Nanos was retained by CTV News to conduct research among Canadians to gauge their views on government priorities, more specifically on the importance of the war in Ukraine and the conflict in the Middle-East.

Nanos conducted an RDD dual frame (land-and cell-lines) hybrid telephone and online random survey of 1,071 Canadians, 18 years of age or older, between October 29th to 31st, 2023, as part of an omnibus survey. The margin of error for this survey is ±3.0 percentage points, 19 times out of 20.

This study was commissioned by CTV News and the research was conducted by Nanos Research.

Priorities of the Government of Canada

3 in 5 Canadians

say the conflict in the Middle East and the Ukraine War should be equally important priorities for the Government of Canada. Women are more likely to say both have equal importance (67%) than men (51%, who are more likely to say Canada should make the Ukraine War a higher priority (24%; 12% of women). Younger Canadians (18-34) are more likely to say neither is important (16%) than individuals 35 to 54 (five per cent) or 55 plus (three per cent).

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Nanos conducted an RDD dual frame (land- and celllines) hybrid telephone and online random survey of 1,071 Canadians, 18 years of age or older, between October 29th to 31st, 2023 as part of an omnibus survey. Participants were randomly recruited by telephone using live agents and administered a survey online. The sample included both land- and cell-lines across Canada. The results were statistically checked and weighted by age and gender using the latest Census information and the sample is geographically stratified to be representative of Canada.

Individuals randomly called using random digit dialling with a maximum of five call backs.

The margin of error for this survey is ± 3.0 percentage points, 19 times out of 20.
