PROVINCIAL ISSUES OF CONCERN


Nanos conducted an RDD dual frame (land- and cell- lines) hybrid random survey of 423 residents of New-Brunswick, 18 years of age or older (300 surveys administered by telephone, 123 administered online), between April 7th and 11th, 2022.

The margin of error this survey is ± 4.8 percentage points, 19 times out of 20.

AT A GLANCE



Ballot – The latest Nanos N.B. provincial ballot tracking has the Liberals at 38.8 per cent, followed by the Progressive Conservatives at 36.6 per cent, the Greens at 14.2 per cent, and the NDP at 8.6 per cent.

Accessible Voters – Asked whether they would consider voting for each of the N.B. provincial parties, 53.5 per cent would consider voting Liberal, while 51.0 per cent of N.B. residents say they would consider voting Progressive Conservative. Four in ten (37.4%) would consider voting Green, and 29.5 per cent would consider voting Green.

Qualities of a Good Political Leader – More than half of N.B. residents per cent believe Blaine Higgs has the qualities of a good political leader (51.8%). Four in ten (44.6%) believe David Coon has the qualities of a good political leader, while 31.4 per cent say the same about Roger Melanson. One in ten (10.4%) believe Mackenzie Thomason has the qualities of a good political leader.

Preferred Premier – Nanos polling has Blaine Higgs as the preferred choice as N.B. Premier at 35.7 per cent of N.B. residents followed by David Coon (16.1%), Roger Melanson (12.8%), and Mackenzie Thomason (3.0%). Twenty-one per cent of residents were unsure whom they preferred and 11.2 per cent preferred none.








Question: Of the current provincial political party leaders, could you please rank your top two current preferences for Premier of New Brunswick? [ROTATE PARTY LEADERS]



METHODOLOGY



Nanos conducted a hybrid random survey of 423 residents of New Brunswick, 18 years of age or older, between April 7th and 11th, 2022 as part of an omnibus survey. Three hundred randomly selected individuals were recruited using a dual frame land- and cell-line RDD sample and administered the survey by live agents; 123 individuals were recruited by means of dual frame land- and cell-line RDD sample and administered the survey online.

The results were statistically checked and weighted by age and gender using the latest Census information and the sample is geographically stratified to be representative of Canada.

Individuals were randomly called using random digit dialling with a maximum of five call backs.

The margin of error for a random survey of 423 New Brunswick residents is ± 4.8 percentage points, 19 times out of 20.

Margin of Error for Research

Factoring the margin of error for the national random sample administered by Nanos, Liberal support may be as high as 36.0% or as low as 28.8%. Likewise, support for the Conservatives may be as high as 34.8% or as low as 27.6%.

Key Takeaways

1. All of the Nanos estimates were within the reported margin of error for the election call.
2. Both the Sat/Sun sample and the Sunday only election call samples showed a tight race which manifested itself in the final result.
3. The total error for the six parties plus Others is 7.8 for an average error of about 1.1 percent.


