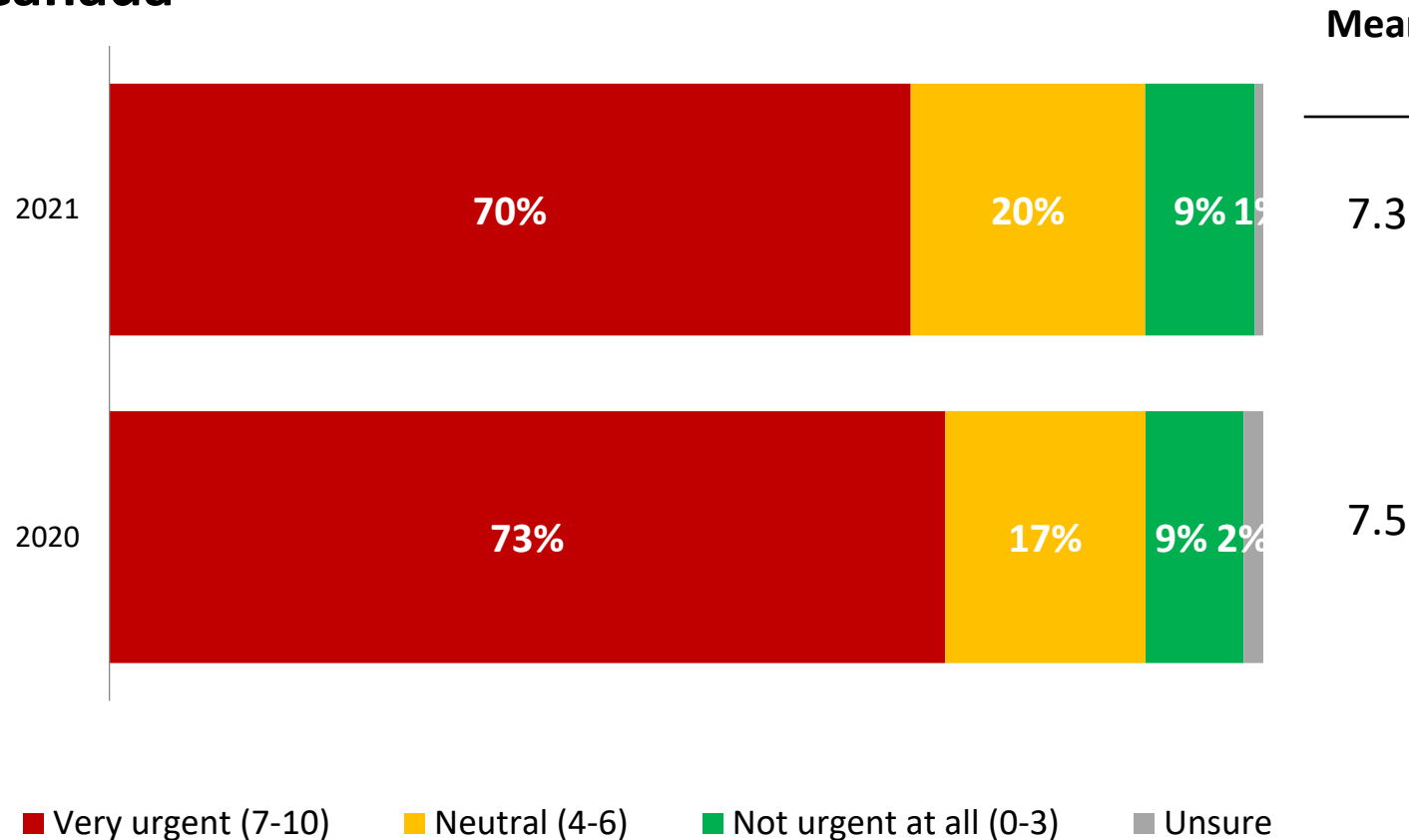

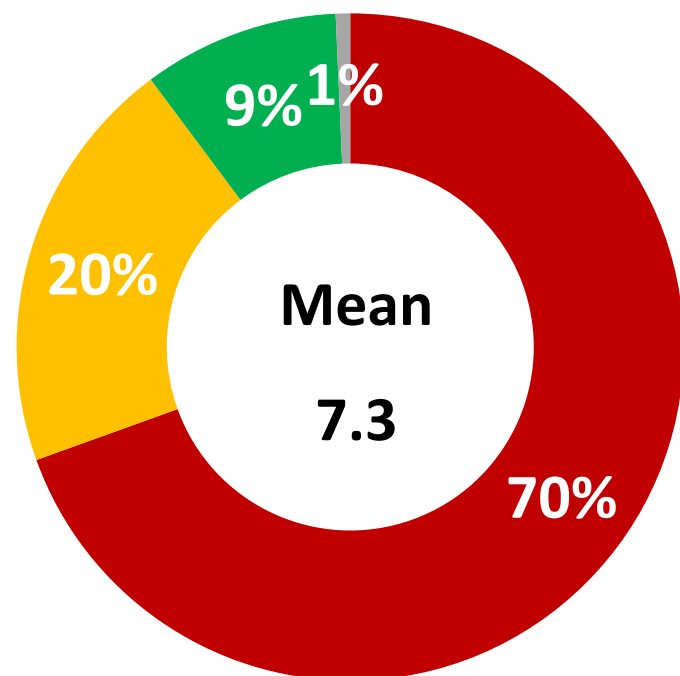

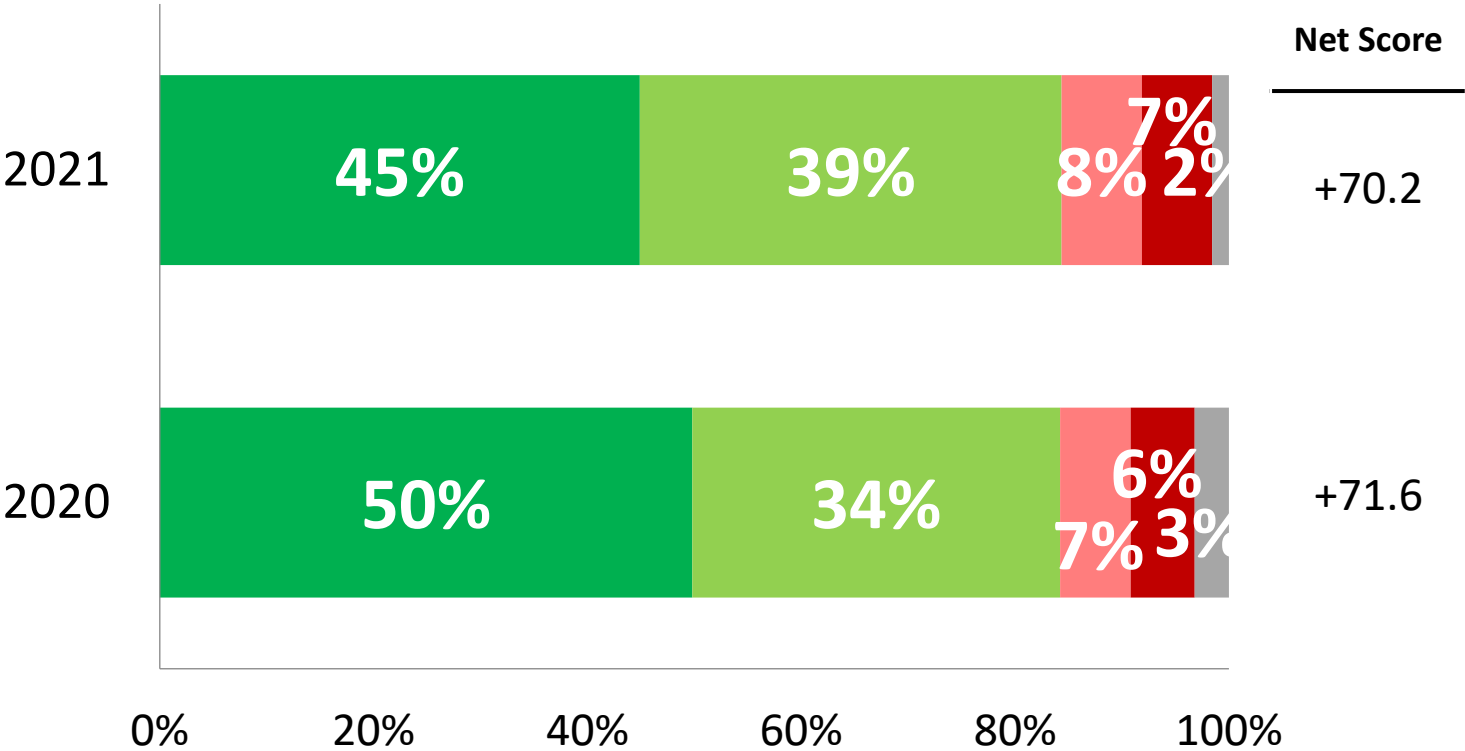

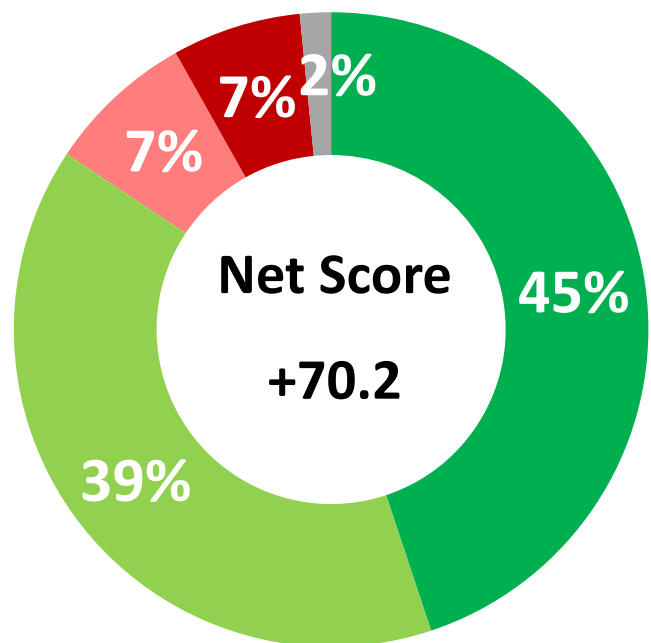

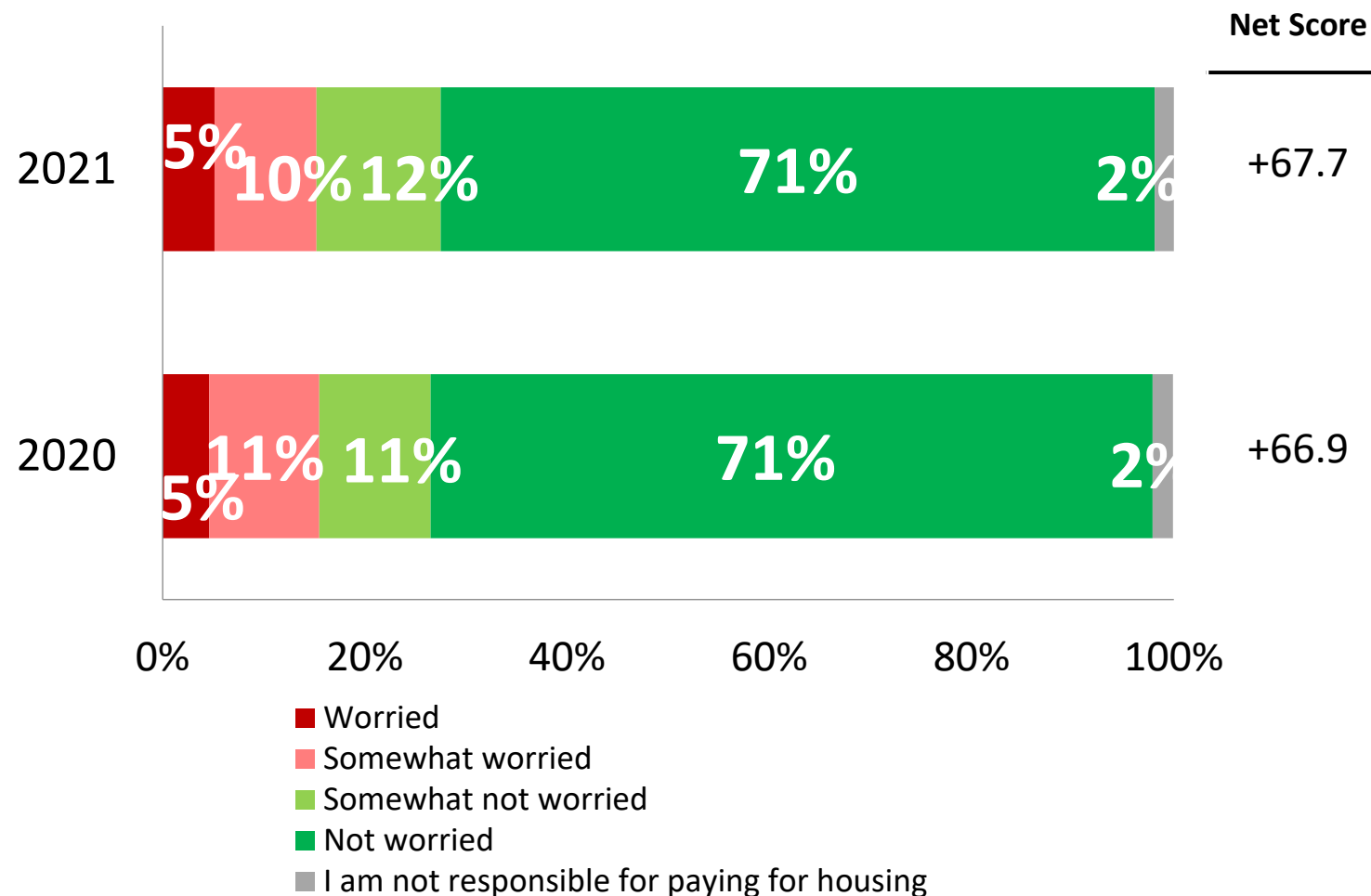

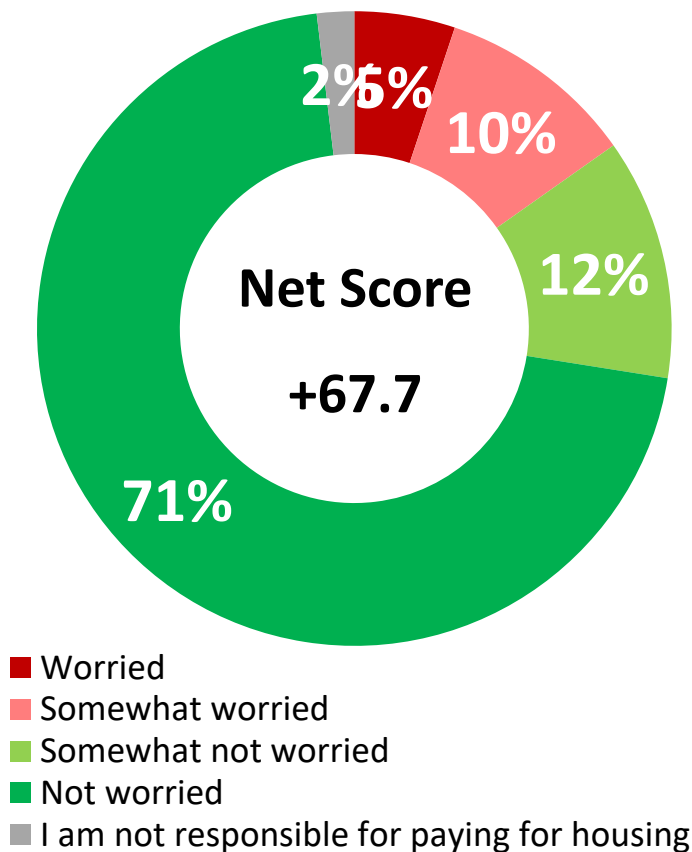

