

Trudeau and O'Toole both trail 'unsure' and a caucus colleague when Canadians are asked who they want to lead the parties in the next federal election.

# Key Findings



## PREFERRED LPC LEADER

Asked who would be best to lead the Liberal Party of Canada in the next federal election, current leader Justin Trudeau (18%) trails 'unsure' (32%) and Chrystia Freeland (25%) and is followed by Mark Carney (12%).



## PREFERRED CPC LEADER

Canadians are most likely to be unsure who would be best to lead the Conservative Party in the next federal election (48%), followed by Pierre Poilievre (17%) and current leader Erin O'Toole (10%).



## PERFORMANCE OF TRUDEAU AS LPC LEADER

Canadians are divided over Justin Trudeau's performance as the leader of the Liberal Party of Canada, with just over one in three each saying he has done an excellent job (35%) or a poor job (34%)(mean of 4.7 out of 10). Twenty-nine per cent say he has done an average job.



## PERFORMANCE OF O'TOOLE AS CPC LEADER

Canadians are five times more likely to say Erin O'Toole has done a poor job (46%) as the leader of the Conservative Party of Canada than an excellent job (nine per cent), while 33 per cent say he has done an average job (mean of 3.4 out of 10).



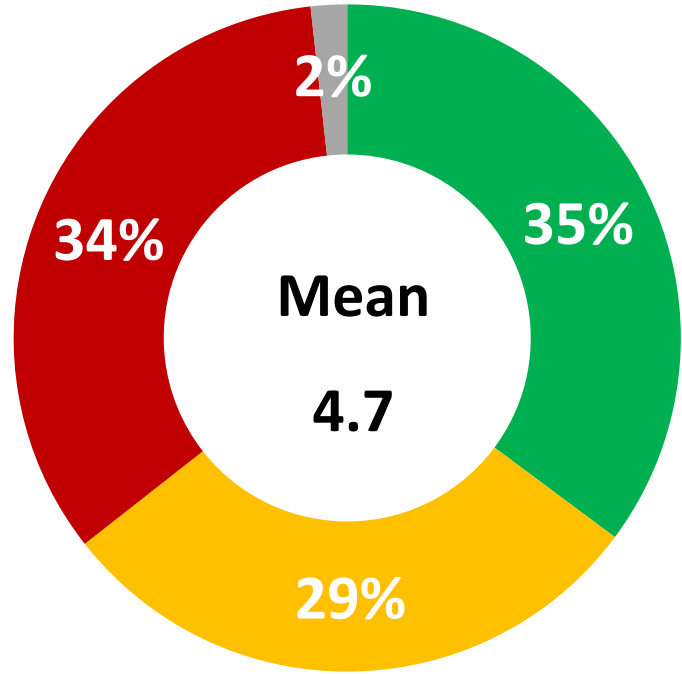
## FEDERAL LEADERS' VISIONS FOR CANADA

Half of Canadians say the vision for Canada expressed by Jagmeet Singh (25%) or Justin Trudeau (24%) most closely aligns with their personal view, followed by the vision of Erin O'Toole (14%).

