

Satisfaction with Canada as a country continues to decline - Universities and health system seen as top contributors to Canada being a better country, political institutions rated lowest.

# Key Findings

1

## Two thirds of Canadians are satisfied with Canada as a country

About two in three Canadians say they are satisfied ([64%](#)) with Canada as a country (mean score of [6.6](#) out of 10), which is a decrease compared to 2021 (mean of [7.2](#)).

## Younger Canadians report lowest level of satisfaction with Canada as a country

Younger Canadians (18-34) report the lowest level of satisfaction (mean of [5.8](#)) with Canada as a country compared to all other demographics, especially older Canadians (55 plus) (mean of [7.2](#)) who report the highest satisfaction level.

## Education and Health system remain top contributors to Canada being a better country

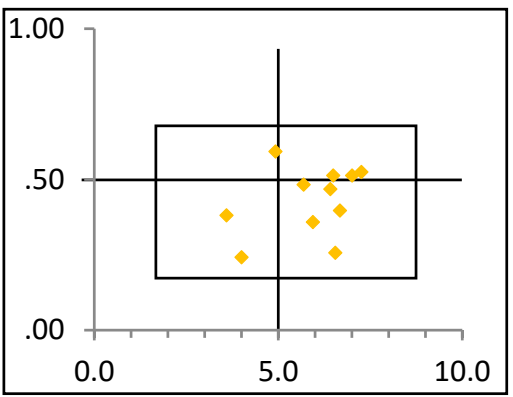
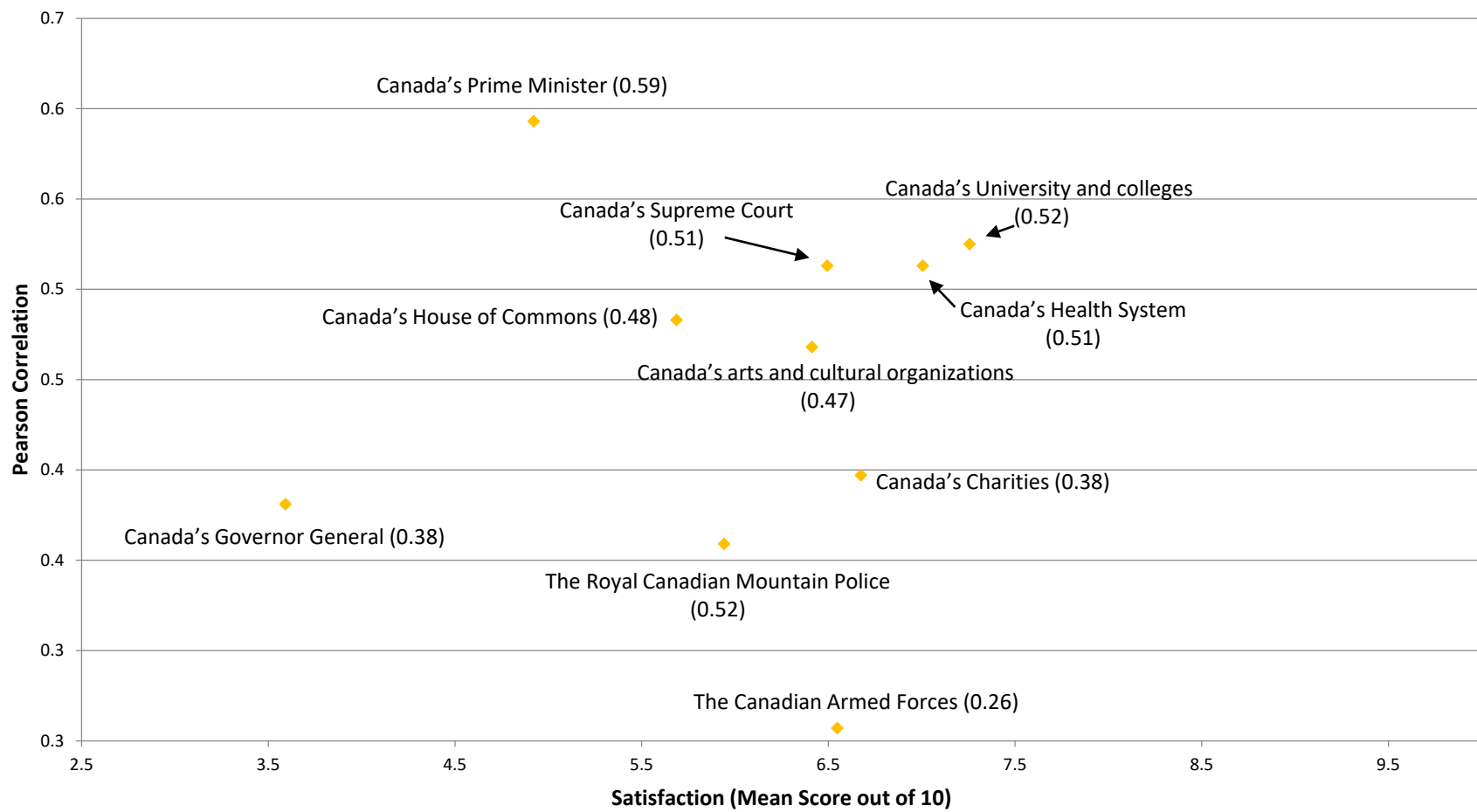
Canada's universities and colleges (mean of [7.3](#)) and Canada's health system (mean of [7.0](#)) are ranked as top major contributors to Canada being a better country.

## Political institutions lowest contributors to Canada being a better country

Canadians rate political institutions including the House of Commons (mean of [5.7](#)), the prime minister (mean of [4.9](#)), the Senate (mean of [4.1](#)) and the Governor General (mean of [3.6](#)) the lowest on the list of contributors. Of note, the Governor General was the only institution to show year by year improvement

# Driver Analysis



The Pearson Correlation score indicates the relationship between the satisfaction with Canada as a country and impressions of contributors to Canada being a better country. A value of +1 is total positive linear correlation, 0 is no linear correlation, and -1 is total negative linear correlation.

