



Majority of Canadians feel anger over Hockey Canada using registration fees to pay out sexual assault allegations; situation leaves a negative impact on Canadians' impression of hockey and hockey players.

Key Findings

FEELINGS ABOUT HOCKEY CANADA USING REGISTRATION FEES FOR SETTLEMENTS

Most Canadians say they feel anger (73%) about the situation in which Hockey Canada used a portion of registration fees for a fund inside Hockey Canada used to pay out settlements for sexual assault allegations. Under two in ten say they feel disinterest (14%) and two per cent say they feel satisfaction, while 11 per cent are unsure. Women (81%) were more likely to say they feel anger about this than men (65%).

IMPACT OF HOCKEY CANADA ALLEGATIONS

The recent allegations of sexual assault involving members of Canada's world junior hockey team have had a net negative impact on Canadians' impression of hockey as a sport (41% negative impact, 24% somewhat negative impact) and on hockey players in Canada (47% negative impact, 28% somewhat negative impact). Six in ten Canadians (58%) say they have no confidence in Hockey Canada's leadership today.

SEXUAL MISCONDUCT AS A CULTURAL PROBLEM

Nearly six in ten Canadians (59%) view sexual misconduct as a possible cultural problem in player development leagues that feed the NHL (score of 7-10), while nearly one in two say the same about professional hockey such as the NHL (47%). They are split on whether or not it is a problem at the recreational level (32% see it as a problem, 28% don't see it as a problem). Women were more likely to view sexual misconduct as problem in the three levels of hockey than men.

SUPPORT FOR USING REGISTRATION FEES TO PAY OUT SEXUAL ASSAULT ALLEGATIONS

Most Canadians oppose (71%) or somewhat oppose (13%) Hockey Canada using a portion of hockey registration fees to pay out settlements for sexual assault allegations.

Just under one in ten support (four per cent) or somewhat support (five per cent) this.

Levels of support are consistent across demographic groups.

PERSONAL VIEWS ON THE SEVERITY OF THE PROBLEM

Canadians are over twice as likely to say that allegations about sexual assaults in hockey are part of a bigger cultural problem (63%) rather than about an isolated handful of players (26%).

Twelve per cent were unsure. Men (36%) were more likely than women (16%) to say that these allegations about sexual assaults in hockey are about an isolated handful of players.

IMPACT ON LIKELIHOOD OF HAVING CHILDREN PLAY HOCKEY

Canadians with children are most likely to say these allegations have no impact on their likelihood of having their children play hockey (55%), while almost four in ten say they are less likely to have their children play hockey. Close to one in two women (49%) who have children say they are less likely to have their children play hockey compared to under one in three men (31%).