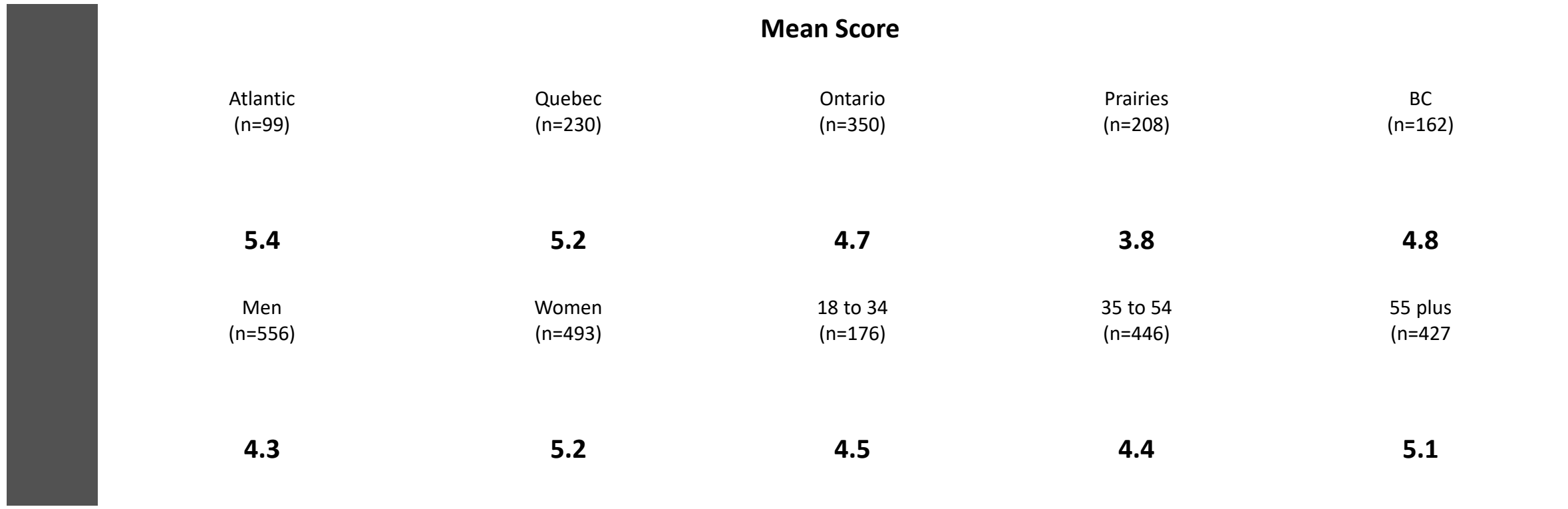
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# Performance of Justin Trudeau as Liberal Party leader by demographics