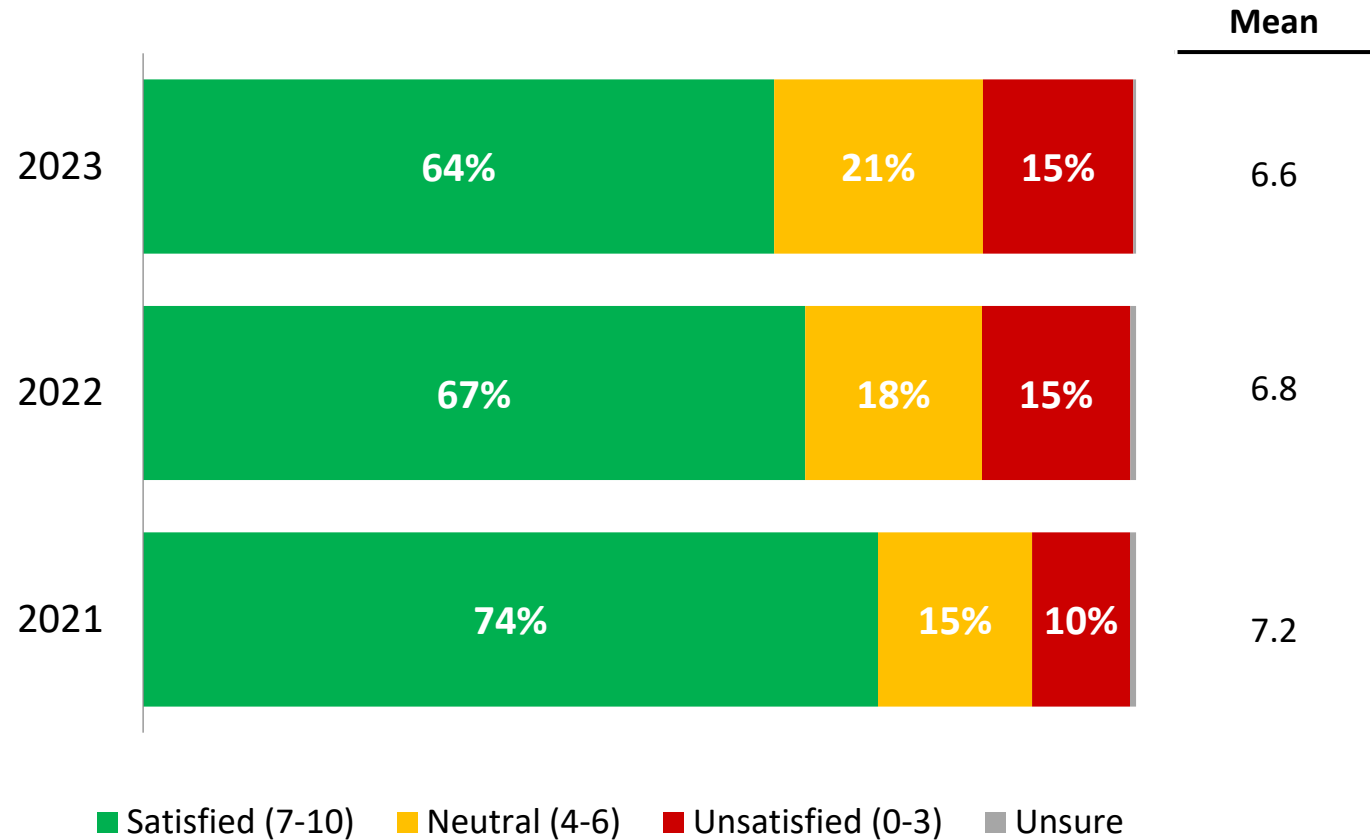
All of the variables have a score between +0.59 and +0.24, meaning there is a positive relationship, but not a strong one.

