

Satisfaction with Canada as a country declines -  
Education and Healthcare seen as top contributors  
to Canada being a better country, political  
institutions rated lowest.

# Key Findings

1

## Satisfaction with Canada

Just over two in three Canadians say they are satisfied (67%) with Canada as a country (mean score of 6.8 out of 10), which is a decrease compared to 2021 (mean of 7.2).

2

## Age and Level of Satisfaction

Younger Canadians (18-34) report the lowest level of satisfaction (mean of 6.2) with Canada as a country compared to all demographics, especially older Canadians (55 plus) (mean of 7.4).

## Education and Healthcare top contributors

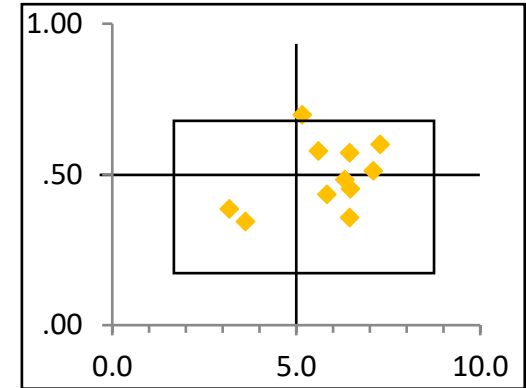
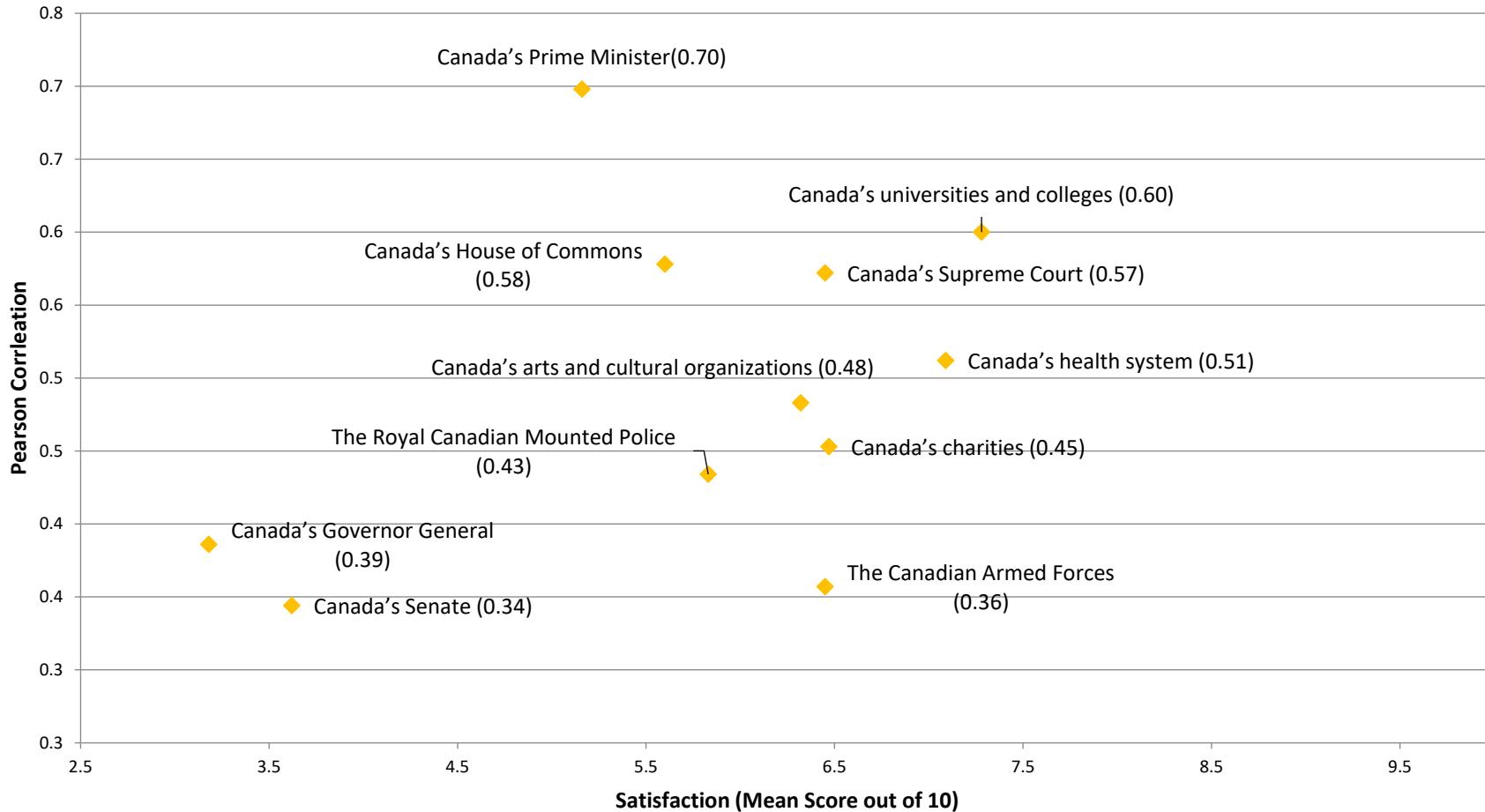
Canada's Universities and colleges (mean of 7.3) and Canada's healthcare system (mean of 7.1) are ranked as top major contributors to Canada being a better country.

