

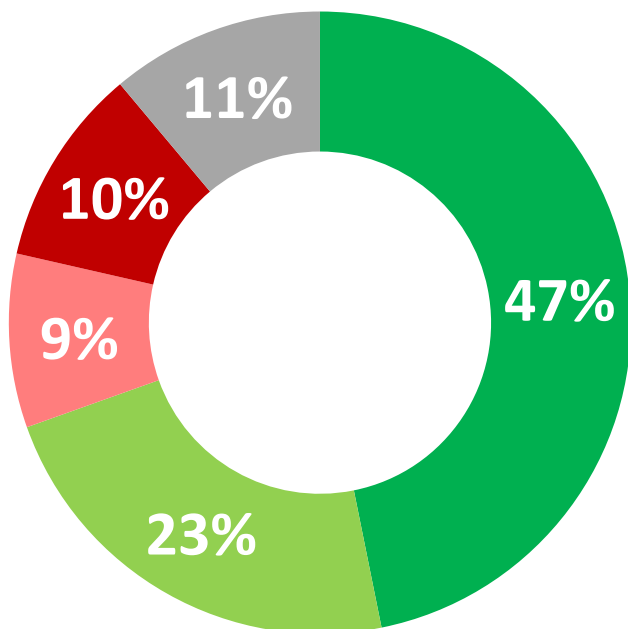
Most Canadians want the Government of Canada to make public the evidence used to accuse India of being behind the killing of Hardeep Singh Nijjar.

The research gauged Canadian opinions on the Canadian government making public the evidence behind Canada's accusations on the death of Hardeep Singh Nijjar.

Nanos conducted an RDD dual frame (land-and cell-lines) hybrid telephone and online random survey of 1071 Canadians, 18 years of age or older, between October 29th to 31st, 2023 as part of an omnibus survey. The margin of error for this survey is ± 3.0 percentage points, 19 times out of 20.

The research was commissioned by the Globe and Mail and was conducted by Nanos Research.

METHODOLOGY



Nanos conducted an RDD dual frame (land- and cell-lines) hybrid telephone and online random survey of 1071 Canadians, 18 years of age or older, between October 29th to 31st, 2023 as part of an omnibus survey. Participants were randomly recruited by telephone using live agents and administered a survey online. The sample included both land- and cell-lines across Canada. The results were statistically checked and weighted by age and gender using the latest Census information and the sample is geographically stratified to be representative of Canada.

Individuals randomly called using random digit dialling with a maximum of five call backs.

The margin of error for this survey is ±3.0 percentage points, 19 times out of 20.

This study was commissioned by the Globe and Mail and the research was conducted by Nanos Research.
