

A majority of Canadians are worried or somewhat worried that this Fall there will be another pandemic wave which will be serious enough to bring back restrictions; three in five report having no interest in travelling internationally this summer.

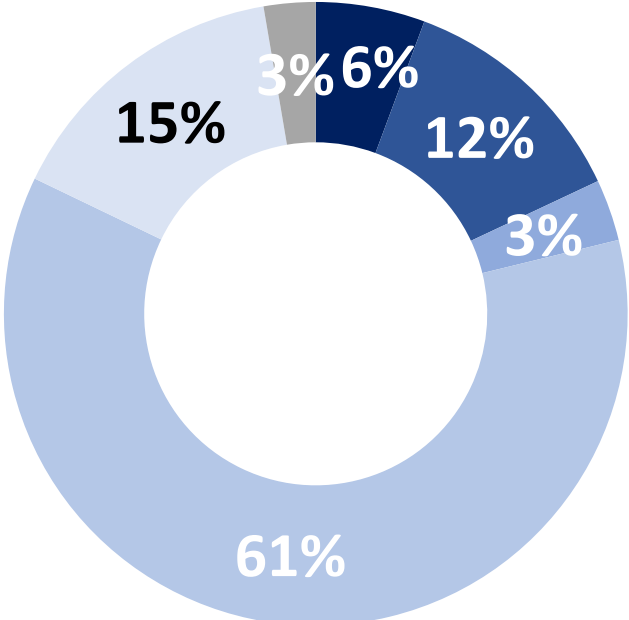


Nanos was retained by CTV News to conduct research among Canadians to gauge their travel plans this summer and their level of concern of another pandemic wave this Fall serious enough to bring back restrictions.

Nanos conducted an RDD dual frame (land- and cell-lines) hybrid telephone and online random survey of 1,002 Canadians, 18 years of age or older, between June 30th and July 4th, 2022 as part of an omnibus survey.

This study was commissioned by CTV News and the research was conducted by Nanos Research.

“ About three in five Canadians report having no interest in travelling internationally this summer (61%). Residents of the Atlantic provinces (70%) are more likely to say they have no interest in travelling than those from Ontario (58%) and B.C. (59%). Canadians aged 55 plus are most likely to say they have no interest in travelling internationally this summer (69%) compared to younger Canadians (18-34: 53%; 35-54: 58%). Those aged 18 to 34 are more than twice as likely to say they want to travel internationally but have no plans (22%) than those aged 55 plus (9%). ”

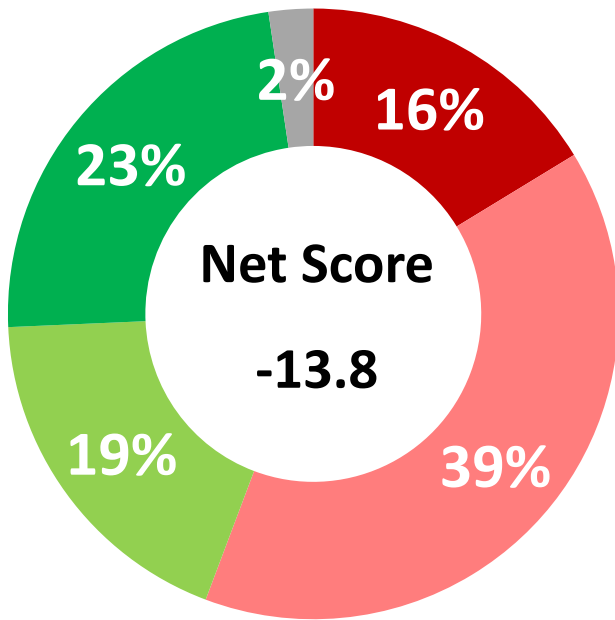

A majority of Canadians are worried (16%) or somewhat worried (39%) that this Fall there will be another pandemic wave which will be serious enough to bring back restrictions such as mandatory mask wearing, social distancing and the limiting of gatherings, while about two in five are not worried (23%) or somewhat not worried (19%).

METHODOLOGY



Nanos conducted an RDD dual frame (land- and cell-lines) hybrid telephone and online random survey of 1,002 Canadians, 18 years of age or older, between June 30th and July 4th, 2022 as part of an omnibus survey. Participants were randomly recruited by telephone using live agents and administered a survey online. The sample included both land- and cell-lines across Canada. The results were statistically checked and weighted by age and gender using the latest Census information and the sample is geographically stratified to be representative of Canada.

Individuals randomly called using random digit dialling with a maximum of five call backs.

The margin of error for this survey is ± 3.1 percentage points, 19 times out of 20.

This study was commissioned by CTV News and the research was conducted by Nanos Research.
