

Hybrid work more preferred than in-person full time for Canadian federal public servants.

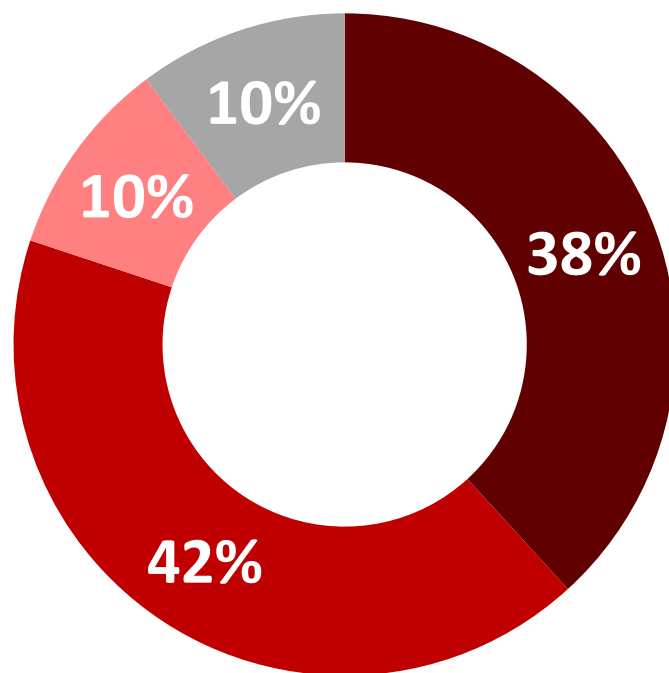
CANADIANS SPLIT ON WHETHER THEY THINK PUBLIC SERVANTS ARE MOST PRODUCTIVE WHEN WORKING PARTLY AT HOME OR FULL TIME IN-PERSON

Four in ten Canadians says that federal public servants are the most productive when they are working partly at home and partly in person (42%), while 38 per cent of Canadians say that public servants are the most productive when working full time in-person. Residents of the prairies are more likely to say public servants are the most productive working full time in-person (53%).

FEDERAL PUBLIC SERVANTS HAVING THE OPTION OF WORKING FROM HOME PART OF THE TIME MOST PREFERRED PATH FORWARD

More Canadians say they would prefer that federal public servants have the option of working from home part of the time (50%) compared to three in ten who would prefer public servants being required to work in-person full time (30%). Fourteen per cent would prefer public servants having the option to work from home all the time. Residents of the Prairies (46%) and older Canadians (aged 35-54: 36%; aged 55 plus: 32%) were most likely to prefer requiring public servants to work in-person full time.

Most productive work arrangement for federal public servants

Canadians are split on whether federal public servants are the most productive working partly from home and partly in person at the workplace (42%) or working full-time in person at the workplace (38%). One in ten Canadians say federal public servants are most productive working full-time from home.

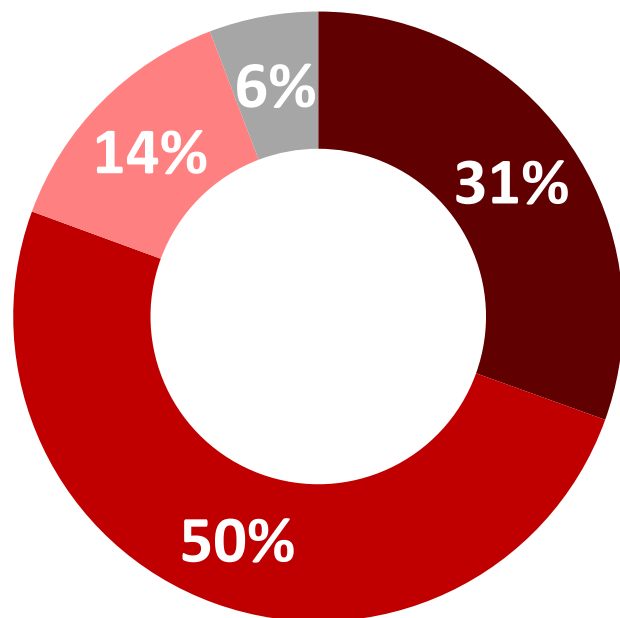

METHODOLOGY

Nanos conducted an RDD dual frame (land- and cell-lines) hybrid telephone and online random survey of 1,021 Canadians, 18 years of age or older, between December 19th and 22nd, 2022 as part of an omnibus survey. Participants were randomly recruited by telephone using live agents and administered a survey online. The sample included both land- and cell-lines across Canada. The results were statistically checked and weighted by age and gender using the latest Census information and the sample is geographically stratified to be representative of Canada.

Individuals randomly called using random digit dialling with a maximum of five call backs.

The margin of error for this survey is ± 3.1 percentage points, 19 times out of 20.

This study was commissioned by the Globe and Mail and the research was conducted by Nanos Research.
