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Ford maintains ballot advantage and remains the most popular choice to be the Premier of Ontario. The PCs and Liberals continue to surpass the support they received in the last provincial election while support for the New Democrats is lower than the last election. *(Tracking ending Feb 11)*

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AT A GLANCE

Ballot – As of February 11, 2025 the Progressive Conservatives have 44.5 per cent support, followed by the Liberals at 32.0 per cent, the NDP at 16.5 per cent and the Greens at 5.1 per cent.

Preferred Premier – Nanos polling has Doug Ford as the preferred choice as Ontario Premier at 40.6 per cent of Ontario residents followed by Bonnie Crombie (26.8%), Marit Stiles (14.6%) and Mike Schreiner (5.5%). Five per cent of Ontario residents chose none of them and 7.1 per cent were unsure whom they preferred.



The CTV News/Nanos nightly provincial election tracking conducted by Nanos Research surveys 900 Ontarians aged 18 years and over three days (300 interviews each day). Respondents are all randomly recruited through a dual-frame (cell- and land-line) RDD sample using live agents. One half of the sample is administered the questionnaire by telephone and one half are administered the same questionnaire online. The random sample may be weighted by age and gender according to the latest Canadian census data. Throughout the election, the interviews are compiled into a three-night rolling average of 900 interviews, with the oldest group of 300 interviews being replaced by a new group of 300 each evening. The current data covers the threenight period ending February 11th, 2025.


A random survey of 935 Ontarians is accurate 3.2 percentage points, plus or minus, 19 times out of 20.

The full methodology is detailed in the <u>technical note</u> in this report. This research was conducted and released in accordance with the standards of the <u>CRIC</u> of which the firm is an accredited member.
