

Canadians are over three times more likely to rate Mark Carney's handling of the economy as good rather than poor.

The research gauged the views of Canadians on Prime Minister Mark Carney's job of handling the economy.

Nanos conducted an RDD dual frame (land- and cell-lines) hybrid telephone and online random survey of 1051 Canadians, 18 years of age or older, from June 26 to 28, 2026, as part of an omnibus survey. The sample included both land- and cell-lines across Canada. The results were statistically checked and weighted by age and gender using the latest Census information and the sample is geographically stratified to be representative of Canada.

Individuals randomly called using random digit dialing with a maximum of five call backs.

The margin of error for this survey is ± 3.0 percentage points, 19 times out of 20.

This study was commissioned by the Bloomberg and the research was conducted by Nanos Research.

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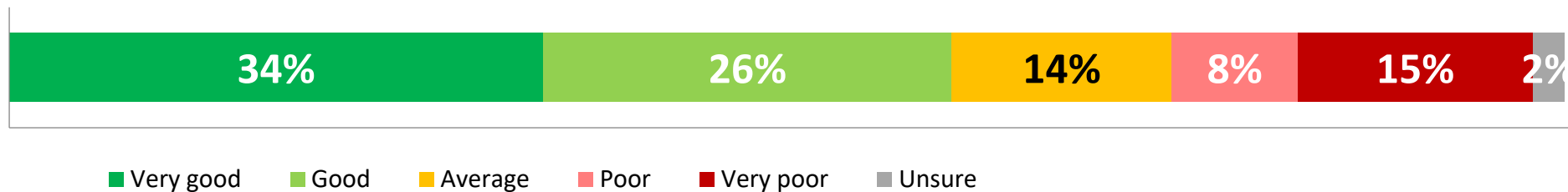

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Rating Mark Carney's job of handling the economy

3 in 5 Canadians

believe Prime Minister Mark Carney has done a very good (34%) or a good job (26%) of handling the economy. This is over three times greater than the combined percentage of Canadians who believe the Prime Minister has done a poor (eight per cent) or very poor job (15%) in this regard. Fourteen percent of Canadians rate the Prime Minister's job of handling the economy as average.

With the notable exception of the Prairie residents and Canadians aged 18 to 34, a majority of respondents across all demographic groups describe Mark Carney's job of handling the economy as either good or very good. Older Canadians are more likely than younger Canadians to rate the Prime Minister's job handling the economy as outright very good.
