
Canadians are six times more likely to say that the next generation will have a lower standard of living rather than a higher standard of living.

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



About six in ten Canadians believe the next generation of Canadians will have a lower standard of living than they have today. Younger Canadians (18-34) are more likely to say it will be lower (67%) than older Canadians (55 plus: 59%).

Do you think the next generation of Canadians will have a standard of living that is higher, the same or lower than Canadians have today?

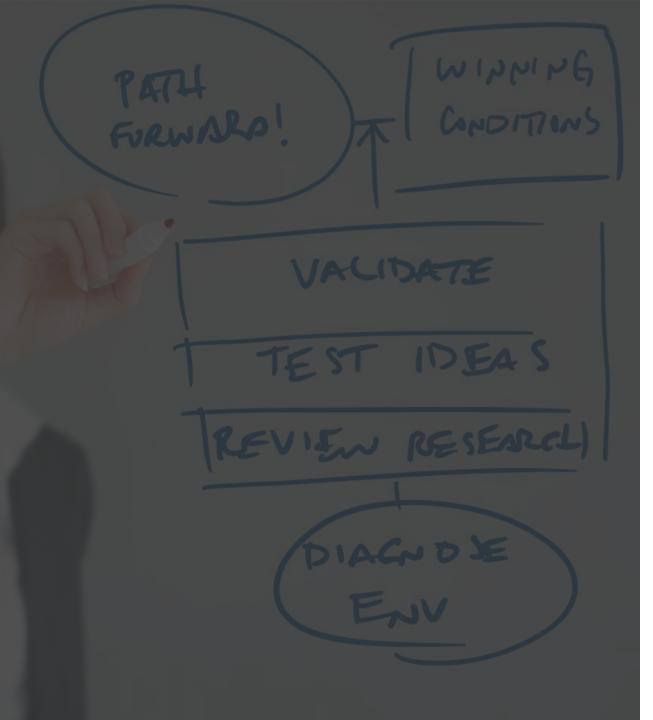

Nanos conducted an RDD dual frame (land- and celllines) hybrid telephone and online random survey of 1001 Canadians, 18 years of age or older, between May 26th and May 30th, 2022 as part of an omnibus survey. Participants were randomly recruited by telephone using live agents and administered a survey online.

The results were statistically checked and weighted by age and gender using the latest Census information and the sample is geographically stratified to be representative of Canada.

Individuals were randomly called using random digit dialing with a maximum of five call backs.

The margin of error for a random survey of 1001 Canadians is ± 3.1 percentage points, 19 times out of 20.

The research was conducted by Nanos Research.