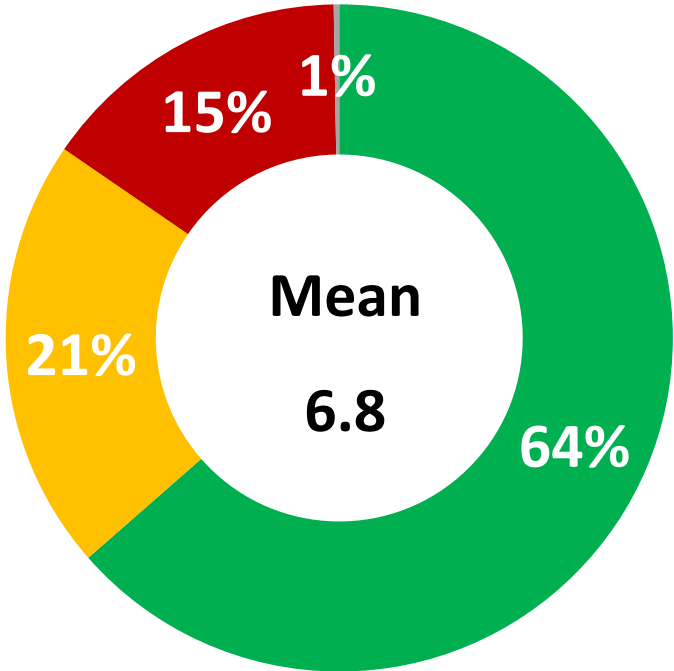

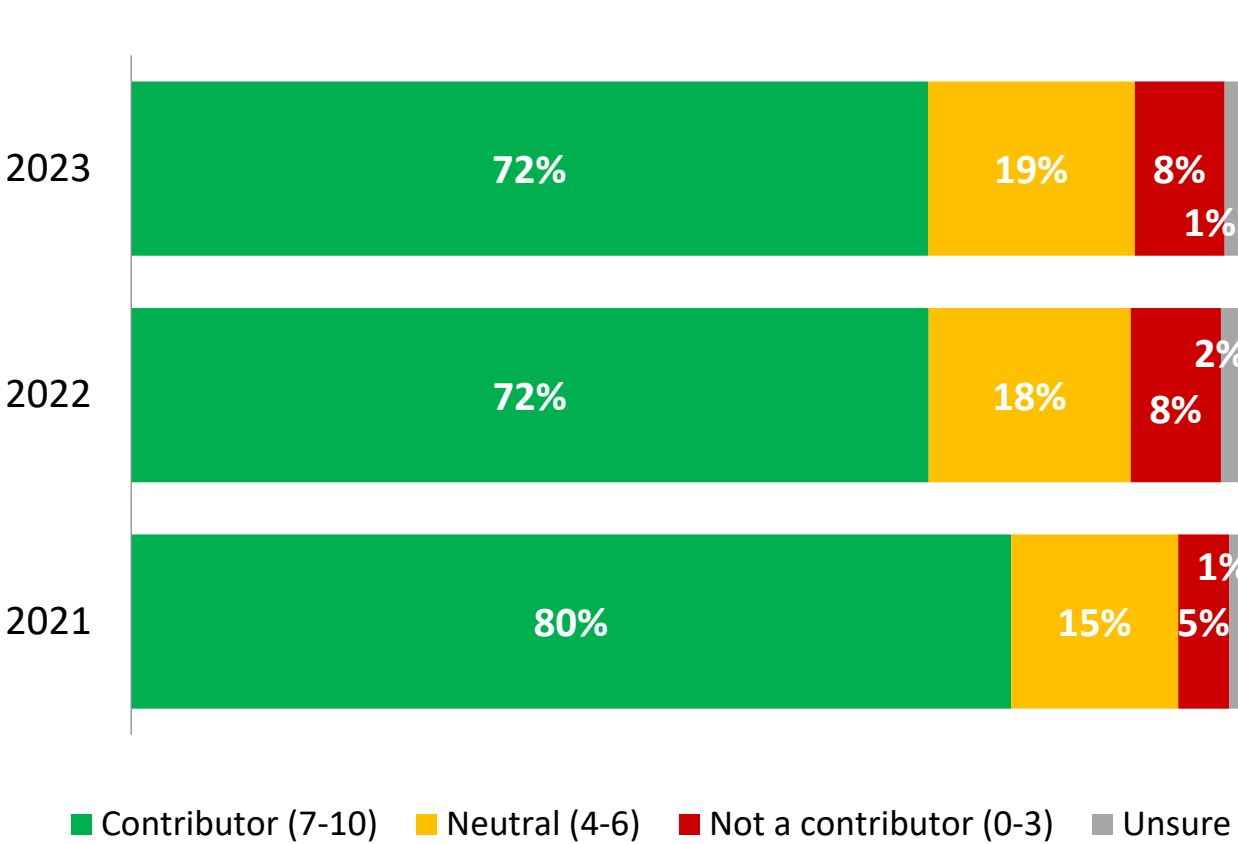

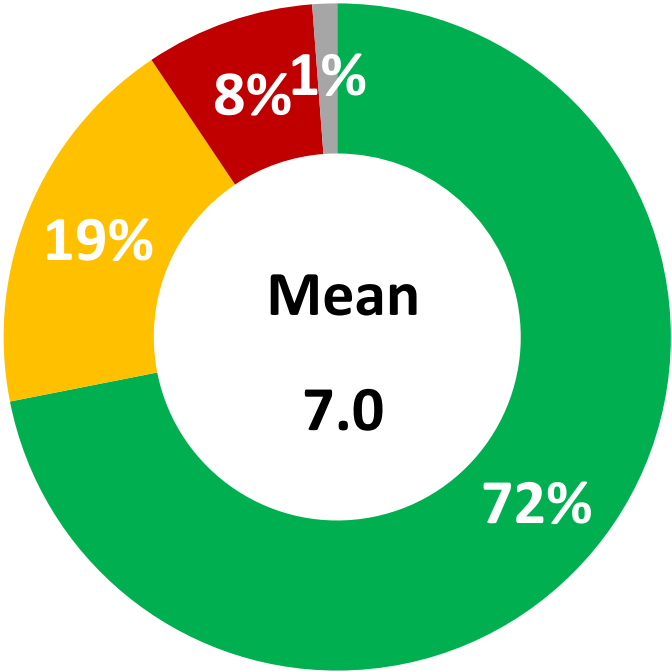

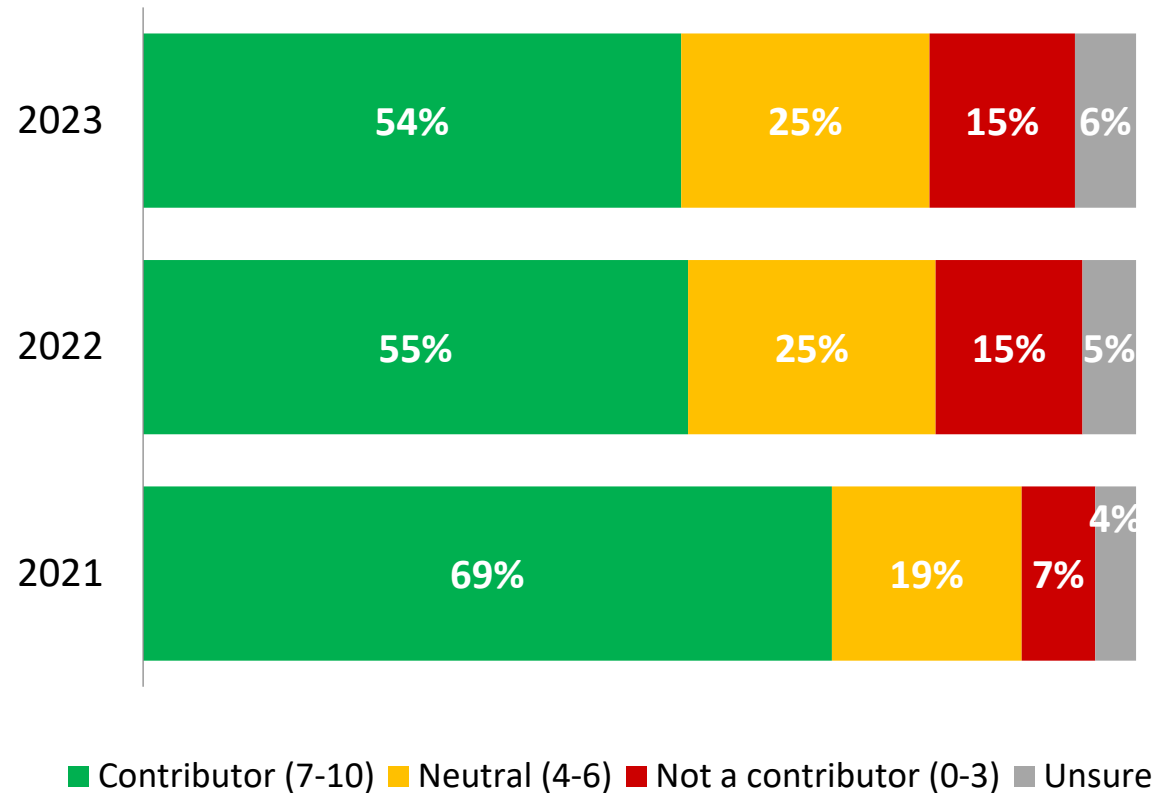

