
Majority of Canadians support requiring telecom companies and their employees to continue providing services in the event of a labour dispute; nearly two in three support companies employing temporary workers to ensure consistent service.

The research gauged the opinions among Canadians on the importance of telecommunication services in daily life; frequency of telecommunication service disruptions; and in cases of a labour dispute, the importance of assuring customers continue to receive service, and preference for employing temporary workers.

Nanos conducted an online representative non-probability panel survey of 1,003 Canadians, 18 years of age or older, between March 22nd to 26th, 2024.

The research was commissioned by the Canadian Telecommunications Association and was conducted by Nanos Research.

Key Findings





HIGH IMPORTANCE FOR TELECOMS SERVICE TO OPERATE WITHOUT DISRUPTIONS

A strong majority of Canadians say it is important that telecommunications services remain operational without disruptions (95%). In the past year, more than one in three Canadians report having experienced disruptions in service (39%) due to severe weather or natural disasters.

SERVICE DISRUPTION DUE TO STRIKE UNACCEPTABLE TO MAJORITY OF CANADIANS

Just under three in four Canadians say it is unacceptable (52%) or somewhat unacceptable (22%) if telecoms service restoration were delayed due to an employee strike or lockout. Those who vote conservative are more likely to say it is not acceptable or somewhat not acceptable (77%) than those who vote NDP (64%). CONSISTENT TELECOMS SERVICE REQUIRED DURING LABOUR DISPUTES Nearly eight in ten Canadians would prefer that telecoms companies and their employees be required to continue to provide services even in the event of a labour dispute (79%). Canadians age 55 and over (85%) are more likely to agree with this statement than those age 18-34 (72%) and 35-54 (77%).



EMPLOYING TEMPORARY WORKERS TO ENSURE CONSISTENT SERVICE A majority of Canadians (62%) say that telecoms companies should be allowed to employ temporary replacement workers to ensure consistent service in the event of service disruptions. Canadians who vote Conservative (66%) or Liberal (65%) are more likely to agree with this statement than those who vote NDP (52%).






Most Canadians would say internet (96%) and mobile phone service (88%) are the telecommunication services most important to their daily life, and home phone is the least important (27%). Canadians age 55 and over (mean score 4.2 out of ten) are more likely to rate home phone as important than those age 35 to 54 (mean score 2.7) out of ten).








Hours spent on internet-connected devices per day - demographics


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Importance that telecommunication remains operational and without disruptions



Acceptance of service delays due to an employee strike



Nearly 4 in 5 Canadians

say telecommunication companies and their employees should be required to ensure continuity of services in the event of a service disruption. Canadians aged 55 and over (85%) are more likely to say companies and their employees should be required to ensure regular service than those age 18 to 34 (72%).

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Opinion on requirements on continued service from telecoms companies and their employees in the event of a labour dispute demographics



Canadians who are a member of a union are the least likely to agree with the employment of temporary replacement workers (50%), than those who's household includes a member of a union (68%) or households without a union member (64%).