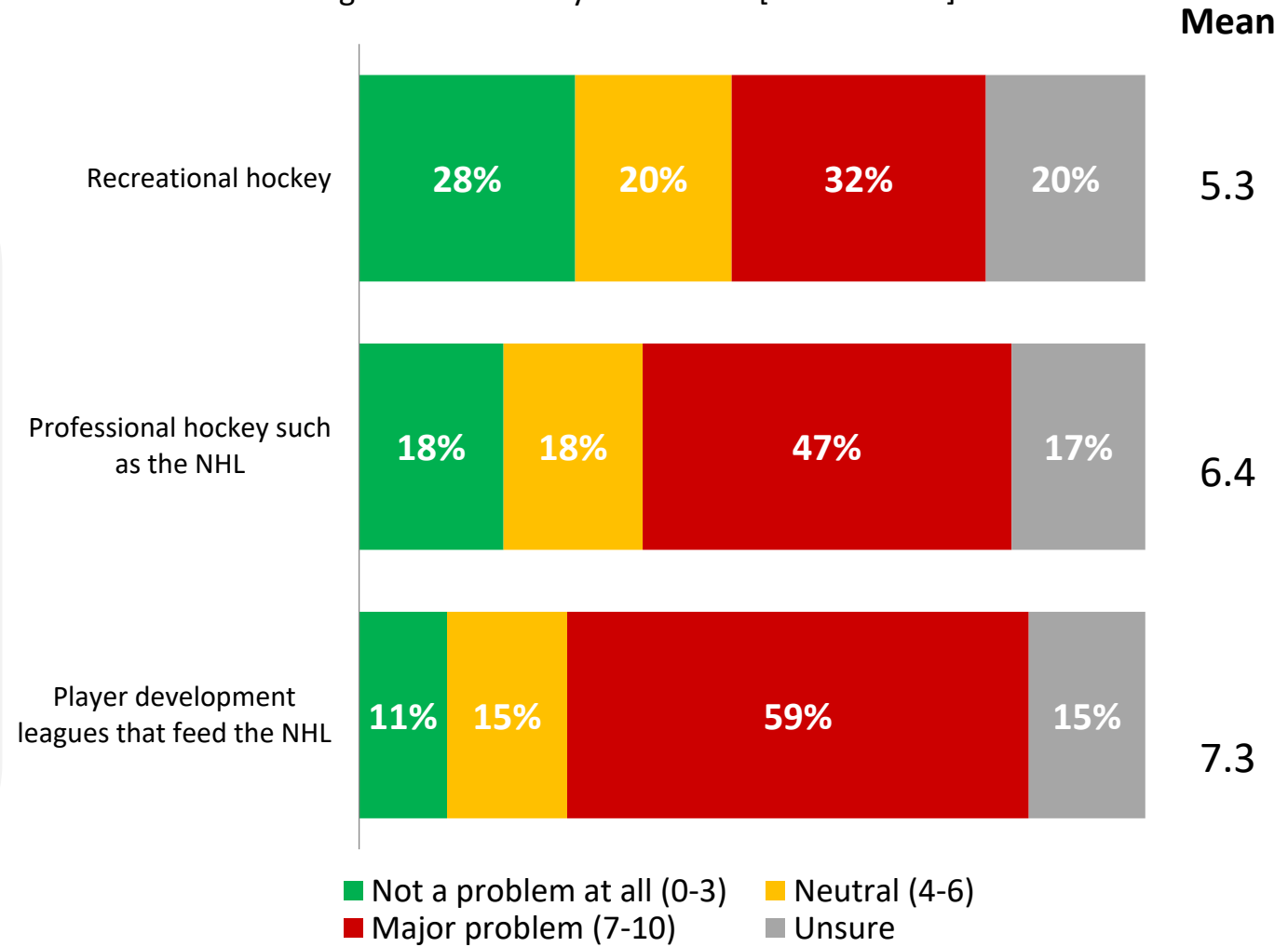

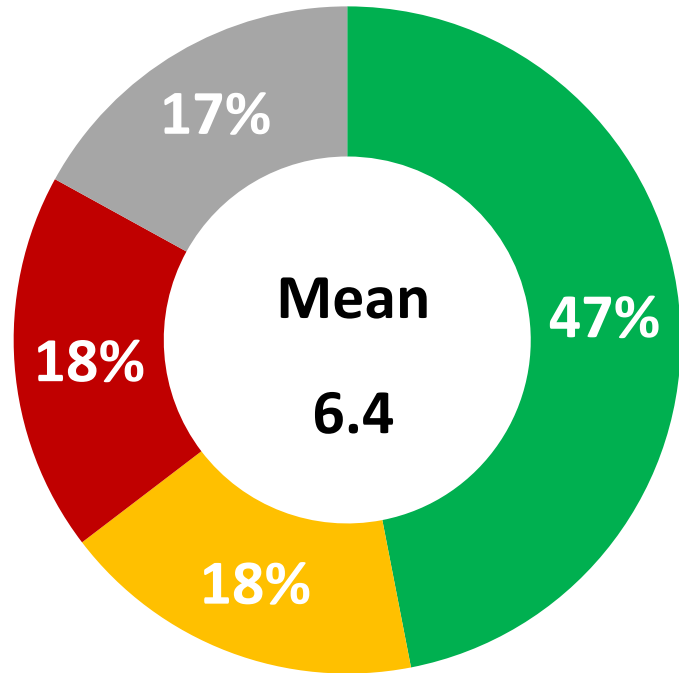

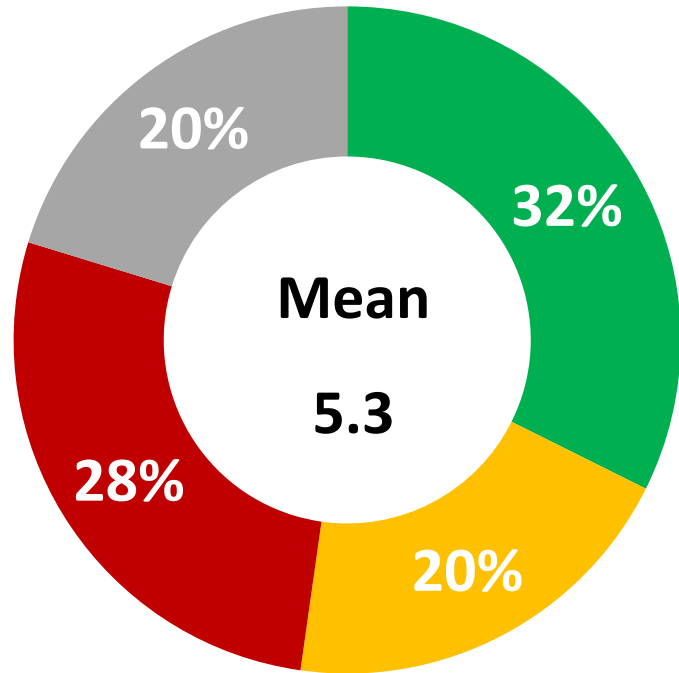

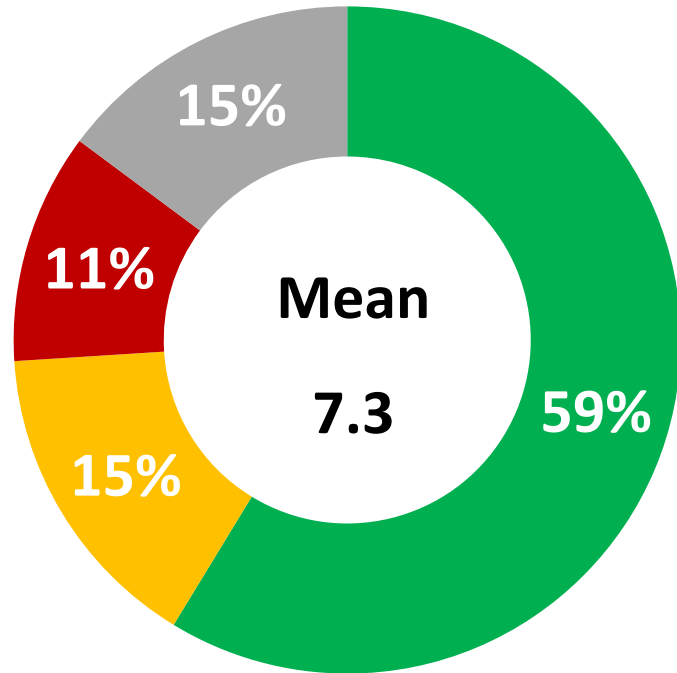

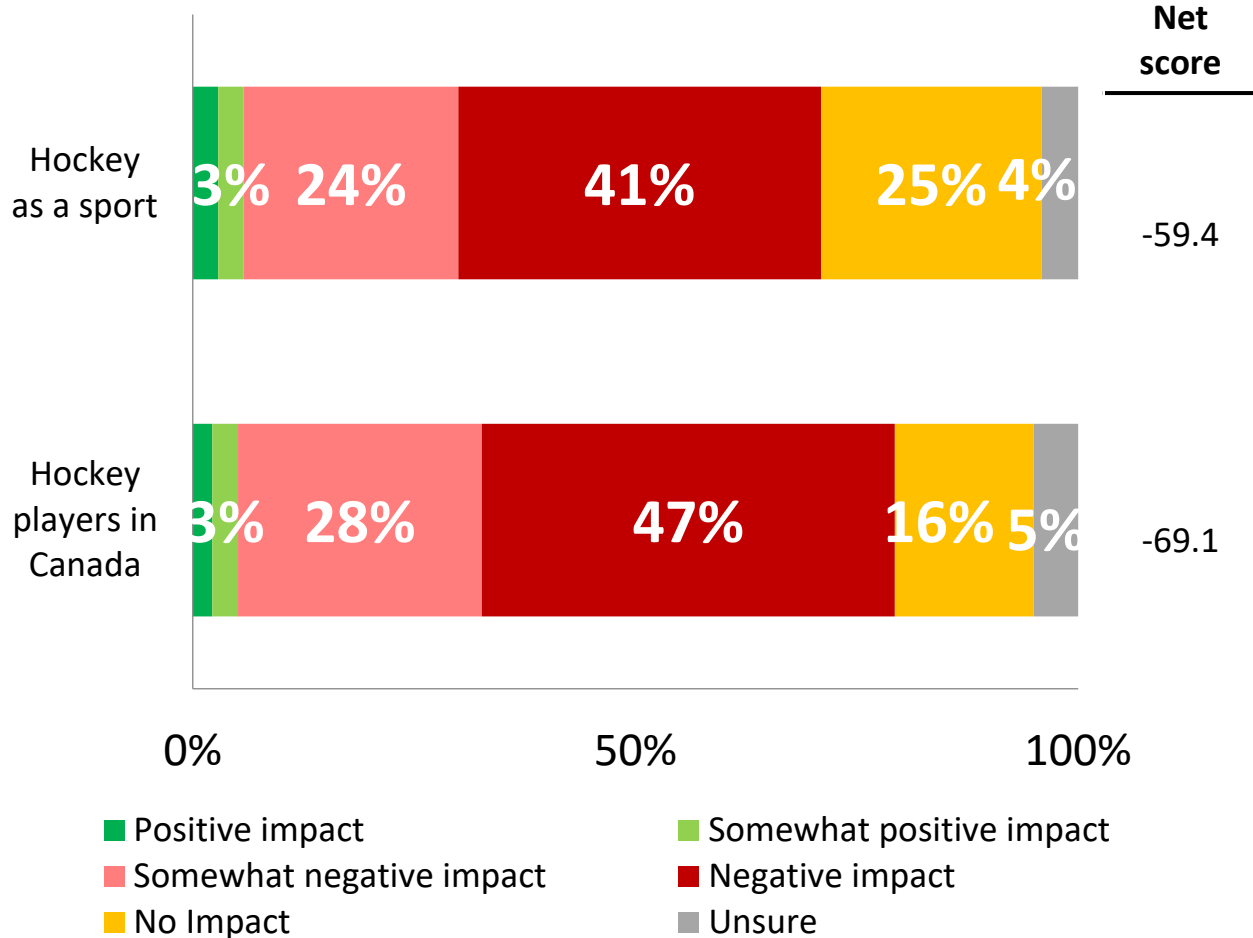

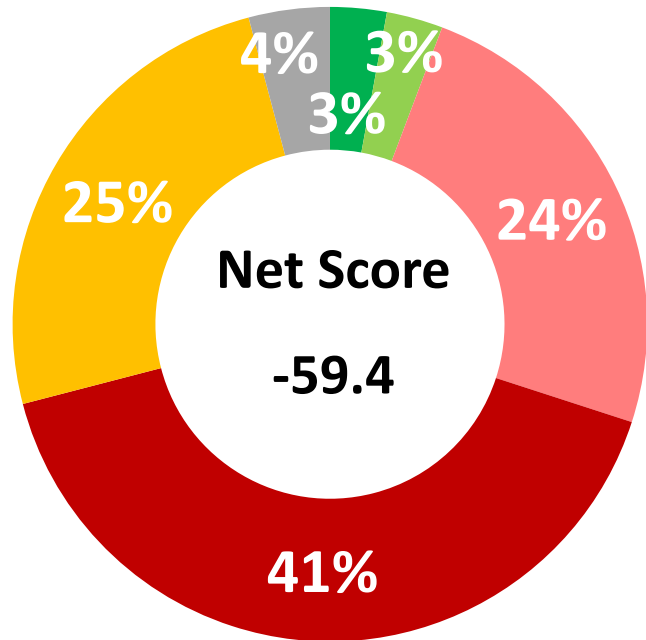