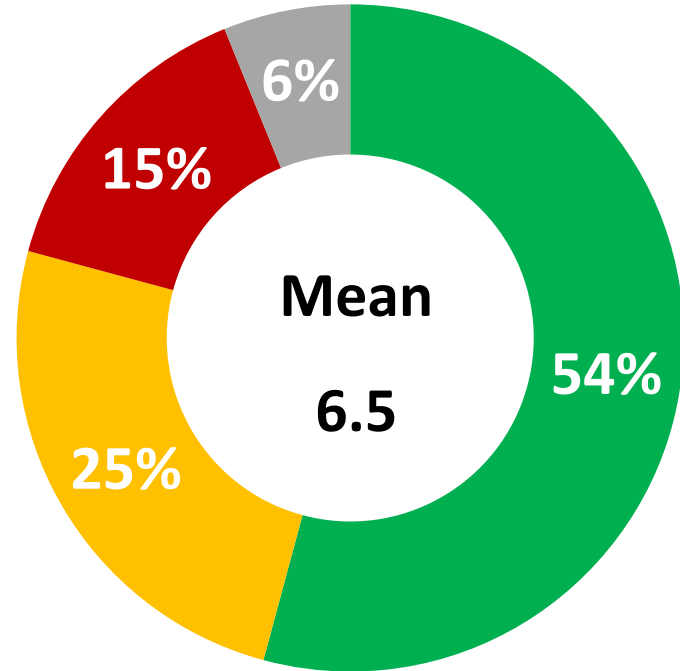

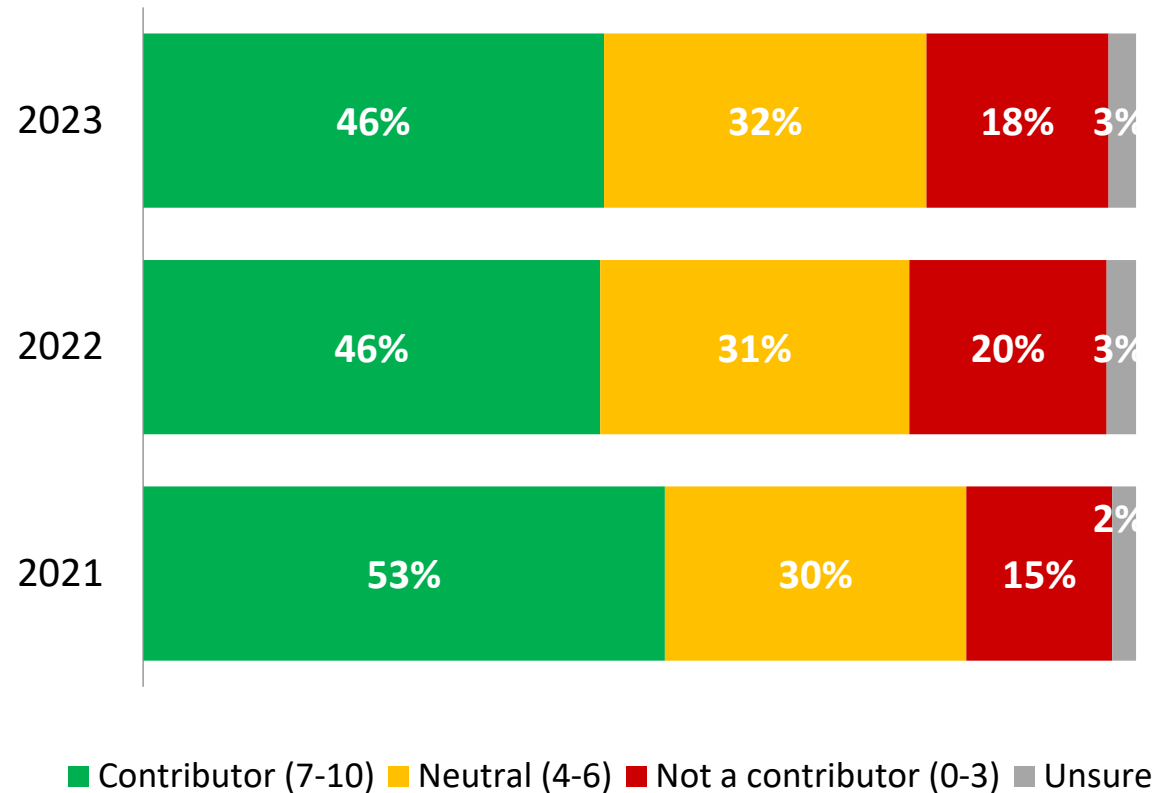

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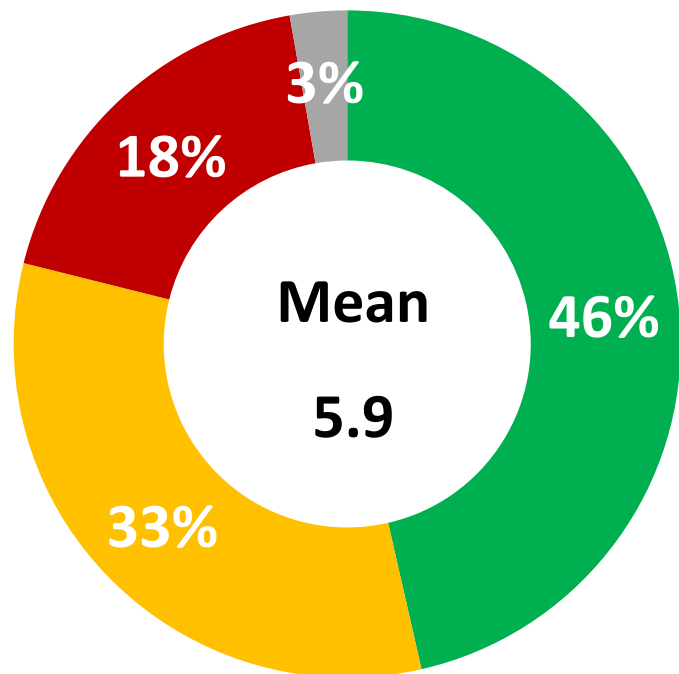

