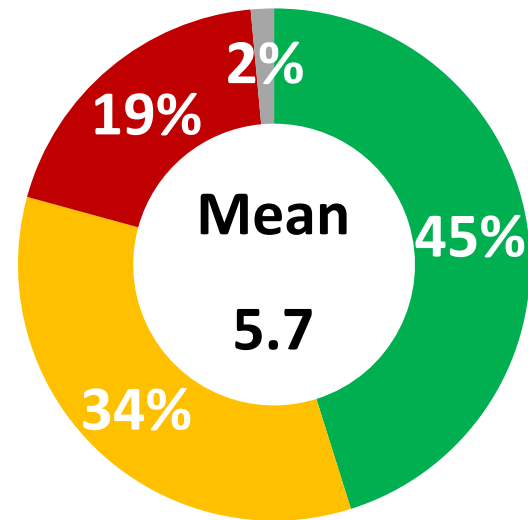

Reason for opinion

Canadians who rate Canada's democracy as healthy often cite that things are fine and we have democracy and freedoms (27%), followed by having well-run elections and freedom to vote (16%).

Those who view our democracy as unhealthy mention the current government and Prime Minister as the reason (20%), followed by freedoms and rights being threatened (19%) and the need for electoral reform (12%).

METHODOLOGY

Nanos conducted an RDD dual frame (land- and cell-lines) hybrid telephone and online random survey of 1,084 Canadians, 18 years of age or older, between October 30th and November 4th, 2022 as part of an omnibus survey. Participants were randomly recruited by telephone using live agents and administered a survey online.

The sample included both land- and cell-lines across Canada. The results were statistically checked and weighted by age and gender using the latest Census information and the sample is geographically stratified to be representative of Canada.

Individuals randomly called using random digit dialling with a maximum of five call backs.

The margin of error for this survey is ± 3.0 percentage points, 19 times out of 20.

This study was commissioned by the Globe and Mail and the research was conducted by Nanos Research.
