

Trudeau and Poilievre tie for party leader the most trusted to make Canada a better country; half of Canadians want new leadership for Liberal and Conservative parties going into the next election.



Nanos was retained by the Globe and Mail to conduct research among Canadians to gauge their views on the preferred leaders for the Liberal Party, the Conservative Party and the New Democratic Party of Canada, as well as who is the most trusted leader to make Canada a better country and which federal party they usually vote for.

Nanos conducted an RDD dual frame (land- and cell-lines) hybrid telephone and online random survey of 1,055 Canadians, 18 years of age or older, between June 29<sup>th</sup> to 30<sup>th</sup>, 2023 as part of an omnibus survey. The margin of error for this survey is  $\pm 3.0$  percentage points, 19 times out of 20.

This study was commissioned by the Globe and Mail and the research was conducted by Nanos Research.

# Key Findings

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1

## Canadians have equal trust in Trudeau or Poilievre to make Canada a better country

One in four Canadians each say that Justin Trudeau ([25%](#)) or Pierre Poilievre ([25%](#)) are the federal party leaders they trust the most to make Canada a better country, followed by none of them ([22%](#)) and Jagmeet Singh ([12%](#)). Swing voters (those without a party they usually vote for) are most likely to say they do not trust any of them ([38%](#)), with about two in each saying they trust Trudeau ([21%](#)) or Poilievre ([18%](#)) the most.

## More than one in two Canadians think the Liberal Party should have a new leader in the next election; Liberal voters are more divided

Consistent with findings from December 2022, just over half of Canadians think the Liberal Party should have someone other than Justin Trudeau as the leader in the next election ([53%](#)), while one in four think Trudeau should remain the leader ([24%](#)). Among those who usually vote Liberal however, there is more of an even split ([42% prefer Trudeau as leader; 40% prefer someone else](#)). Swing voters are more likely to prefer the party have someone else as leader ([52%](#)) than Trudeau ([19%](#)).

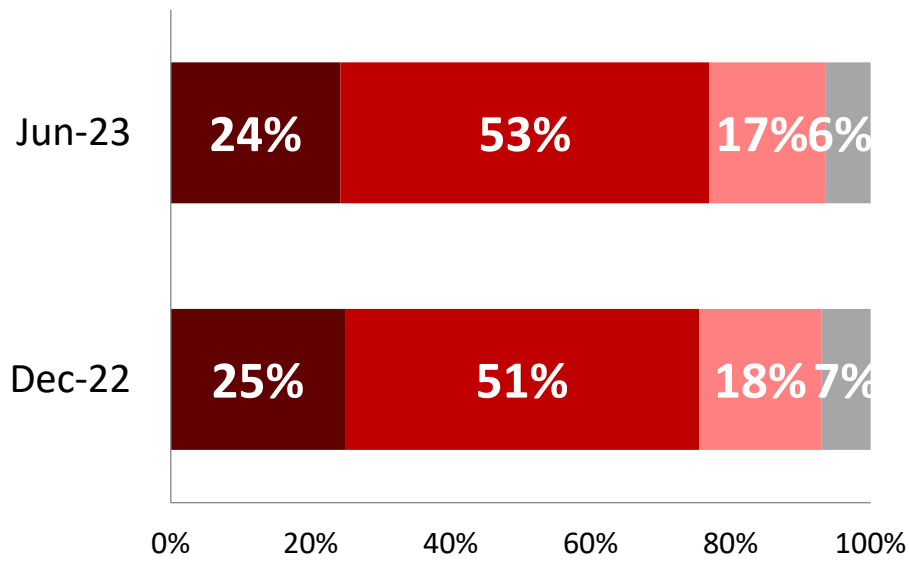
## A majority of CPC voters would prefer Pierre Poilievre as the party leader going into the next election

Just over one in two Canadians think the Conservative party should have a new leader for the election ([51%; 45% in December 2022](#)), while [30 per cent](#) think Poilievre should be the party leader. Of note, [71 per cent](#) of usual CPC voters would prefer Poilievre be the party leader going into the next election ([22% would prefer someone else](#)), while [55 per cent](#) of swing voters would prefer someone else as the leader ([22% prefer Poilievre remain as leader](#)).