## Political institutions lowest contributors

Canadians rate political institutions including the House of Commons (mean of 5.6), the prime minister (mean of 5.2), the Senate (mean of 3.6) and the Governor General (mean of 3.2) the lowest on the list of contributors to Canada being a better country.

# Driver Analysis



The Pearson Correlation score indicates the relationship between the satisfaction with Canada as a country and impressions of contributors to Canada being a better country. A value of +1 is total positive linear correlation, 0 is no linear correlation, and -1 is total negative linear correlation.

All of the variables have a score between +0.59 and +0.25, meaning there is a positive relationship, but not a strong one.

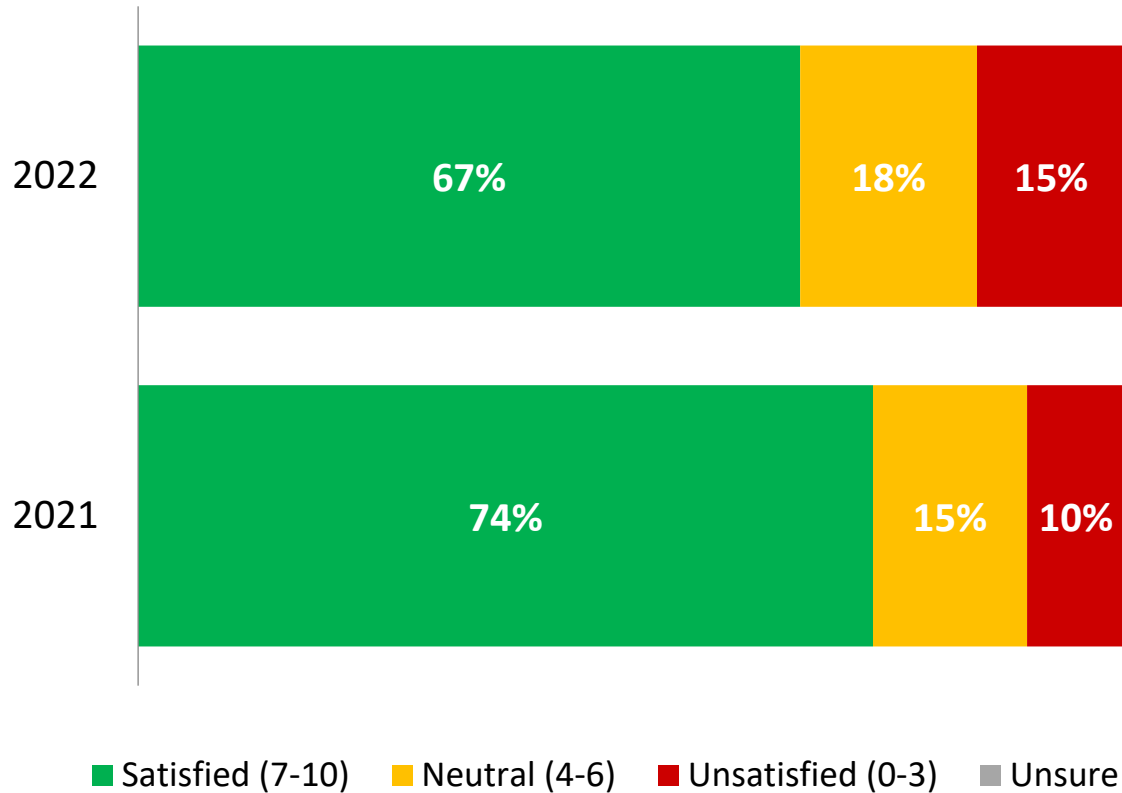

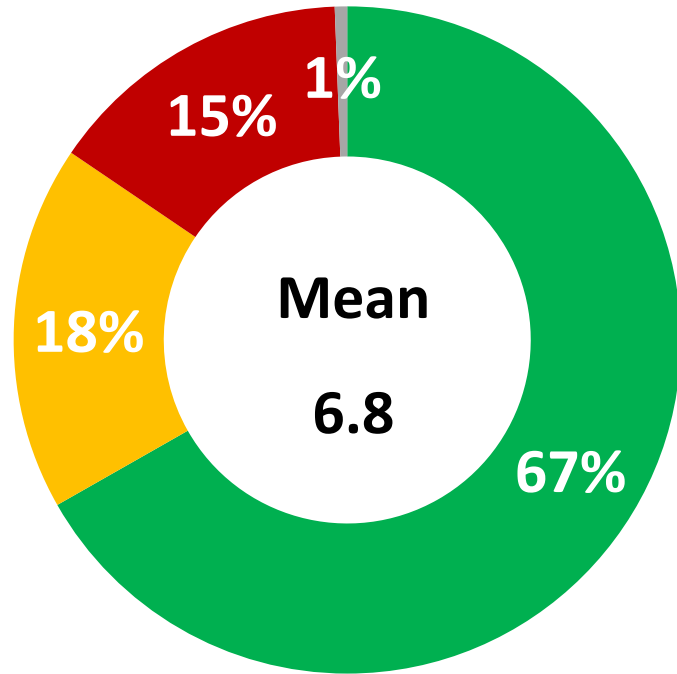

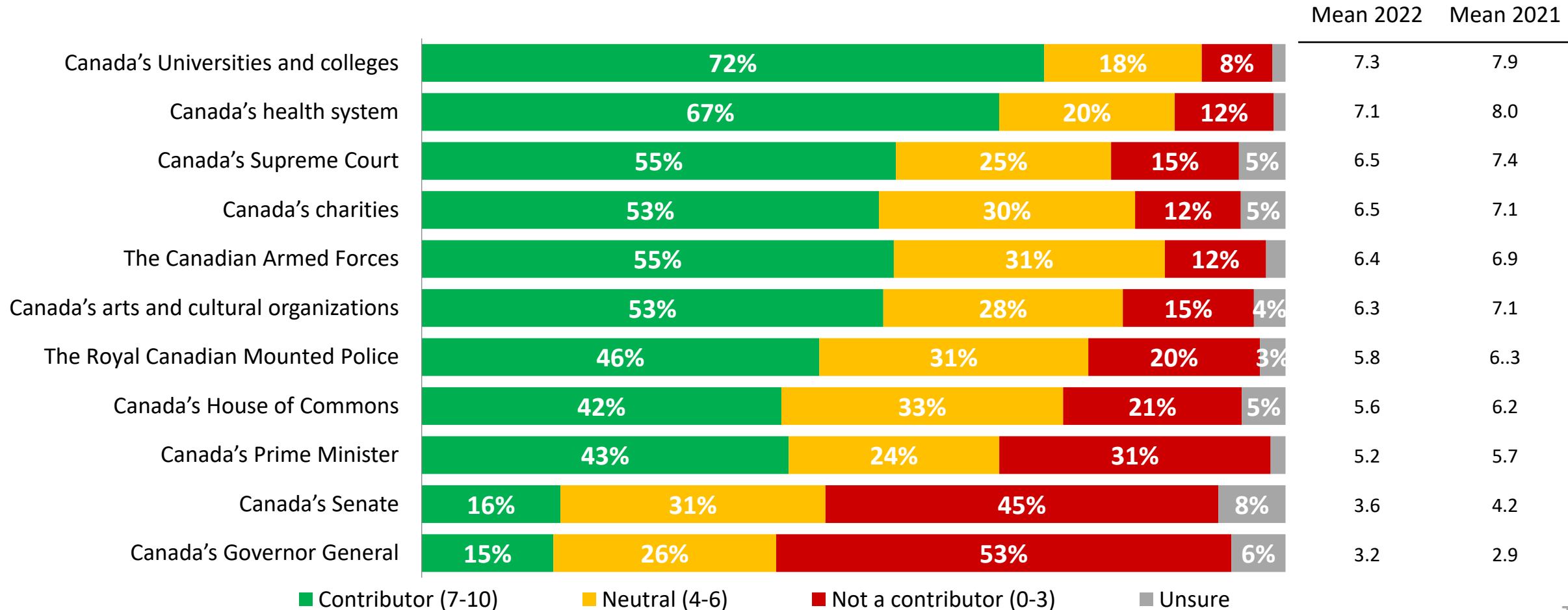

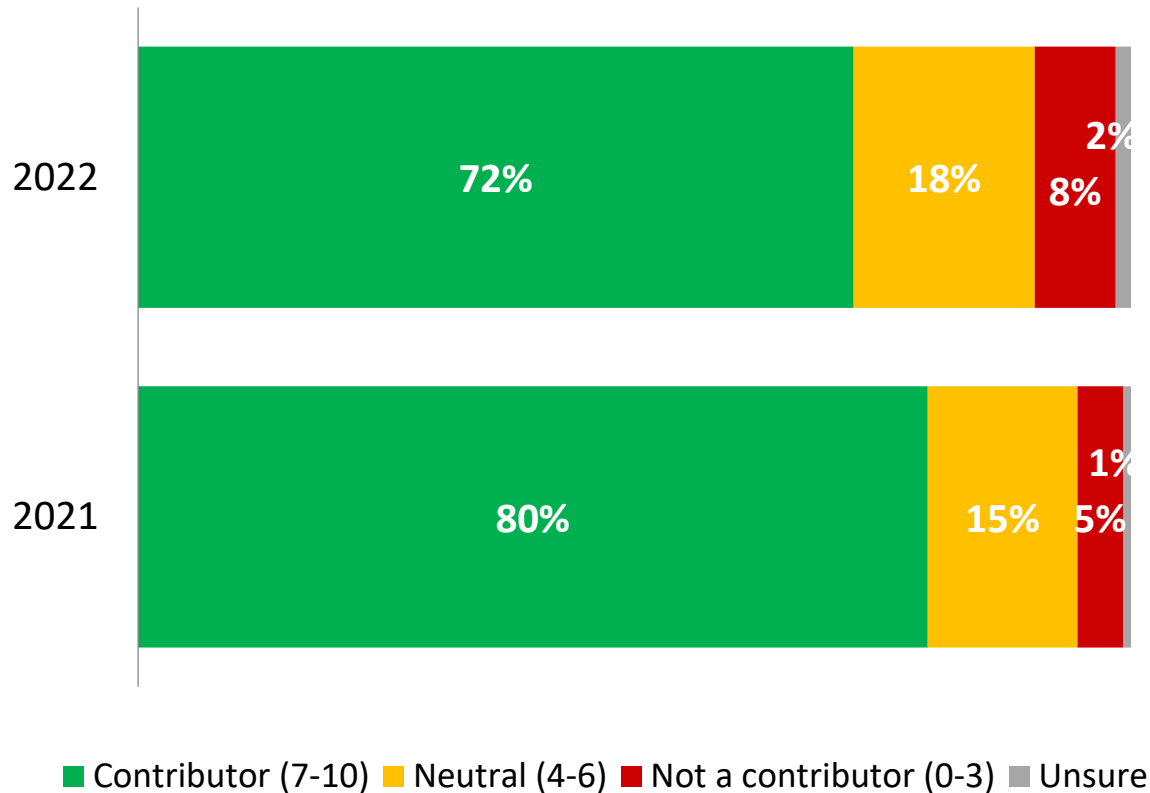

