Conservatives now have a 16-point advantage over the Liberals in terms of trust to responsibly manage federal government finances.

Nanos Research was retained by CTV News to gauge the views of Canadians on which federal party they trust the most to manage the finances of the Government of Canada.

Nanos conducted an RDD dual frame (land- and celllines) hybrid telephone and online random survey of 1069 Canadians, 18 years of age or older, between March 31st to April 1st, 2024 as part of an omnibus survey. Participants were randomly recruited by telephone using live agents and administered a survey online.


The margin of error for this survey is ± 3.0 percentage points, 19 times out of 20.

This study was commissioned by CTV News and the research was conducted by Nanos Research.

The gap between trust in the Conservatives and the Liberals to best manage the finances of the government of Canada continues to grow with now a sixteen-point difference between them (35% for Conservatives; 19% for Liberals).

Nanos conducted an RDD dual frame (land- and celllines) hybrid telephone and online random survey of 1,069 Canadians, 18 years of age or older, between March 31st to April 1st, 2024 as part of an omnibus survey. Participants were randomly recruited by telephone using live agents and administered a survey online. The sample included both land- and cell-lines across Canada. The results were statistically checked and weighted by age and gender using the latest Census information and the sample is geographically stratified to be representative of Canada.

Individuals randomly called using random digit dialling with a maximum of five call backs.

The margin of error for this survey is ± 3.0 percentage points, 19 times out of 20.