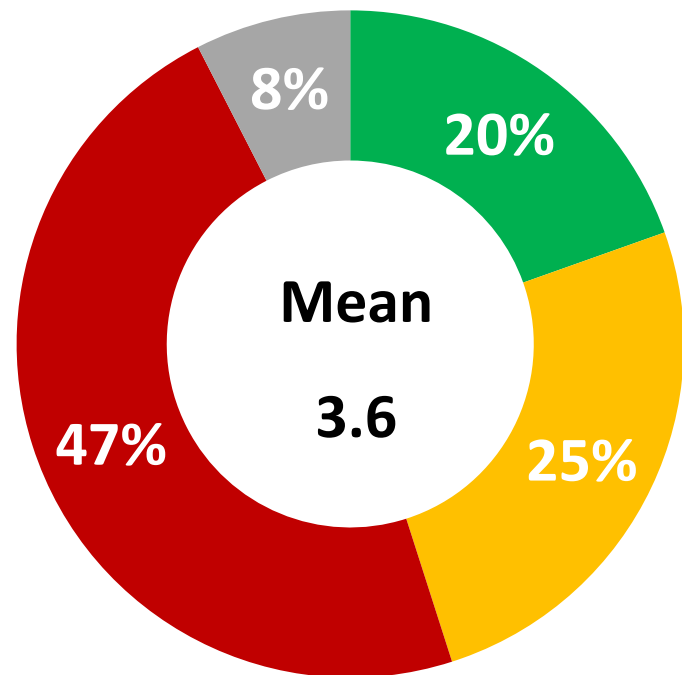

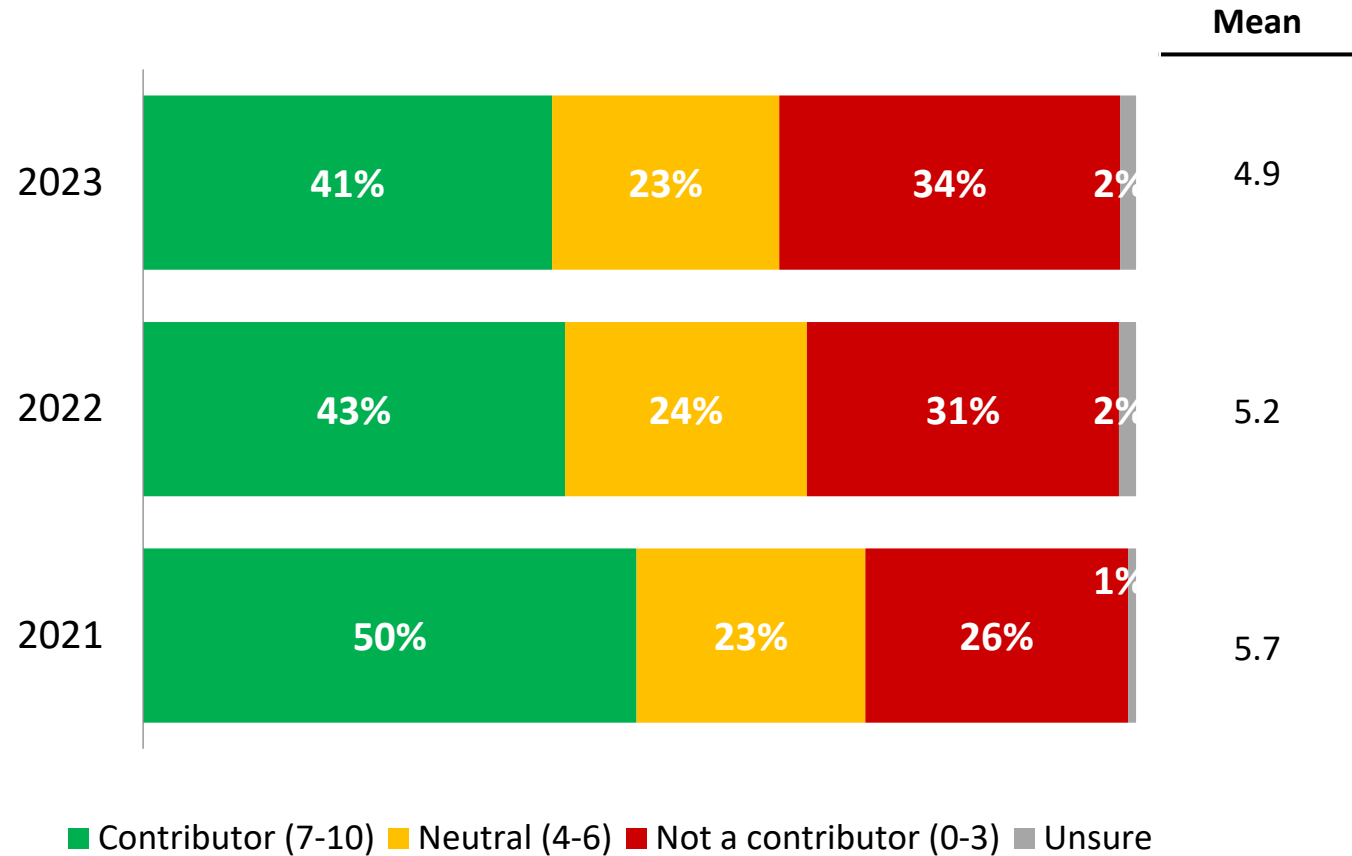

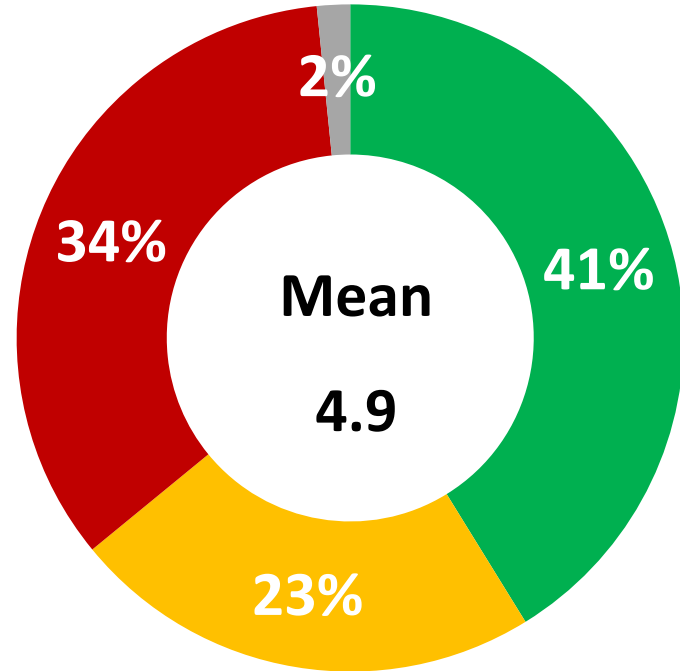

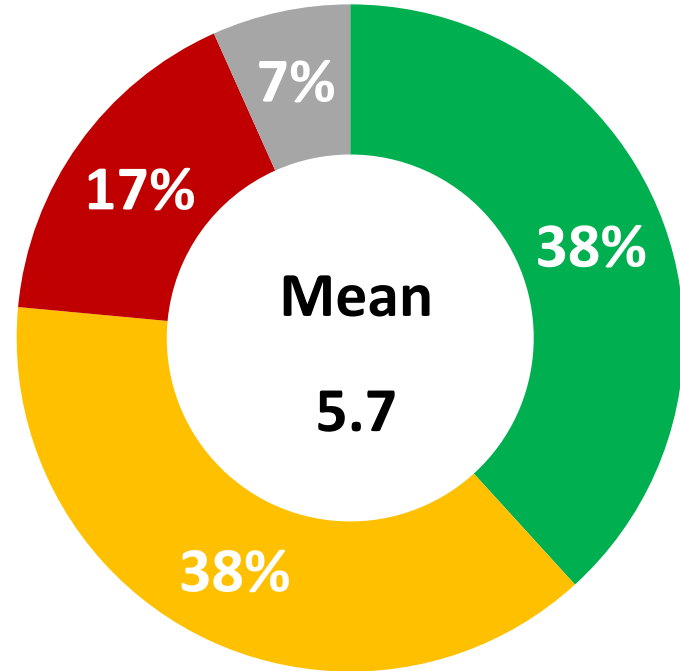

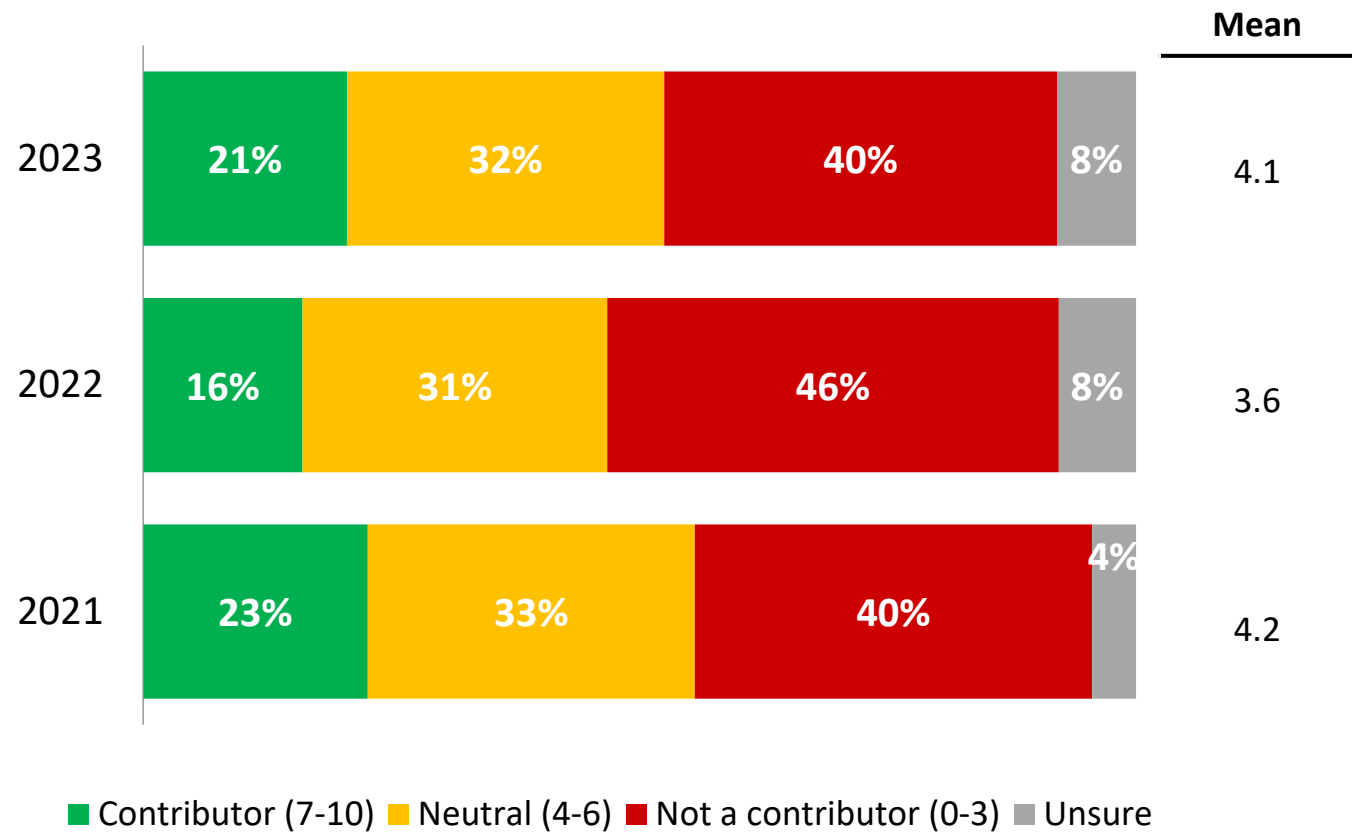

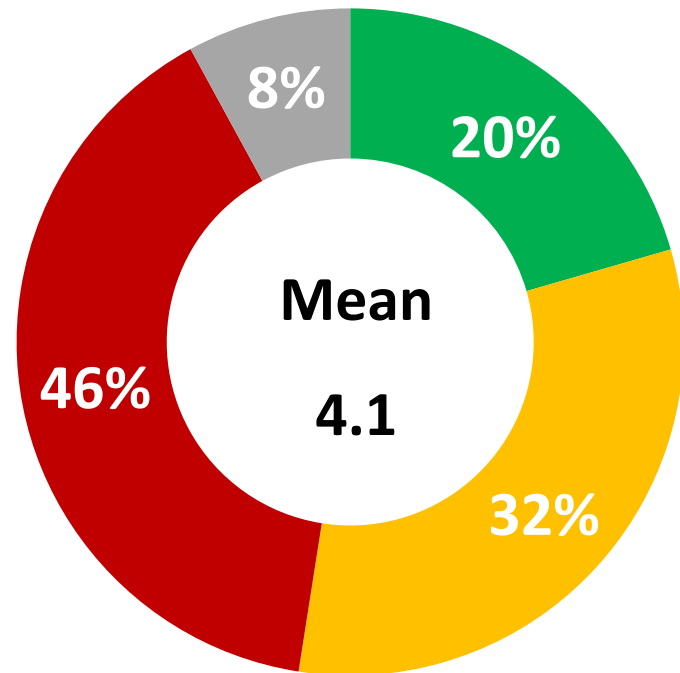

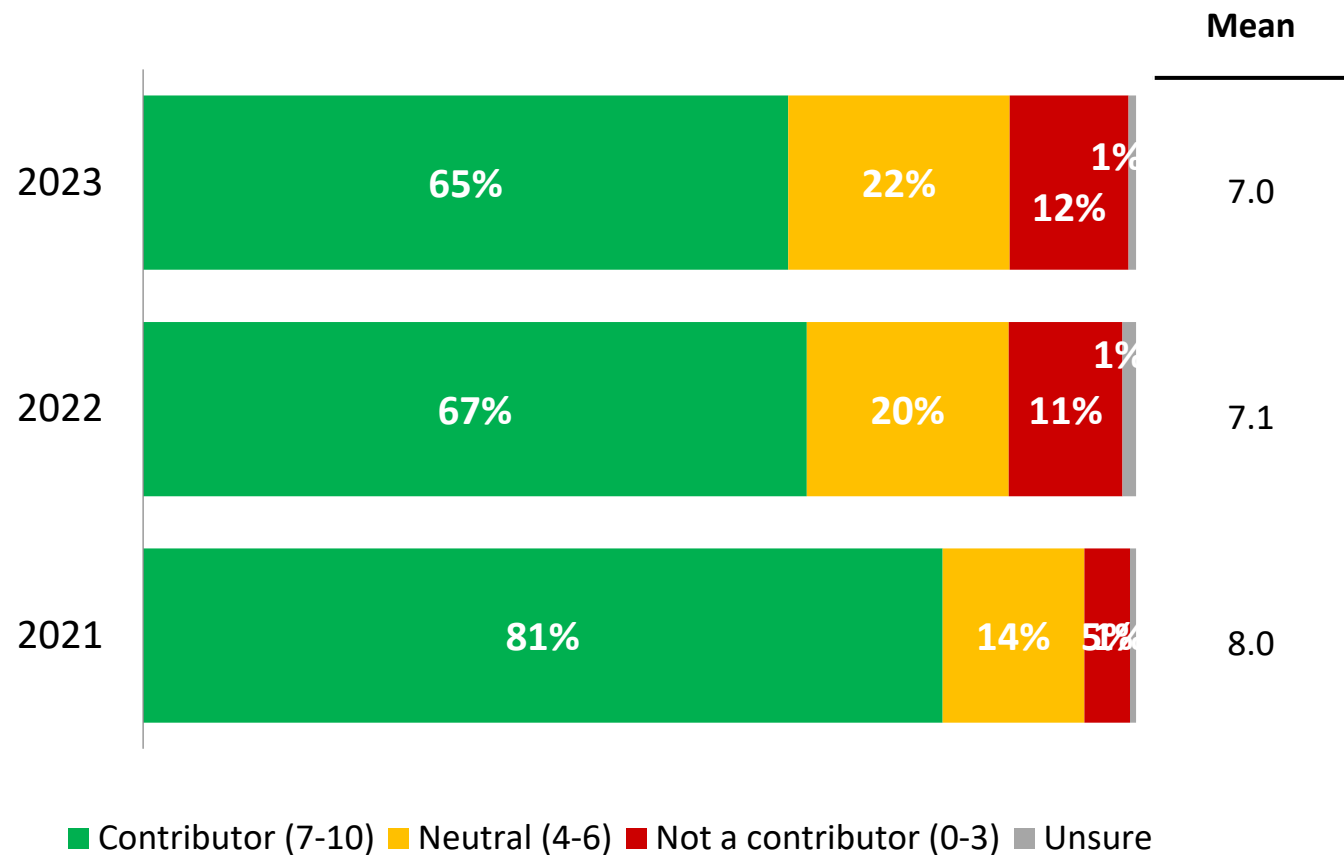

