## **Key Findings**



#### **ISSUES OF CONCERN**

GTA residents most often mention affordable housing as the biggest issue facing the GTA right now, with four in ten mentioning this unprompted (41%). This was followed by transit (18%) and COVID-19 related issues (14%). Residents of the 416 area code were more likely to mention affordable housing (47%) than residents of the 905 area code (35%).



#### **INFLUENCE OF FACTORS ON VOTE**

GTA residents give the highest intensity of importance to the plans for the future presented by the federal political parties in terms of influencing how they will vote in the upcoming federal election (mean of 8.1 out of 10), followed by the track record of the Liberals during the pandemic (mean of 7.6). The performance of party leaders during the campaign received a lower intensity of importance than other factors (mean of 6.4 out of 10). 3

#### YOUNGER VERSUS OLDER RESIDENTS

Older residents (55 plus) give a higher importance score to the performance of party leaders during the campaign (6.9) than those 18 to 34 (mean of 6.0), while younger residents (18-34) give a higher importance score to the best platform for housing affordability (mean of 7.4) than those 35 to 54 (mean of 6.4) and 55 plus (mean of 6.8).

GTA residents are most likely to say, unprompted, that affordable housing is the most important issue facing the Greater Toronto Area today, followed by transit and COVID-19 related issues. 


Importance of factors influencing vote in the upcoming federal election






## Importance of a party's plan for the future by demographics









# METHODO

Nanos conducted an RDD dual frame (land- and celllines) hybrid telephone and online random survey of

518 residents of the Greater Toronto Area, 18 years of age or older, between August 28<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup>, 2021 as part of an omnibus survey. Participants were randomly recruited by telephone using live agents and administered a survey online. The sample included both land- and cell-lines across the GTA. The results were statistically checked and weighted by age and gender using the latest Census information and the sample is geographically stratified to be representative of GTA.

Individuals randomly called using random digit dialling with a maximum of five call backs.

The margin of error for this survey is  $\pm 4.3$  percentage points, 19 times out of 20.

This study was commissioned by CTV News and CP24 and the research was conducted by Nanos Research.

Nanos conducted an RDD dual frame (land- and cell- lines) hybrid telephone and online random survey of 518 residents of the Greater Toronto Area (GTA), 18 years of age or older, between August 28<sup>th</sup> and August 30<sup>th</sup>, 2021. The margin of error for this survey is ±4.3 percentage points, 19 times out of 20.