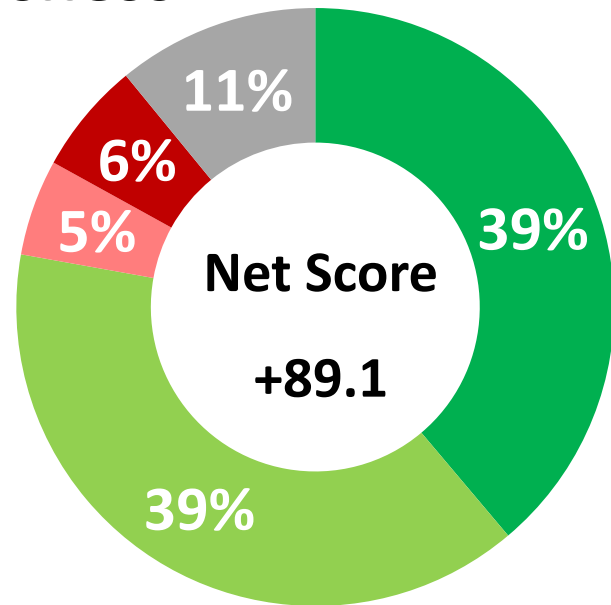

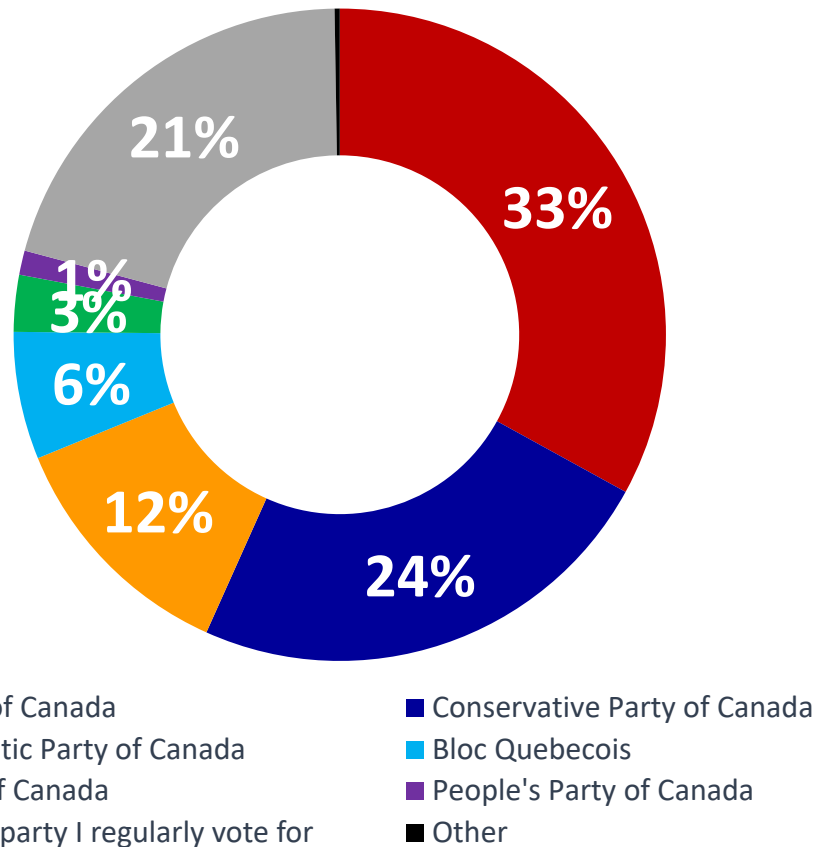

METHODOLOGY

Nanos conducted an RDD dual frame (land- and cell-lines) hybrid telephone and online random survey of 1,002 Canadians, 18 years of age or older, between , July 30th and August 2nd , 2021 as part of an omnibus survey. Participants were randomly recruited by telephone using live agents and administered a survey online. The results were statistically checked and weighted by age and gender using the latest Census information and the sample is geographically stratified to be representative of Canada.

Individuals were randomly called using random digit dialing with a maximum of five call backs.

The margin of error for a random survey of 1,002 Canadians is ± 3.1 percentage points, 19 times out of 20.

The research was commissioned by Canadian Alliance to End Homelessness and was conducted by Nanos Research.