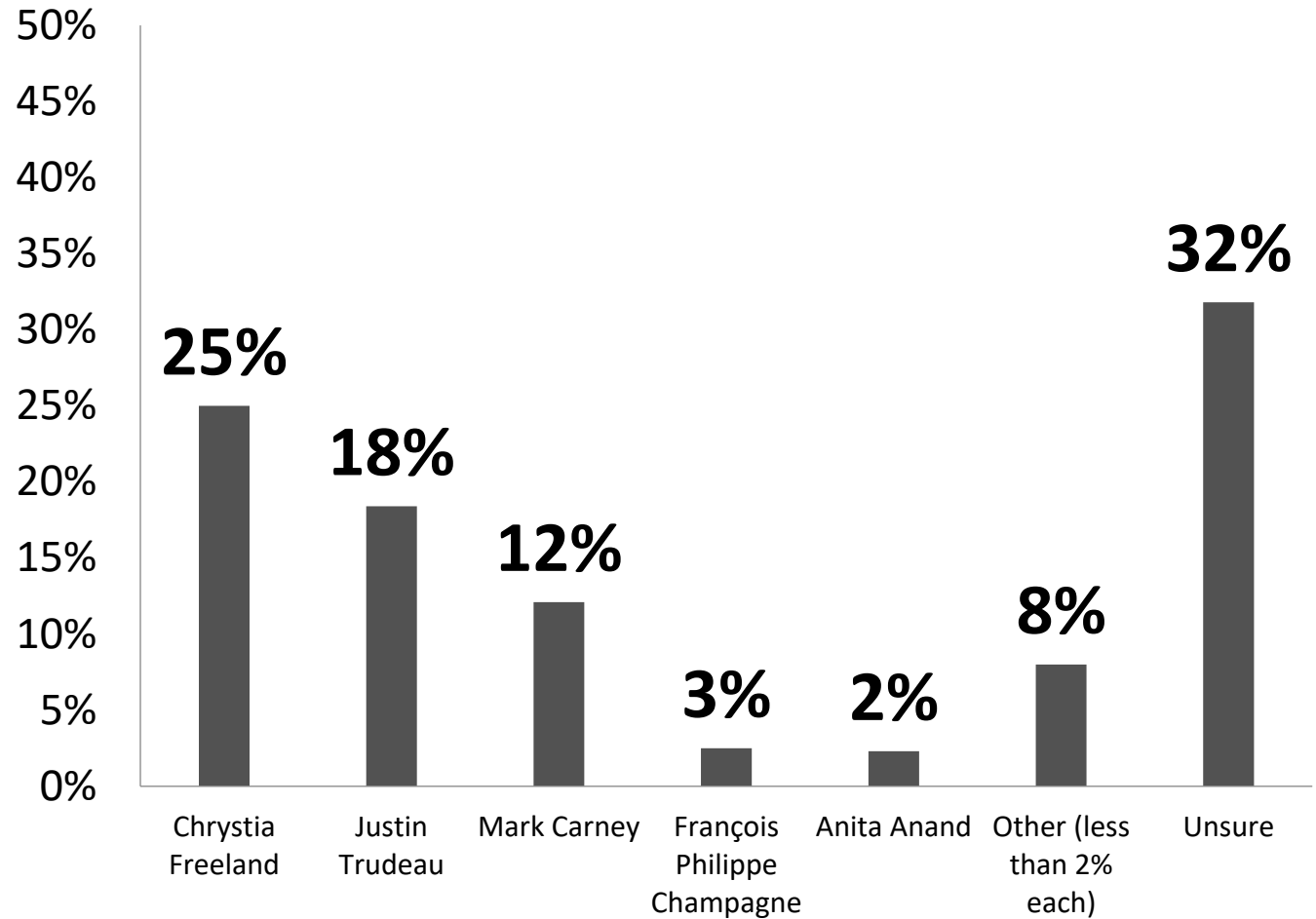

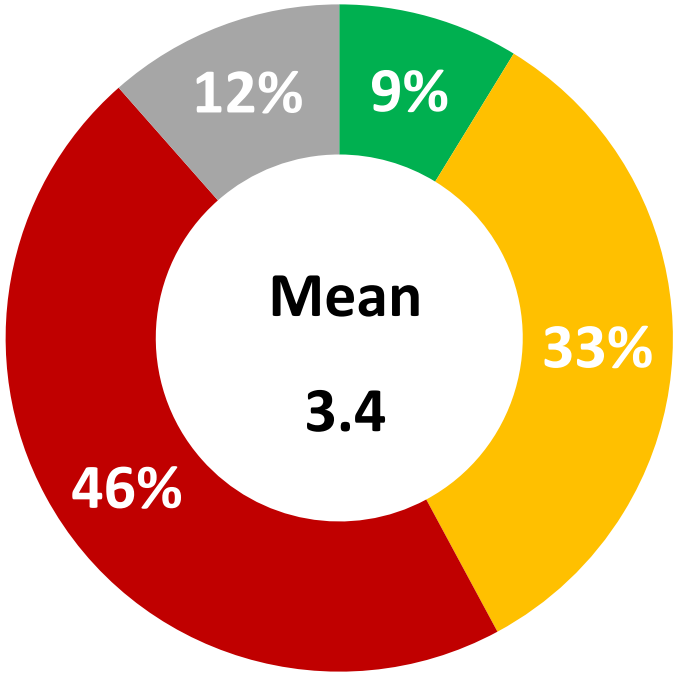

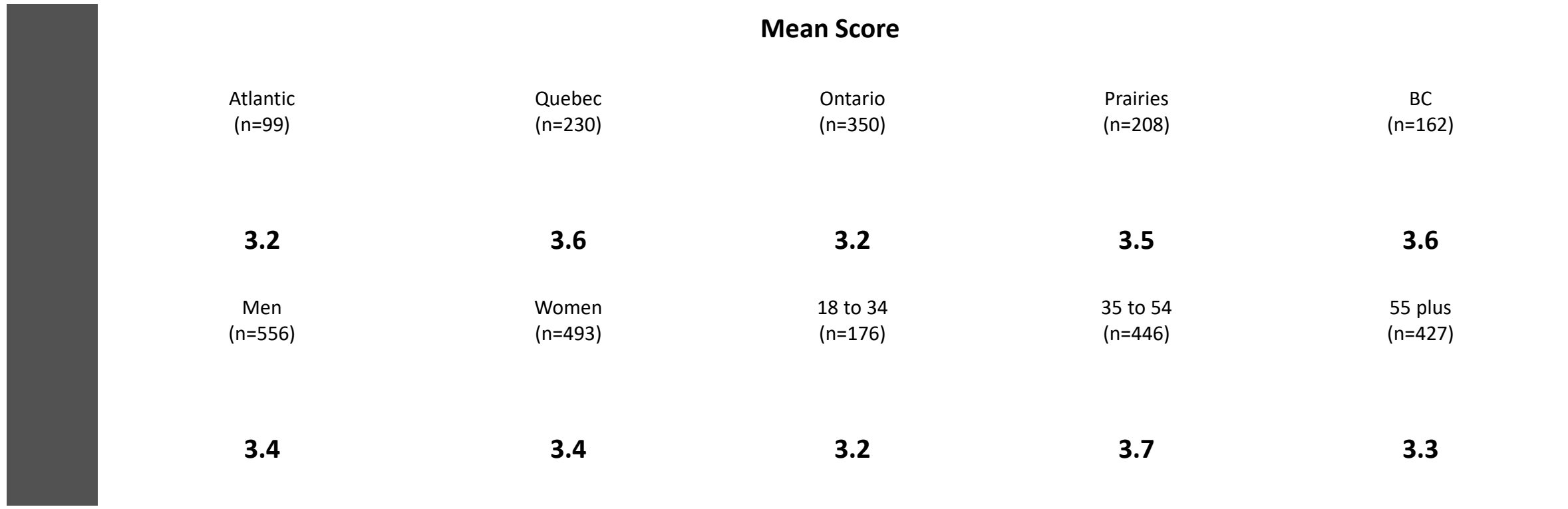


# Performance of Erin O'Toole as Conservative Party leader by demographics

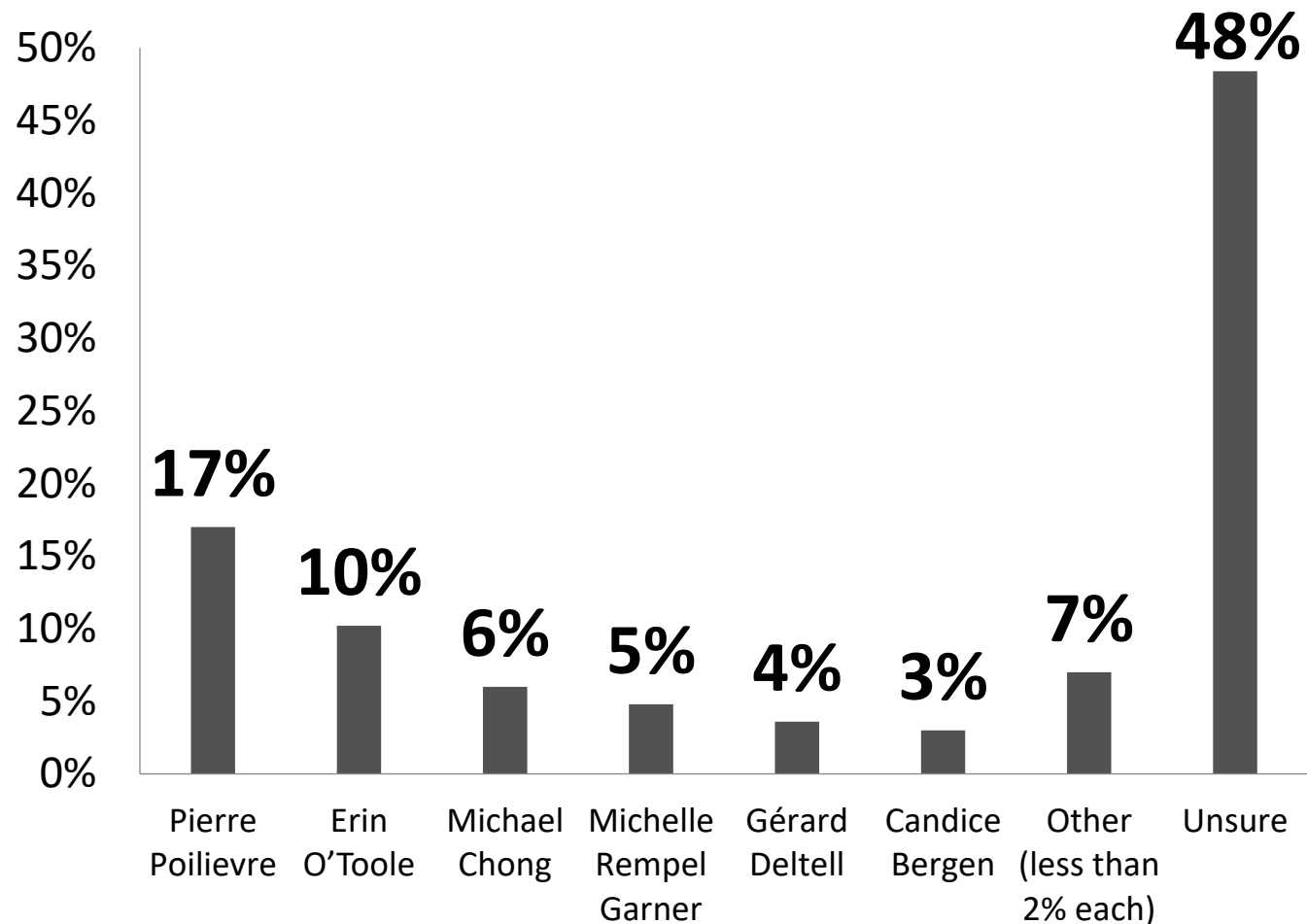

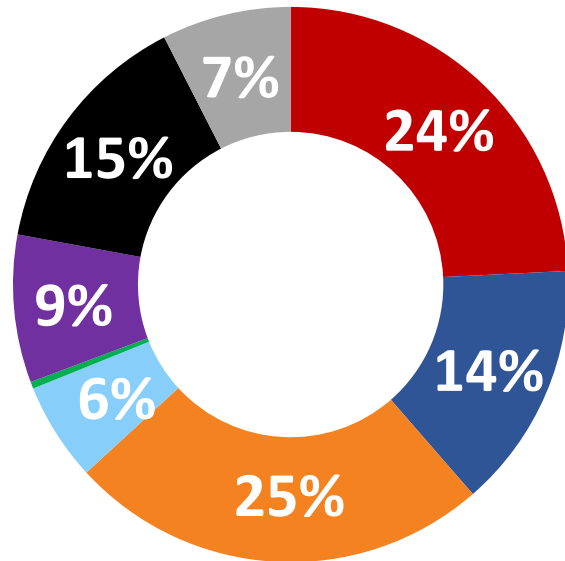

About one in four Canadians each say of the current federal party leaders, the visions of Jagmeet Singh (25%) and Justin Trudeau (24%) are closest to their personal views. Older Canadians (55 plus) are more likely to say Justin Trudeau's vision aligns with theirs (33%), while younger Canadians (18 to 34) are more likely to say Jagmeet Singh (35%).

Nanos conducted an RDD dual frame (land- and cell-lines) hybrid telephone and online random survey of 1,049 Canadians, 18 years of age or older, between January 21<sup>st</sup> to 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2022 as part of an omnibus survey. Participants were randomly recruited by telephone using live agents and administered a survey online. The sample included both land- and cell-lines across Canada. The results were statistically checked and weighted by age and gender using the latest Census information and the sample is geographically stratified to be representative of Canada.

Individuals randomly called using random digit dialling with a maximum of five call backs.

The margin of error for this survey is  $\pm 3.0$  percentage points, 19 times out of 20.

This study was commissioned by the Globe and Mail and the research was conducted by Nanos Research.