## Canadians are divided over Jagmeet Singh remaining as leader of the NDP in the next election

Around one in three Canadians each say they would prefer Jagmeet Singh remain as leader of the NDP in the next election ([36%; 63% of usual NDP voters](#)) or that the NDP should have someone else as the leader ([31%; 22% of usual NDP voters](#)), and another [30 per cent](#) have no preference. There is similar division among swing voters, with [34 per cent](#) who would prefer another leader ([30% prefer Singh remain the leader](#)).

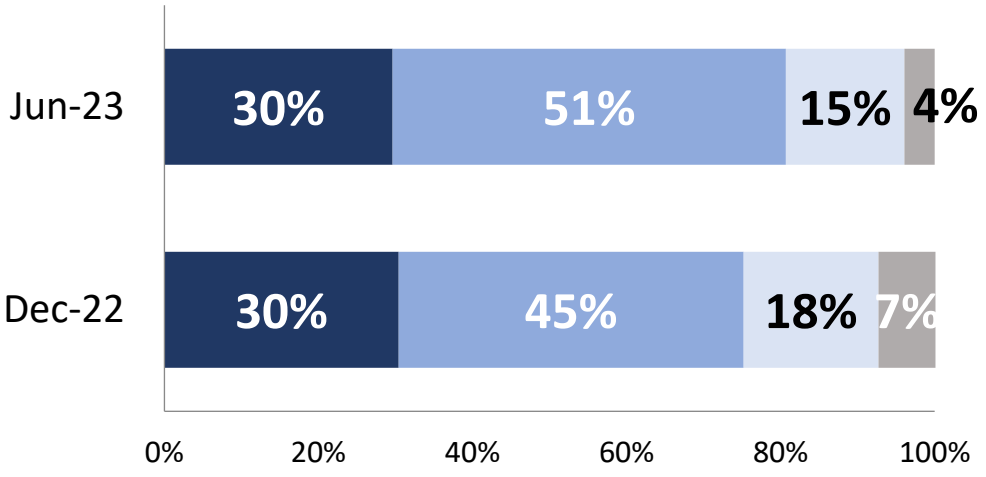

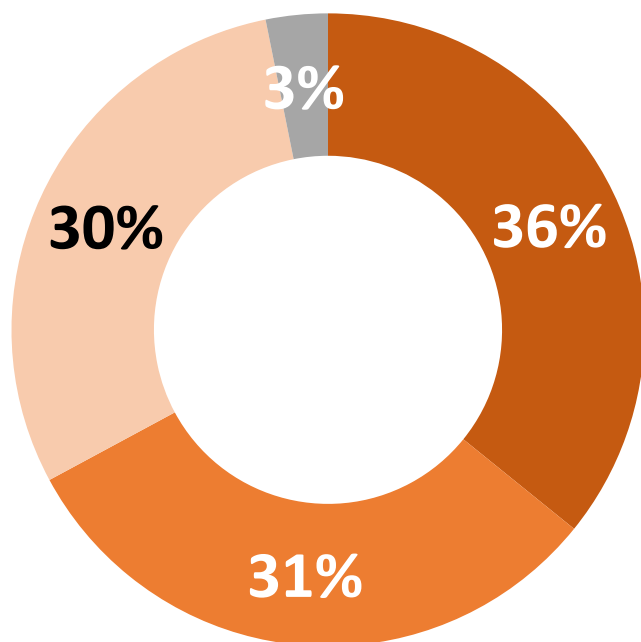

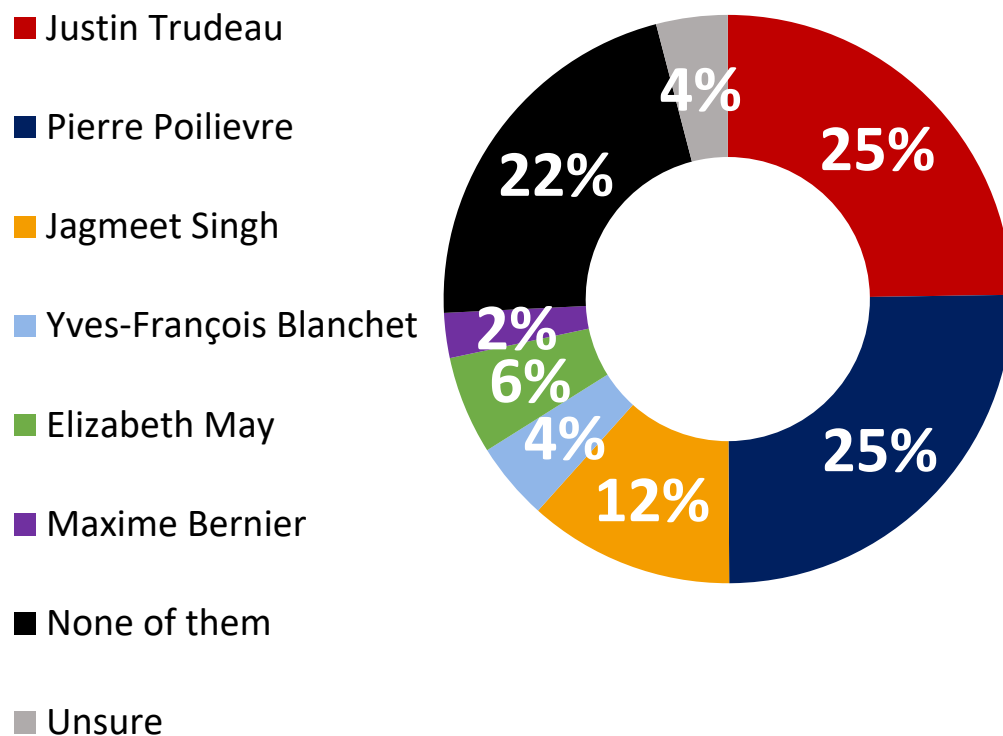

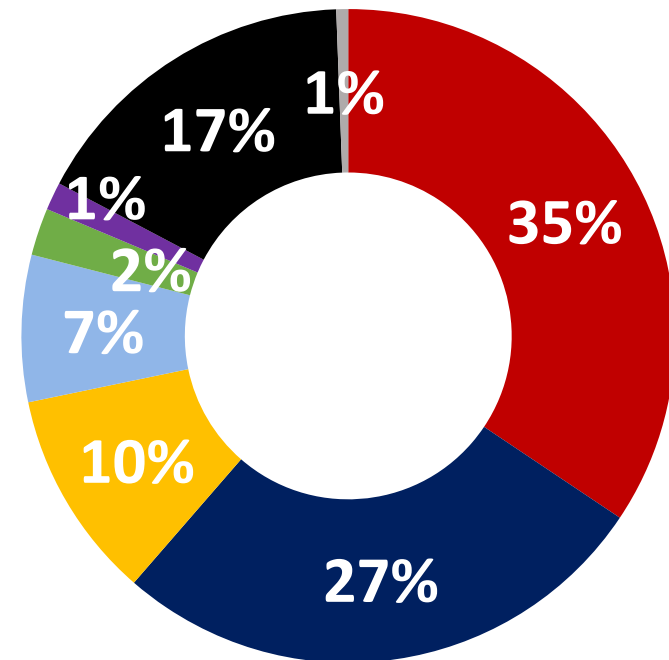

# METHODOLOGY

Nanos conducted an RDD dual frame (land- and cell-lines) hybrid telephone and online random survey of 1,055 Canadians, 18 years of age or older, between June 29<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup>, 2023 as part of an omnibus survey. Participants were randomly recruited by telephone using live agents and administered a survey online. The sample included both land- and cell-lines across Canada. The results were statistically checked and weighted by age and gender using the latest Census information and the sample is geographically stratified to be representative of Canada.

Individuals randomly called using random digit dialling with a maximum of five call backs.

The margin of error for this survey is  $\pm 3.0$  percentage points, 19 times out of 20.

This study was commissioned by the Globe and Mail and the research was conducted by Nanos Research.
