





Nanos Research was retained by CTV News to gauge the views of Canadians on the Parliamentary cooperation agreement in which NDP MPs pledged to vote to keep the Liberal government in power until June 2025 in exchange for government action on NDP policy priorities, such as dental care and pharmacare.


Nanos conducted an RDD dual frame (land- and cell-lines) hybrid telephone and online random survey of 1,071 Canadians, 18 years of age or older, between February 28th and March 2nd, 2024 as part of an omnibus survey. Participants were randomly recruited by telephone using live agents and administered a survey online.

The margin of error for this survey is ± 3.0 percentage points, 19 times out of 20.

This study was commissioned by CTV News and the research was conducted by Nanos Research.



Comfort with agreement between the Liberals and NDP

Are you comfortable, somewhat comfortable, somewhat uncomfortable or uncomfortable with the agreement between the Liberals and the NDP, which would delay a possible election until 2025?



Canadians

are split and marginally more likely to say they are comfortable or somewhat comfortable with the NDP-Liberal Parliamentary cooperation than not comfortable or somewhat not comfortable. Older Canadians (55 plus)(43%) are more likely than younger Canadians (18-34)(33%) to say they are comfortable with this cooperation. Residents from the Prairies are more likely to say they are uncomfortable or somewhat uncomfortable with this cooperation (63%) than Canadians overall (46%).

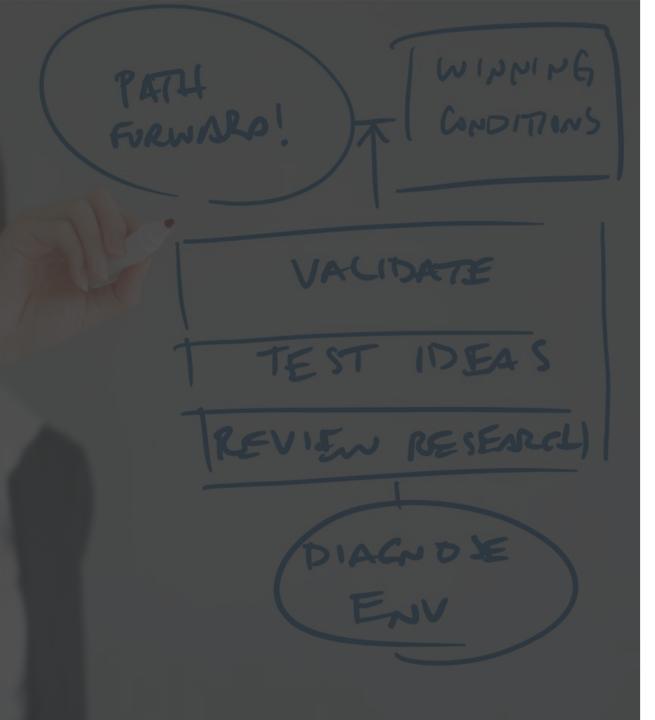
Comfort with agreement between the Liberals and NDP – By demographics

Nanos conducted an RDD dual frame (land- and cell-lines) hybrid telephone and online random survey of 1,071 Canadians, 18 years of age or older, between February 28th and March 2nd, 2024 as part of an omnibus survey. Participants were randomly recruited by telephone using live agents and administered a survey online. The sample included both land- and cell-lines across Canada. The results were statistically checked and weighted by age and gender using the latest Census information and the sample is geographically stratified to be representative of Canada.

Individuals randomly called using random digit dialling with a maximum of five call backs.

The margin of error for this survey is ± 3.0 percentage points, 19 times out of 20.

This study was commissioned by CTV News and the research was conducted by Nanos Research.

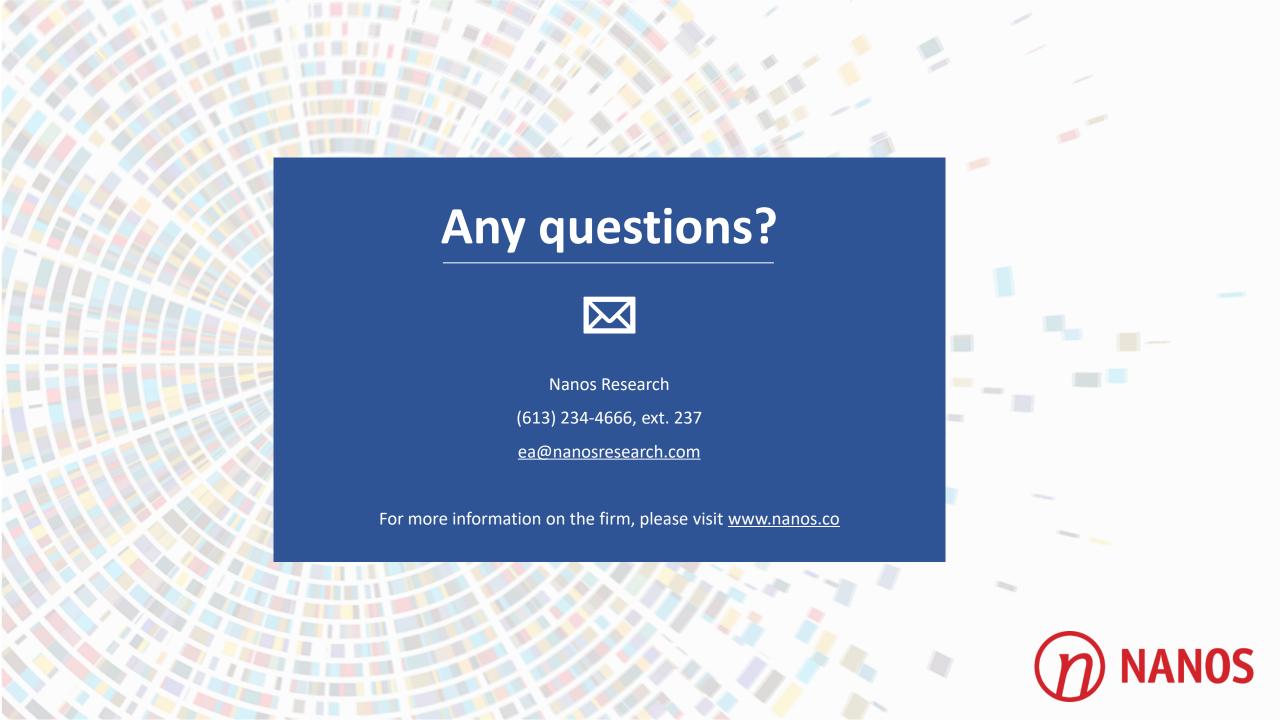
