

KEY FINDINGS

BALLOT

The latest Nanos New Brunswick provincial ballot tracking has the Progressive Conservatives at 35.9 per cent, the Liberals at 35.9 per cent, the Green Party at 13.5 per cent, the NDP at 9.8 per cent and the People's Alliance at 4.9 per cent.

ACCESSIBLE VOTERS

PROVINCIAL ISSUES

Asked whether they would consider voting for each of the provincial parties, 45.5 per cent would consider voting Liberal, while 39.8 per cent of Canadians say they would consider voting Progressive Conservative. Over one in three (32.5%) would consider voting Green, 30.8 per cent would consider voting NDP, and 17.8 per cent would consider voting for the People's Alliance.



The top issue of concern in New Brunswick remains healthcare (27%), but it is on the decline since April 2023 (43%). The issues of cost of living and inflation (14%), housing (13%) and jobs and the economy (8%) are on the rise as the top provincial issue of concern.



PREFERRED PREMIER

Nanos tracking has the leader of the Liberal Party, Susan Holt, (26.4%) and Blaine Higgs from the Progressive Conservative Party (24.8%) in a statistical dead heat as the preferred choice of premier by New Brunswickers, followed by David Coon from the Green Party (10.8%), Alex White from NDP (7.0%) and Rick DeSaulniers from Peoples Party (3.7%). Twenty-two per cent of New Brunswick residents were unsure whom they preferred.









Nanos conducted an RDD dual frame (land- and cell-lines) hybrid telephone and online random survey of 447 residents of New Brunswick, 18 years of age or older, between July 28th and July 31st, 2024 as part of an omnibus survey. Participants were randomly recruited by telephone using live agents where 300 randomly selected individuals were administered by live telephone agents and 147 individuals were administered the survey online. The results were statistically checked and weighted by age and gender using the latest Census information and the sample is geographically stratified to be representative of Canada.

Individuals were randomly called using random digit dialling with a maximum of five call backs.

The margin of error for a random survey of 447 New Brunswick residents is ± 4.7 percentage points, 19 times out of 20.

The research was conducted by Nanos Research.

Margin of Error for Research

Factoring the margin of error for the national random sample administered by Nanos, Liberal support may be as high as 36.0% or as low as 28.8%. Likewise, support for the Conservatives may be as high as 34.8% or as low as 27.6%.

Key Takeaways

All of the Nanos estimates were within the reported margin of error for the election call.

Both the Sat/Sun sample and the Sunday only election call samples showed a tight race which manifested itself in the final result. The total error for the six parties plus others is 7.8 for an average error

of about 1.1 percent.