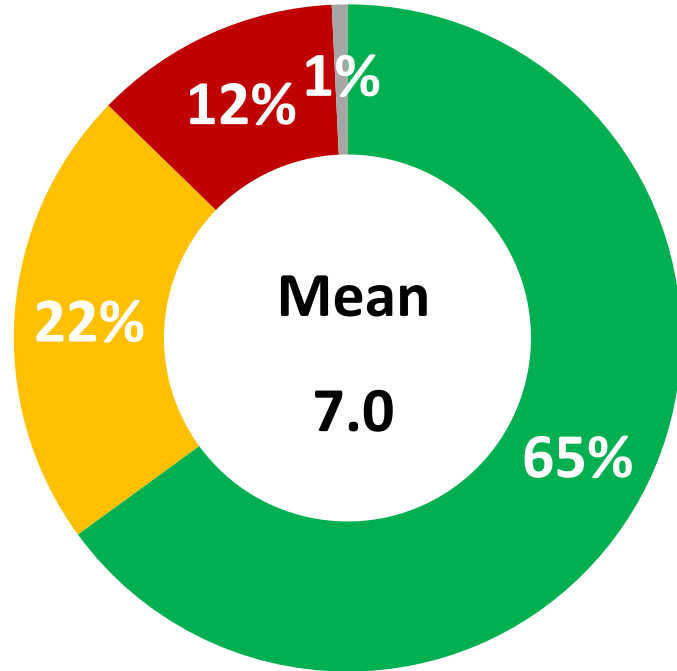

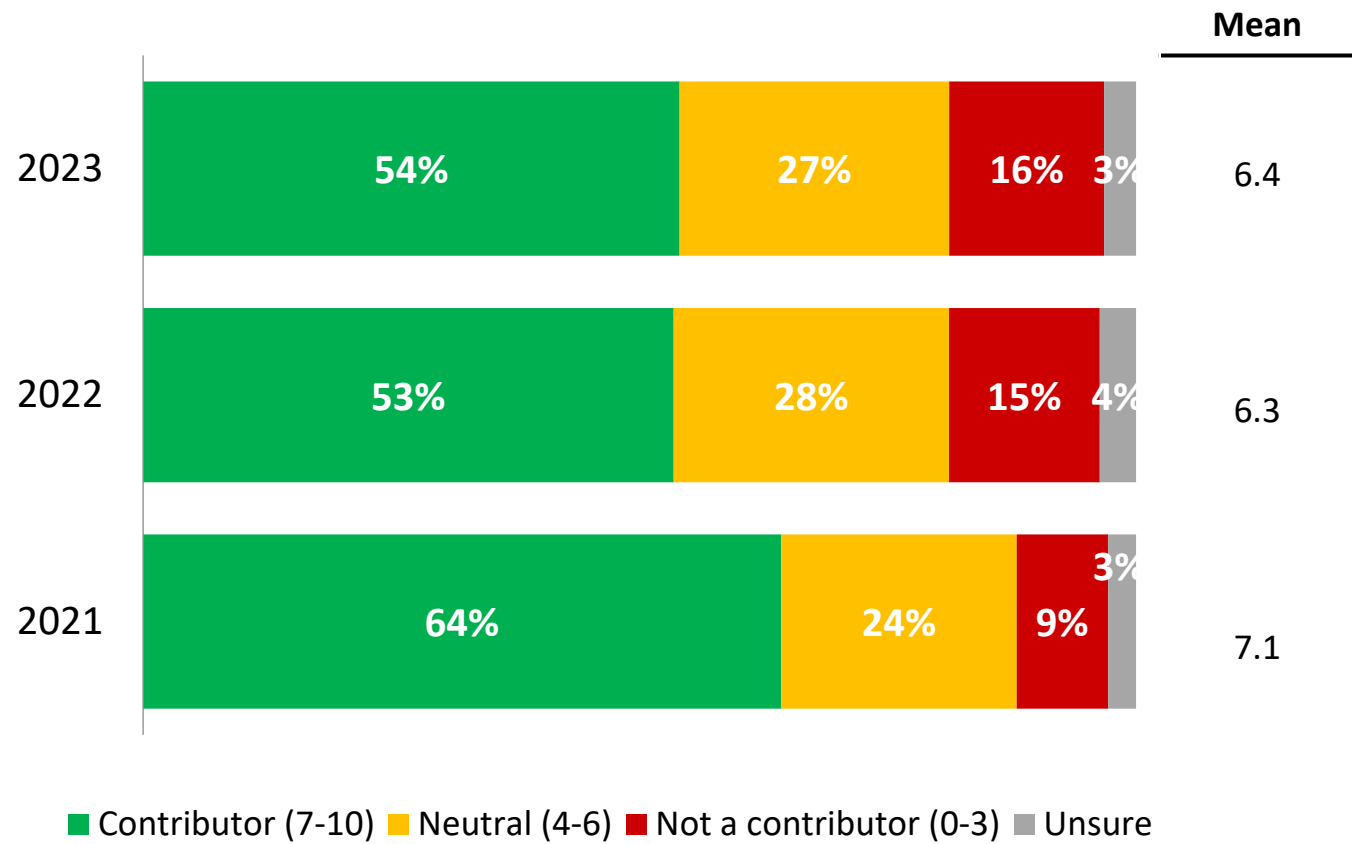

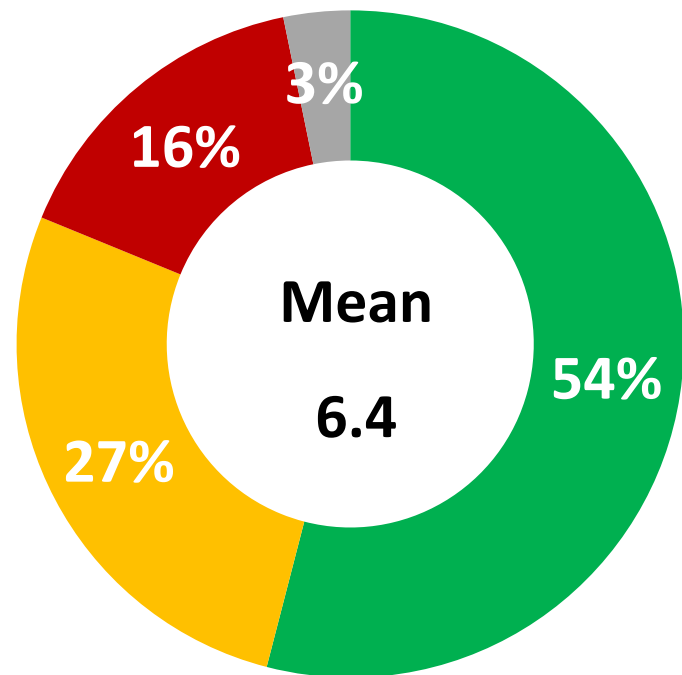

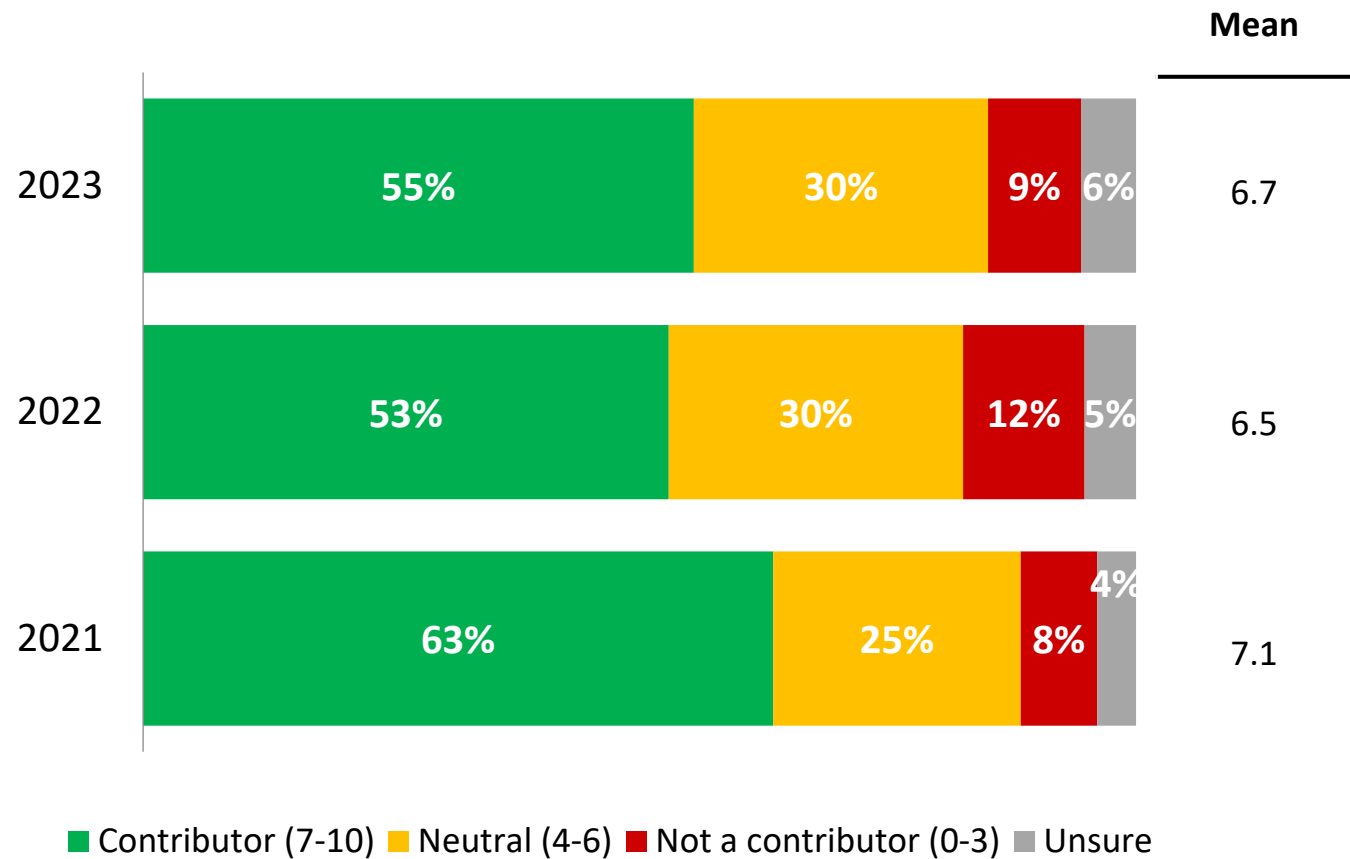

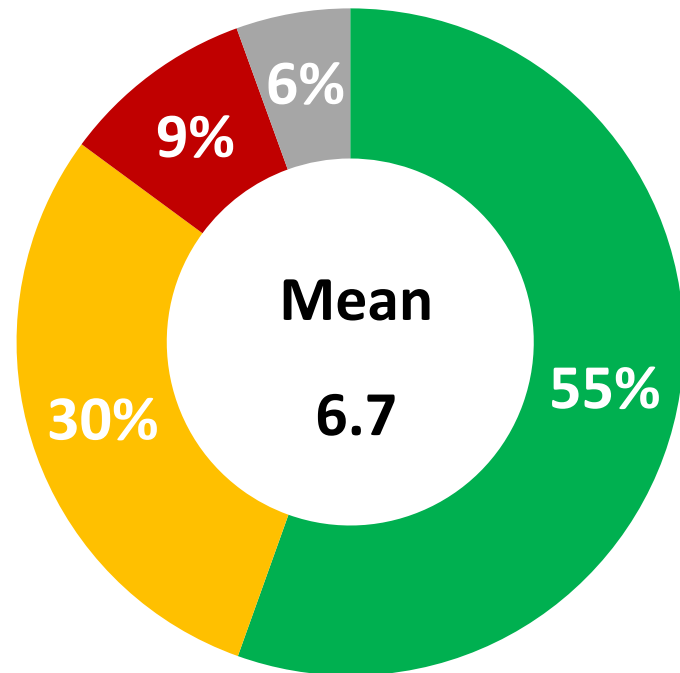

# METHODOLOGY

Nanos conducted an RDD dual frame (land- and cell-lines) hybrid telephone and online random survey of 1,054 Canadians, 18 years of age or older, between January 27<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup>, 2023 as part of an omnibus survey. The results were statistically checked and weighted by age and gender using the latest Census information and the sample is geographically stratified to be representative of Canada. Individuals randomly called using random digit dialing with a maximum of five call backs.

The margin of error for a random survey of 1054 Canadians is  $\pm 3.1$  percentage points, 19 times out of 20.
