

Nanos conducted an RDD dual frame (land- and celllines) hybrid telephone and online random survey of 500 residents of Ontario, 18 years of age or older, between May 7<sup>th</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup>, 2022 as part of a tracking survey. Participants were randomly recruited by telephone using live agents and were administered the survey online. The results were statistically checked and weighted by age and gender using the latest Census information and the sample is geographically stratified to be representative of Ontario.

Individuals were randomly called using random digit dialling with a maximum of five call backs.

The margin of error for a random survey of 500 Ontario residents is  $\pm 4.4$  percentage points, 19 times out of 20.

## **Margin of Error for Research**

Factoring the margin of error for the national random sample administered by Nanos, Liberal support may be as high as 36.0% or as low as 28.8%. Likewise, support for the Conservatives may be as high as 34.8% or as low as 27.6%.

## **Key Takeaways**

- 1. All of the Nanos estimates were within the reported margin of error for the election call.