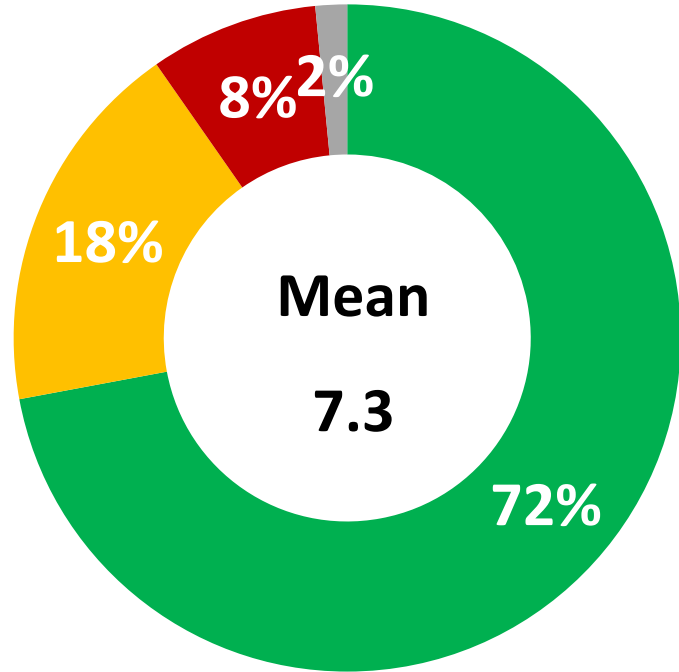

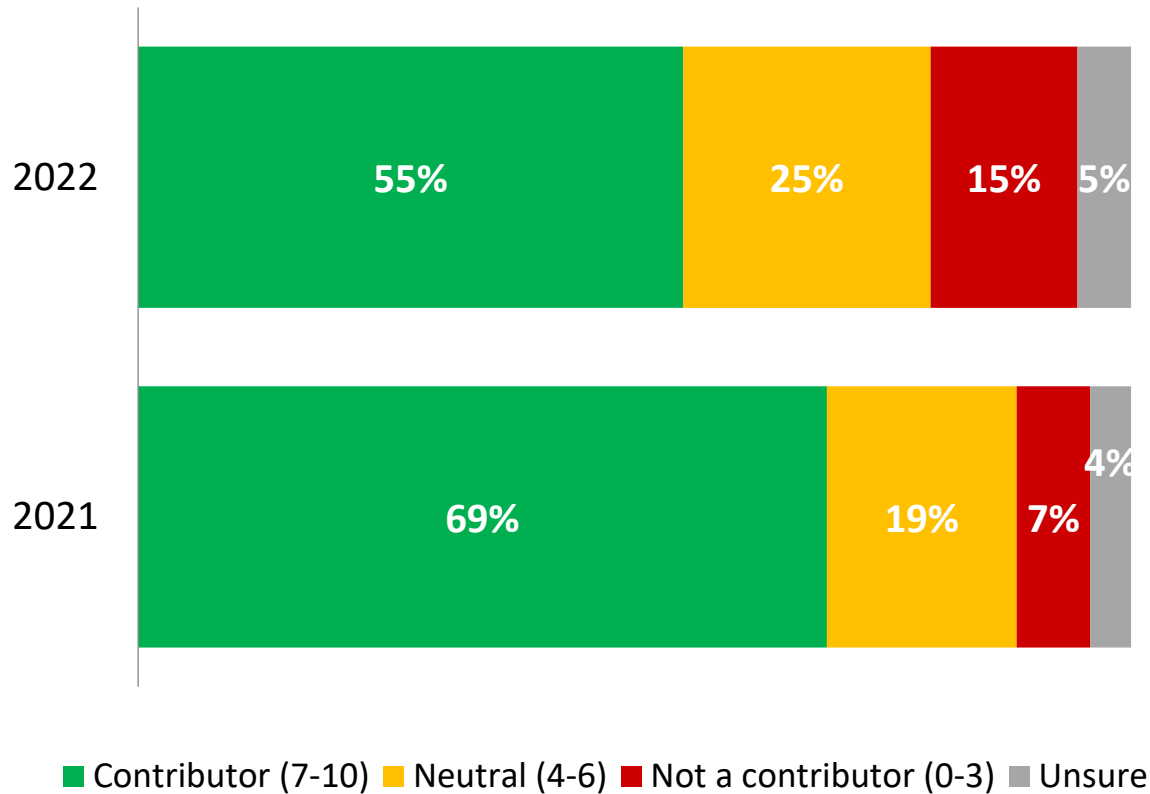

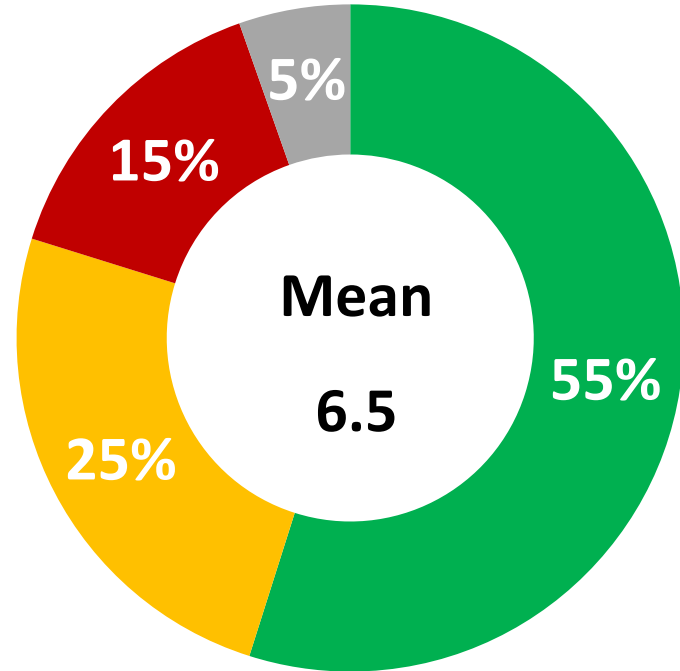

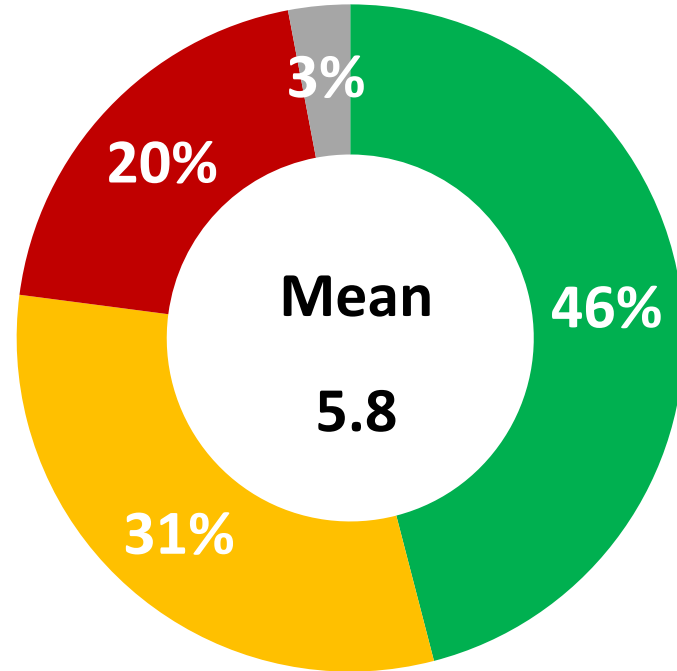

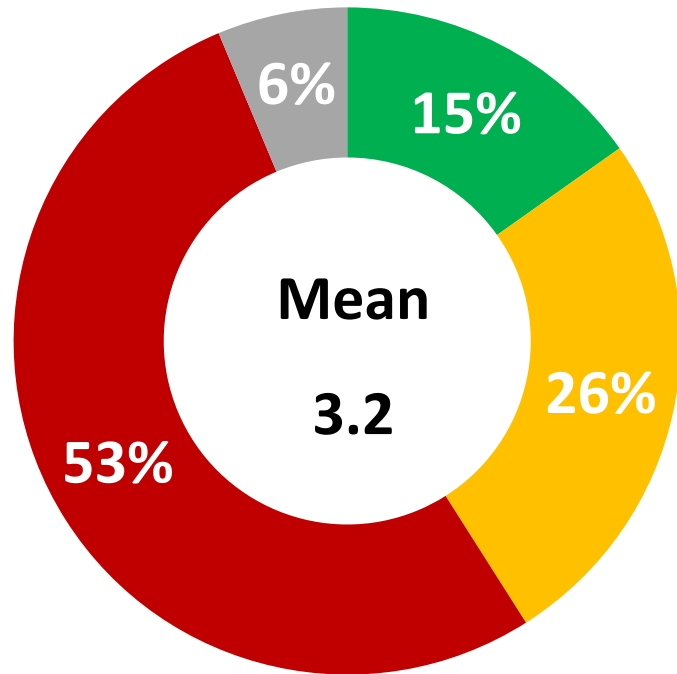

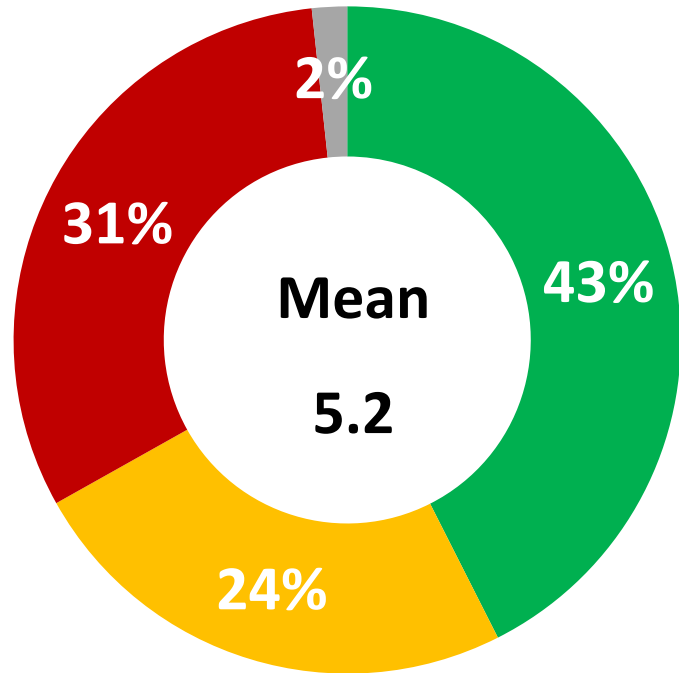

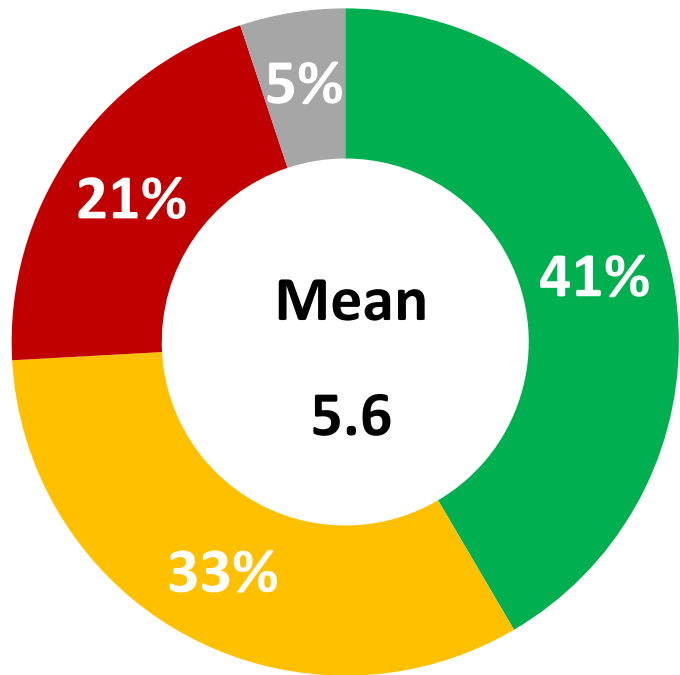