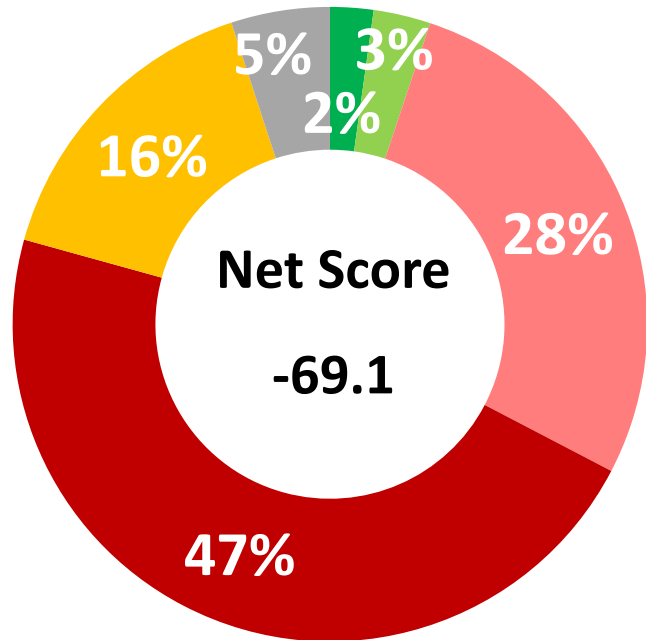

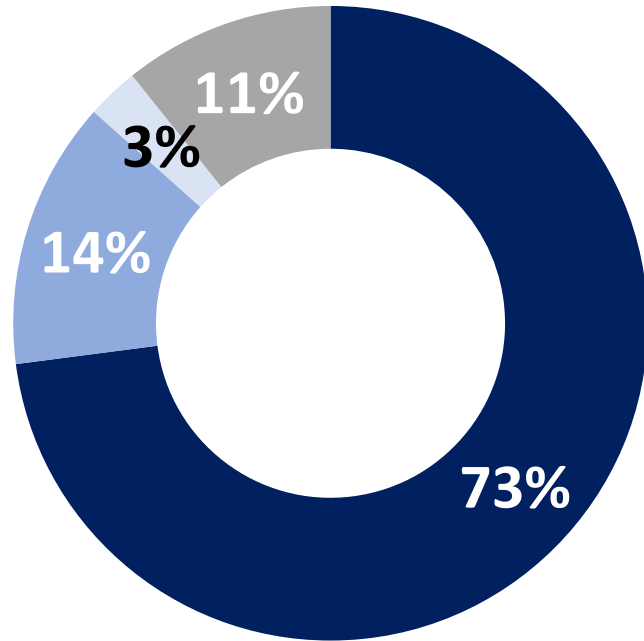

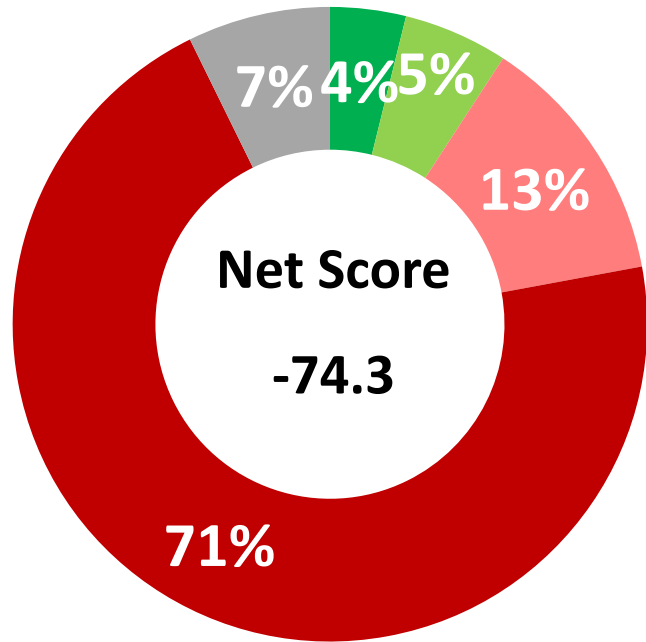

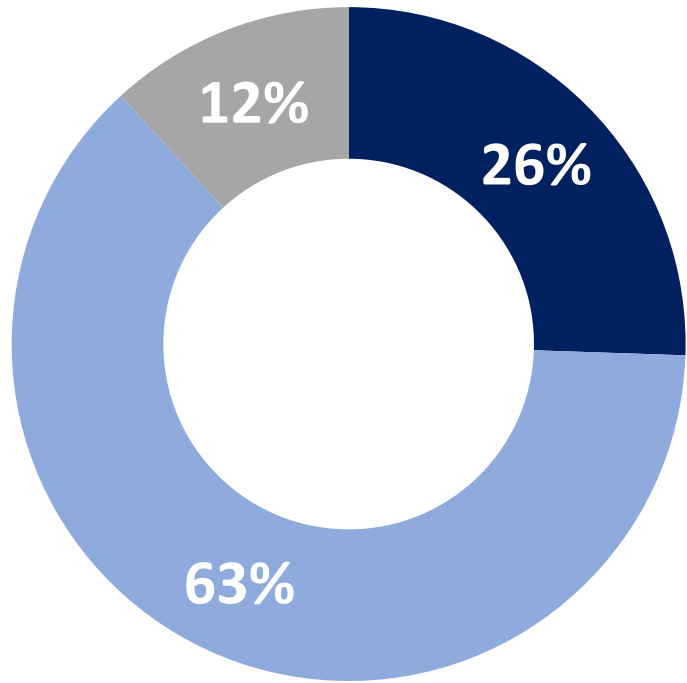

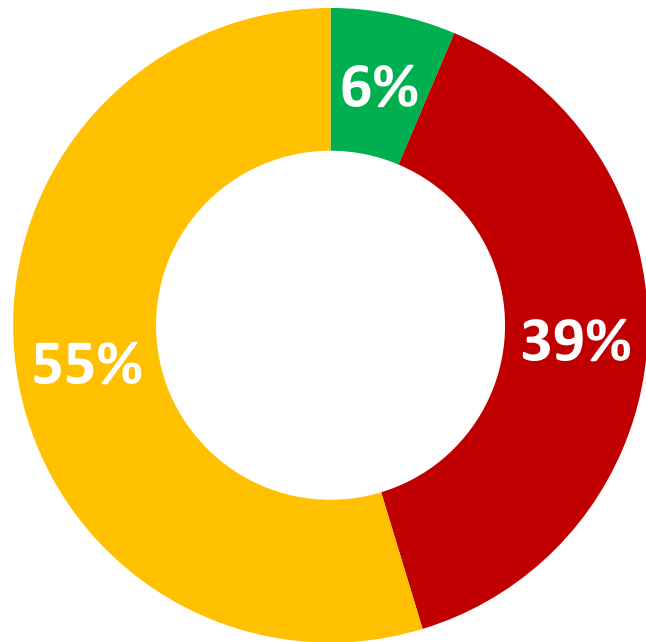

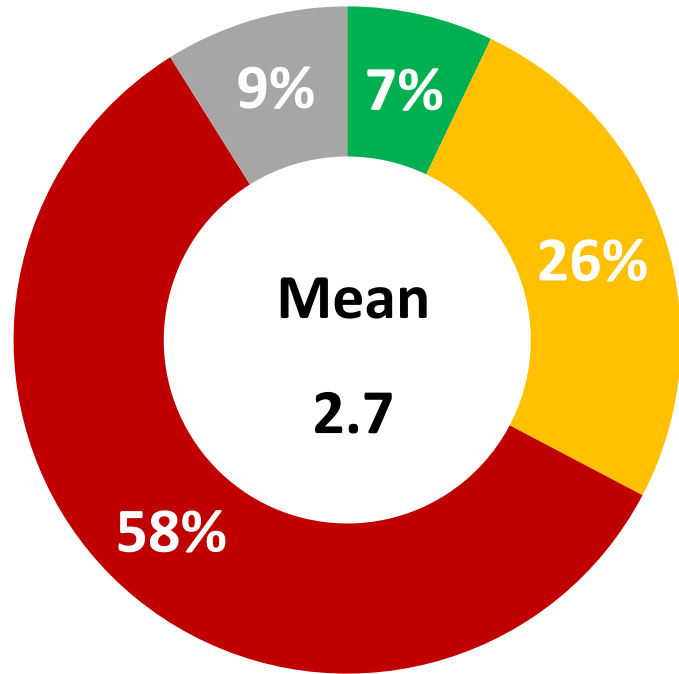

Nanos conducted an RDD dual frame (land- and cell-lines) hybrid telephone and online random survey of 1,038 Canadians, 18 years of age or older, between July 29th and August 2nd, 2022 as part of an omnibus survey. Participants were randomly recruited by telephone using live agents and administered a survey online. The sample included both land- and cell-lines across Canada. The results were statistically checked and weighted by age and gender using the latest Census information and the sample is geographically stratified to be representative of Canada.

Individuals randomly called using random digit dialing with a maximum of five call backs.

The margin of error for this survey is ± 3.1 percentage points, 19 times out of 20.

This study was commissioned by CTV News and the Globe and Mail, and the research was conducted by Nanos Research.