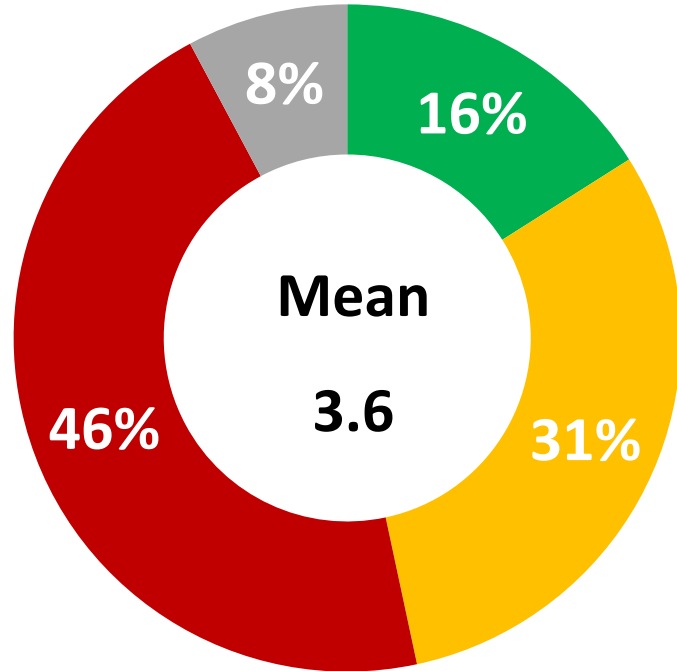

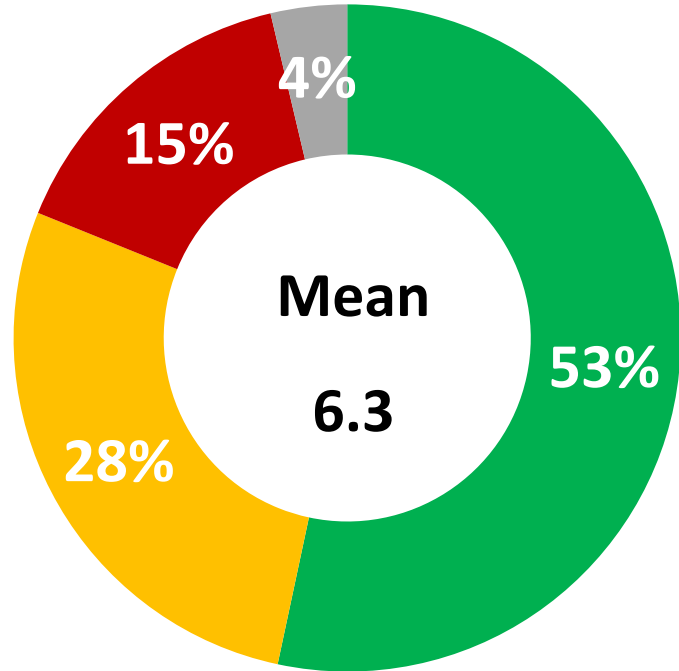

# METHODOLOGY

Nanos conducted an RDD dual frame (land- and cell-lines) hybrid telephone and online random survey of 1,049 Canadians, 18 years of age or older, between January 21<sup>st</sup> and 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2022 as part of an omnibus survey. Participants were randomly recruited by telephone using live agents and administered a survey online. The sample included both land- and cell-lines across Canada. The results were statistically checked and weighted by age and gender using the latest Census information and the sample is geographically stratified to be representative of Canada. Individuals randomly called using random digit dialing with a maximum of five call backs.

The margin of error for a random survey of 1,049 Canadians is  $\pm 3.0$  percentage points, 19 times out of 20.
